

Different Types of Cloth Diapers

There are various types of cloth diapers to choose from. Don't feel overwhelmed! You do not need to choose one system. You can mix and match, working out as you go along which types you prefer. Nothing will be wasted. Apart from the newborn size, most diapers fit babies from 8 pounds all the way up to 35 pounds, ready for potty training. They are adjustable and so grow with your baby all the way through.

All in One Cloth Diapers

This is the closest to the style of a disposable diaper because the absorbency layer is sewn inside the waterproof shell, so there is nothing to do but fasten the sides to the front of the diaper – it really is 'all-in-one'!



Pocket Cloth Diapers

The outside waterproof shell is lined with a fleecy inner layer. This can be made from a stay dry fabric to wick the wetness away from baby's skin. There is a pocket opening at the back where the absorbent layers can be stuffed inside. You can stuff the diaper with the inserts provided, with pre-folds, or with many other creative options such as terry washcloths. You can even put extra absorbent layers inside the pocket, such as hemp, particularly helpful at night time. Moms who love pockets enjoy being able to launder all the layers separately, especially because they dry more quickly than 'All-in-ones'.

Diaper Covers/Shells

Diaper covers, or shells, are the outer waterproof layer in which you can lay your choice of insert. They can cover inserts, flat diapers, pre-folds and fitted diapers. (NB – Do not put micro-terry inserts next to baby's skin –

they are too absorbent and will absorb the natural oils from baby's skin.

Be sure to use a liner.)

If baby just tee-tees, you may be able to just change the inside of the diaper and keep on the same shell.

The outside shell can be used to create a hybrid. Baby can wear the outside shell with a disposable insert. This is ideal for if you are traveling or if you leave baby with a babysitter. The babysitter can just throw away the disposable insert, just like a disposable diaper, and replace it with a fresh one. (The inserts are earth friendly unlike most disposable diapers.)

Liners

Many of our moms like to use disposable liners. These look like dryer sheets but are made specifically to go next to Baby's skin. When baby poops, the liner can be lifted out and flushed down the potty. The dirty diaper, which is now not nearly so dirty, can go straight into the diaper

pail or wet bag. (Check for suitability for flushing if you have a septic system.)

Liners also come in washable fabric. This can be helpful if you need to put any ointment on baby.
