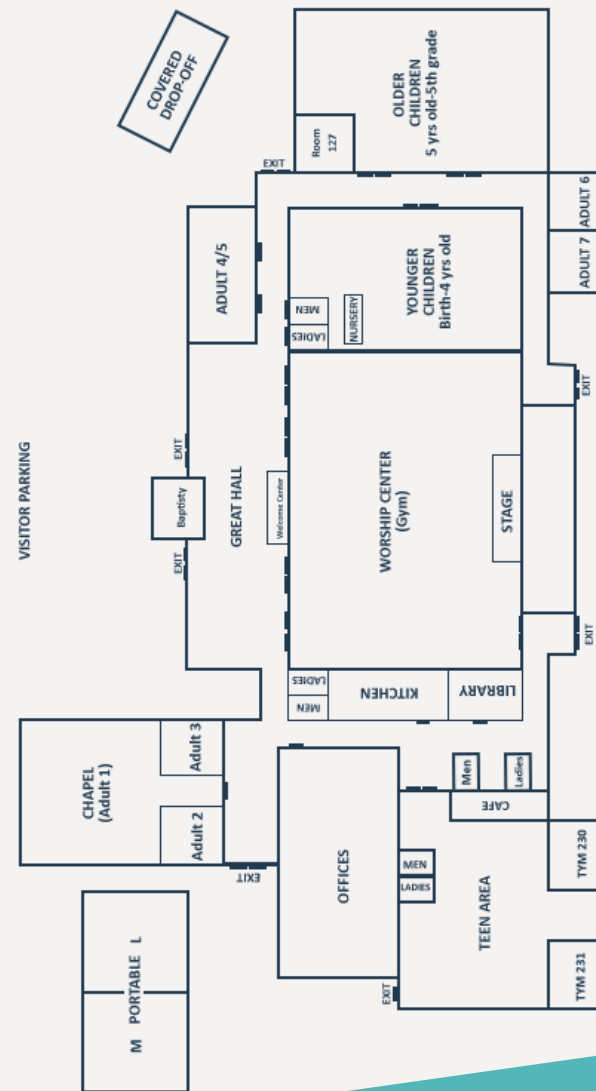
Monthly Fellowship Meal
