When To Call The Vet

You should contact the vet if your dog exhibits any unusual behavior, such as:

- 1. Constipation or straining to urinate
- 2. Coughing or sneezing
- 3. Difficulty breathing or prolonged panting
- 4. Dramatic increase in appetite for 24 hours or more
- 5. Excessive drinking of water
- 6. Excessive sleeping or unusual lack of activity
- 7. Fainting
- 8. Increased restlessness
- 9. Limping, holding, or protecting part of the body
- 10. Loss of appetite for 24 hours or more
- 11. Loss of balance, falling, or staggering
- 12. Persistent scratching at their eyes or ears
- 13. Runny nose or eyes
- 14. Shivering
- 15. Thick discharge from ears, eyes, nose, or sores
- 16. Vomiting, diarrhea, or excessive urination for more than 12 hours
- 17. Weight loss
- 18. When the dogs gums are white
- 19. Whining for no apparent reason
