

## Thumb Area Unity Council (District #24) Meeting Minutes – June 9, 2026

Chairperson Brian V opened meeting at 6:00 pm with Serenity Prayer and Preamble. Call to order and roll call taken. Ten groups represented, headcount 16. Fourteen members signed sign-in sheet. Quorum met.

Agenda: Group unanimously approved.

Kathy L read May Minutes. Minutes approved.

### Treasurer's Report:

Tim B provided May Treasurer's Report. Ending balance in April \$4,312.40. Monies collected: \$26. Two checks written (one for hotline phone and one for bronze plaque to be presented to District 24 Open Speaker), totaling \$80.98. Current balance for May: \$4257.42. Written report approved.

### Committee Reports:

#### DCM Reports –

- Southern: Nathan reports that both floor actions brought to 76<sup>th</sup> General Service Conference were shot down. Other committee actions include update to literature and minor edit to 5<sup>th</sup> edition of Big Book. Nathan provided flyer for FY26 Michigan State Convention to be held August 7-9 in Mt Pleasant. Brian added that the "Everything AA" app is available free (contributions are welcome). App is consistent with AA Twelve Traditions and may be promoted as a source of literature and AA message.
