

## Thumb Area Unity Council (District #24) Meeting Minutes – May 12, 2026

Chairperson Brian V opened meeting at 6:07 pm with Serenity Prayer and Preamble. Call to order and roll call taken. Nine groups represented, headcount 14. Twelve members signed sign-in sheet, and seven provided their email address. Quorum met.

Agenda: Group unanimously approved.

Kathy L read April Minutes. The Minutes incorrectly provided January balance rather than March balance. Corrected March ending balance of \$4,434.40 will be added to April Minutes. Minutes approved with this correction.

Treasurer's Report: Tim B provided April Treasurer's Report. March ending balance was \$4,434.40, Monies collected \$38, two checks totalling \$160 written for phone expense and rent for Cass City Park Pavillion, bringing balance to \$4,312.40. Written report approved.

Committee Reports:

DCM Reports –

- Southern: Nathan states he has been visiting District 24 meetings and attendance is overall very good, noting especially that Vassar has good attendance numbers. Reports that next CMIA32 meets June 7 in Hillman.
- Northern: Terry reminded attendees of Kinde 11<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Breakfast Meeting – Sat May 16. States many meetings have “slim” attendance but “doors are open and lights on”. Anticipate summer months will raise attendance at some meetings. Port Hope Wednesday meeting will be closing effective June 1.

PI Committee: PI Meeting held prior tonight's Unity Council meeting. Brian reported Committee's new campaign focus is on PSAs. Members will check with radio and newspaper to see if PSAs can be placed. TAUC flyers will be posted on community bulletin boards and counseling or medical offices. All members are encouraged to pass word of any sober-related events or alcohol-free gatherings.

Executive Committee: Revised ByLaws have been adopted. Elections will be held in June for Chairperson, Vice Chair and Huron DCM. Nominations are welcome and will be accepted verbally or by email or phone. Spirit of rotation is emphasized. We will be voting at June meeting.

Website Committee: Kathy reported she is still working on posting a meeting list on website in order to make it accessible to the AA “Meeting Guide” app. All meetings listed must be registered with GSO. Kathy will contact the CMIA registrar to ensure all meeting ID #s are accurate.

New Business: Tim will be getting debit card before time of next meeting. This will allow advanced payment for AA hotline (at cheaper rate than paying monthly).

Tim will renew TAUC PO Box for annual cost \$60. Sharon noted that keeping hotline phone should be a shared responsibility (in keeping with spirit of rotation).
