Scholarships Available For Waldport High School- Class of 2026

Arnold & Karen Bondley Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: This scholarship was established in the memory of Arnold Bondley. Arnold was an engineer whose goal was to help students who want to enter a similar field.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School
- Potential Areas of Study or Career: Architecture, Art or Engineering

The Baum-DeMarco Engineering Futures Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: The Baum – DeMarco Engineering Futures Scholarship was established by two Newport residents who have enjoyed successful careers in engineering and want to empower the next generation of innovators. This scholarship supports graduating high school seniors in Lincoln County who aspire to pursue engineering degrees and contribute to solving the challenges of tomorrow.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 3.5
- Interested in attaining a degree in engineering
- Submit essay: “Describe how engineering can help solve a challenge facing your community or the world, and how you hope to contribute.”
- One letter of recommendation from a STEM teacher or mentor.

Claire Hall Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$500

Description: The Claire Hall Memorial Scholarship was established by friends to honor the life and legacy of Claire Hall, a longtime Lincoln County Commissioner who dedicated her public service to advocating for

unhoused individuals, affordable housing, and LGBTQ+ rights. Claire courageously lived her truth by publicly coming out as transgender and worked tirelessly to create a more inclusive and compassionate community. This scholarship is offered in her memory to continue her commitment to equity, dignity, and opportunity for all.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- Submit essay: Describe the importance of LGBTQ+ rights in the United States today. You may discuss why equal rights and protections matter, how LGBTQ+ rights impact individuals and communities, and why these issues remain relevant in today's society.

Children's Advocacy Center of Lincoln County Scholarship

Value: \$2,500

Description: The Lincoln County Children's Advocacy Center was founded in 1997 to offer child abuse intervention and assessment services in a safe, neutral and supportive environment, for children who are suspected of being abused or neglected. The Children's Advocacy Center is offering two \$2,500 scholarships open to all graduating Lincoln County seniors.

Requirements:

- Graduate of a Lincoln County high school
- Student must submit an essay: "Describe your goals and how you will give back to your community in your specified field of study."

Everett & Gladys Barclay Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: The Everett and Gladys Barclay Scholarship is open to all graduating seniors from Waldport High School. This scholarship is aimed at students planning to attend a trade school, community college, or other vocationally oriented post-secondary schools. This scholarship is open to students with learning or physical disabilities.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School
- Applicants plan to attend a community college or trade school

F. Lee Barclay Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: F. Lee Barclay was born and grew up in Tidewater, OR. In 1941, he graduated from Waldport High School, where he was involved in football, boxing, band, and glee club. This scholarship is open to a Waldport High School graduating senior who has attended WHS for at least two years and has a GPA of at least 3.25. Priority to students planning a career in Forestry Management, teaching, agriculture, or veterinary science.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School

- GPA: 3.25
- Essay: Write a one-page essay addressing career choice, reasons for choosing that career, and any activities you have pursued or explored in preparation for that career.

Hagan Family Scholarship

Value: \$500

Description: The Hagan Family Scholarship was established in honor of Sheila Hagan, who dedicated more than 30 years of service to the Lincoln County School District. Throughout her career, Sheila was a passionate advocate for Special Education, working at the administrative level to strengthen programs and ensure meaningful support for students with special needs. Her leadership and commitment were pivotal in advancing opportunities and resources for Special Needs students across the district. This scholarship honors her legacy of service, compassion, and unwavering support for students and families.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- Interest in a career in the Special Education field
- Submit essay: “Describe your interest in the Special Education field and how you hope to make an impact with students with disabilities.”

Jack Dahl Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$500

Description: This scholarship is in honor of Jack Dahl, long-time supporter of Lincoln County youth. Applicants must have a 2.0 GPA, letter for two years in a varsity sport, is recognised as a team player, and has demonstrated outstanding school and community service. This person must graduate from Toledo, Siletz or Waldport High School with a minimum of two years of attendance.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Toledo, Siletz, or Waldport High School
- GPA: 2.0
- Lettered in at least two sports

Jiah Quayle Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$500

Description: This scholarship was created in memory of Jiah Quayle, who gave his time to many organizations and was a true community hero. Applicants must be a Waldport High School graduate and plan to attend a trade school. In Jiah's memory, the hope is this scholarship will help continue his belief in every person's gifts and value.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School
- The applicant plans to attend a trade school
- Essay: Write a 500-word essay describing your career choice.

John & Mabel Hockema Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: The John and Mabel Hockema Scholarship may be used to fund the recipient's enrollment in any four-year college, junior college, community college, or trade school. The applicant may be a graduate of any Lincoln County high school, have a minimum of a 2.75 GPA and show an interest and appreciation of natural resources and the environment and participation in outdoor recreational activities.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 2.75
- Applicant shows an interest and appreciation of natural resources and the environment and participation in outdoor recreational activities.
- Essay: "Write a one-page essay describing the importance of outdoor recreational activities in your life and the importance of preserving our natural resources."

Lincoln County Bar Association Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: This scholarship was started by attorneys of Lincoln County. Lincoln County lawyers recognize what a long road it is to achieve the dream of being admitted to the practice of law. The Lincoln County Bar Association offers this scholarship, particularly for the first year, to Lincoln County students who have the potential to succeed. This scholarship is open to all high schools in Lincoln County, minimum of 3.25 GPA and write an extra essay.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 3.25
- Potential Areas of Study or Career- Law
- Essay: 500 words or less- "What contributions can I make to society in my practice of law?"

Lincoln County Board of Realtors Scholarship

Description: This scholarship is funded by the Lincoln County Board of Realtors. This scholarship is open to all graduating seniors of Lincoln County high schools and students enrolled in Home School. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 to apply and have evidence of community service. An extra essay will also be required to be eligible for this scholarship.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 3.0
- Essay: Write a 750-1000 word essay explaining "What does home ownership mean to you and how does it impact the community you live in?"

Lincoln County Master Gardeners Association Scholarship

Value: \$4,000- Paid out \$1,000 per year for four years

Description: This scholarship is available to graduating seniors of all Lincoln County high schools, sponsored by the Lincoln County Master Gardener Association. The LCMGA is dedicated to educating and supporting Lincoln County residents by providing leadership in the use of effective and environmentally responsible horticultural techniques. An additional essay will be required to apply for this scholarship.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- Essay: An essay of no more than 500 words explaining how your choice of academic pursuits would reflect the purpose of Lincoln County Master Gardener Association: the LCMGA is a service organization supporting the Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service Master Gardener Program and dedicated to educating and supporting Lincoln County residents by providing leadership in the use of effective and environmentally responsible horticultural techniques.

Lincoln County School District Administrators Scholarship

Value: \$500

Description: Each year, the Lincoln County School District administrators sponsor the Lincoln County School District Administrator Scholarship. This scholarship is open to all graduating seniors in Lincoln County who are planning to enter the education field.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- Plans to study in the educational field

Mechanics Student Grant

Value: \$1,000

Description: The Mechanical Student Grant's purpose is to provide a scholarship to a Lincoln County high school graduate who intends to enroll in a community college or trade school in the automotive field. Donations from the Bay City Cruisers fund most of this scholarship. An extra essay regarding your career plan in the automotive field is required.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- Graduating HS senior planning to enroll in a mechanics program
- Essay: What are your plans in the automotive area?

Michael Fossey Memorial Engineering Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: The Michael Fossey Memorial Engineering Scholarship honors the legacy of Michael Fossey, a successful engineer and Oregon State University graduate. This \$1,000 scholarship supports aspiring engineers attending Oregon State University, fulfilling Fossey's wish to inspire the next generation in the field.

Requirements:

- Graduate of a Lincoln County high school
- 3.0 GPA

- Major in Engineering
- Attend Oregon State University
- Student must submit an essay: “Write a one-page essay answering the following questions: 1. What would you want Mr. Fossey to know about you? 2. What is an inspirational experience/time or moment you would share with Mr. Fossey?”

Newport Fire Chiefs McManus and Rowley Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$3,000

Description: This scholarship was established in the memory of two legendary Newport Fire Department Fire Chiefs Dennis McManus and Don Rowley. This scholarship is to help a student entering the Fire or EMT Services.

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 2.50
- Potential Areas of Study or Career: Fire or EMT Services
- Essay: Write an one-page essay with information specific to long term goals surrounding your work in the Fire Sciences or EMT services and what area you plan to focus on.

Noble Carlton Scholarship

Value: \$10,000- This scholarship pays \$3,000 first year; \$7,000 2nd year.

Description: The Noble Carlton Scholarship was created in 2005 in the memory of Noble Allen Carlton. Noble grew up in the Waldport area and attended Waldport High School. He had a high interest in the mechanical aspects of cars and in practical pursuits and wanted to give back to the students of Waldport High.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School

Oregon Hunters’ Association- Lincoln County Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: OHA awards scholarships to applicants based on the criteria identified herein while pursuing areas of study and careers that support OHA's mission of "Protecting Oregon's wildlife, habitat and hunting heritage."

Requirements:

- Graduate of any Lincoln County high school
- GPA: 3.0
- Owned a hunting or fishing license at one time
- Write a one-page essay on one of the following topics:
 - Explain how you would protect Oregon’s wildlife and habitat
 - Explain how you would promote and protect the hunting heritage of Oregon
 - Explain the role of hunting and sportsmen in Oregon’s wildlife management.

Retired Sheriff John O'Brien Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$2,500

Description: John O'Brien was appointed Sheriff in 1994 and was later elected. John began as a deputy in Lincoln County in 1973 and worked his way up the ranks to Sheriff. He retired in 2003. This scholarship was established in his honor to help students interested in the field of Criminal Justice.

Requirements:

- Graduate from any high school in Lincoln County
- GPA: 3.0
- Potential Areas of Study or Career: Criminal Justice
- Essay: Write a one-page essay with information specific to long term goals surrounding your work in the Criminal Justice profession and what area of the criminal justice system do you plan to focus on.

Robin Jacobson Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: Robin Jacobson was a wonderful person who worked with students for the Lincoln County School District for many years. Her students loved her. This scholarship was established in her honor for all of her dedication to the students of Lincoln County.

Requirements:

- Graduate from any high school in Lincoln County. This includes students who complete a GED program.
- GPA: 2.50

Rose Burbee Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: Rose Burbee dedicated her life to serving others through teaching and education. She loved to see her students thrive and grow in their individual ways.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School
- GPA: 3.0
- Essay: Write a one-page essay describing how your education contributed to who you are today and how you see it helping you in the foreseeable future.

Skeeter & Stubby Thissell Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Description: The Thissell family has been members of the Tidewater community for well over 100 years. Three generations of Thissells have attended Waldport schools, beginning with Kenneth(Skeeter). His wife, Lois(Stubby) graduated from Waldport High School in 1938. The Thissells have established a scholarship in their memory.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School
- GPA: 3.0
- Potential Areas of Study or Career: Forestry, Veterinary/Animal Science or Agriculture

South Lincoln County Scholarship

Value: \$1,500

Description: For many years, a group of citizens in the Waldport area did many community service activities to raise funds for scholarships to graduating seniors from Waldport High School.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High School

Yachats Lions Academic Scholarship

Value: \$2,500

Description: The Yachats Lions Academic Scholarship, sponsored by the Yachats Lions Club, recognizes the club's long-standing commitment to giving back to the south Lincoln County community. This \$2,500 scholarship is available to graduating seniors from Waldport High School who demonstrate academic achievement and a commitment to their future goals and plan to attend a four-year institution. It reflects the Lions' dedication to supporting education and helping local students succeed.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High or a graduating Home School student living in the Waldport area.
- Minimum GPA- 3.0
- Applicant plans to attend a four year college or university. Applicant may choose a community college as long as there is a plan to attend a four- year institution.
- Applicant will submit a 500 word essay on "What major do you plan to pursue in college, and how do you envision using your degree in the future?"
- Scholarship will be paid 1st term of the applicant's first year in school.

Yachats Lions Vocational Scholarship

Value: \$2,500

Description: The Yachats Lions Academic Scholarship, sponsored by the Yachats Lions Club, recognizes the club's long-standing commitment to giving back to the south Lincoln County community. This \$2,500 scholarship is available to graduating seniors from Waldport High School who demonstrate academic achievement and a commitment to their future goals and plan to attend a vocational or trade school. Community college, trade or vocational programs are acceptable. It reflects the Lions' dedication to supporting education and helping local students succeed.

Requirements:

- Graduate of Waldport High or a graduating Home School student living in the Waldport area.
- Minimum GPA- 2.0
- Applicant plans to attend a vocational or trade school. Community college trade or vocational programs are acceptable.

- Applicant will submit a 500 word essay on “Please share your career goals and explain how this scholarship will help you achieve them.”
- Scholarship will be paid 1st term of the applicants first year in school.
