m INDICATES MASTERS RECORD The 16th Annual California Firemen's Olympics are history. Only 22 lifters showed up but they put on a great show for a packed house of very vocal and enthusiastic supporters at the Registry Hotel in Irvine, California.

If we had a "best lifter" award, it would have been a toss up between 220 pounder Randy Sousa from L. A. City Fire Department and Chris Riley, a light 242 pounder, from the Garden Grove Fire Department. Randy went "3 for 3" in the squat ending up with a beautiful PR 666 and a new meet record. Chris was right there with a 655. Randy made a beautiful 440 bench (no shirt) and another meet record while Chris had some problems and ended up with is opener at 385. He made up for it in the dead lift, however, and went "3 for 3" and a PR meet record 666. Randy smoked a 551 opener and was within an inch or two of completing a big jump to 644 for his second. He passed his third because of a slightly sore back.

Hard luck lifter Steve Koenekamp suffered a stress or hairline fracture of his right arm during his third squat. I've never seen or heard of that one before and he had to withdraw from the meet. He thought the tricep let go, but X-rays proved otherwise. Better luck next year Steve.

Many of our lifters were in their first competition and they all performed very well with no "bombouts."

All seven of our Master lifters turned in good performances with Bill McElwain and Tom Osipowich graciously electing to go Open and leaving three over 40 Masters to duke it out for the three medals. Osipowich's squat, dead lift, and total were new Master's meet records. Forty-eight year old Bob Rodriguez increased all of his own Masters records at 148. Tom Eldridge's lifts at 198 were all records since none existed in the over 50 age group. Tom, who planned to open the bench at 319, got the scare of his life when while warming up, quickly realized that a pinched nerve in his neck was causing some paralysis in his right arm. He managed to bench 264 on his third attempt after missing it on his second by offsetting the grip and taking the majority of the load with his left arm.

Other outstanding contributors were spotter/loaders Tony Teets, Willie and Wayne Salmon, and Doug Travis. Special thanks to announcer Roger Bolton and scorekeepers Danni Hartmann, Linda Devaney, Sue Cox, and Candi Wilson. When the meet was over, Danni and Linda loaded all the warm-up equipment including 100 pound plates onto the truck by themselves! They also helped load the truck to go to the meet and set up the warm-up area. That's real dedication you must agree. Everyone had a great time and I'm sure are looking forward to next year in Santa Clara.
