

MEMBERS RESPONSIBILTY FOR MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE VESSEL SIZE

The Glendale Yacht Club Board of Directors has a responsibility to its members to enforce the provisions as required under our "Articles of Agreement" and club "By-Laws", regarding what is deemed the maximum allowable size a vessel can be for each individual slip.

This is outlined in the table titled "PROPRIETARY LEASE – Schedule 1", of the Glendale Yacht Club Closing Book, and on page 2 of the "Membership Slip Annual Lease Agreement". This schedule details each slip's maximum allowable vessel size (TOTAL length and width).

This maximum allowable vessel size must take into account all extensions such as swim platforms, bow pulpits, safety rails, and numerous other protrusions, all which continue to encroach on deck areas, adjoining slips and navigation channels, causing safety and other concerns.

As a member of the Glendale Yacht Club, the GYC Board of Directors assumes you have performed your responsibilities in verifying the size of your vessel, as it pertains to the OVERALL length and OVERALL width, and that you have determined that these dimensions meet the requirements for your individual slip.

Should your vessel not meet this criteria, and is found to be non-conforming, the Glendale Yacht Club Board of Directors reserves the right to act in the Club's best interest and take the necessary steps to resolve the issue.
