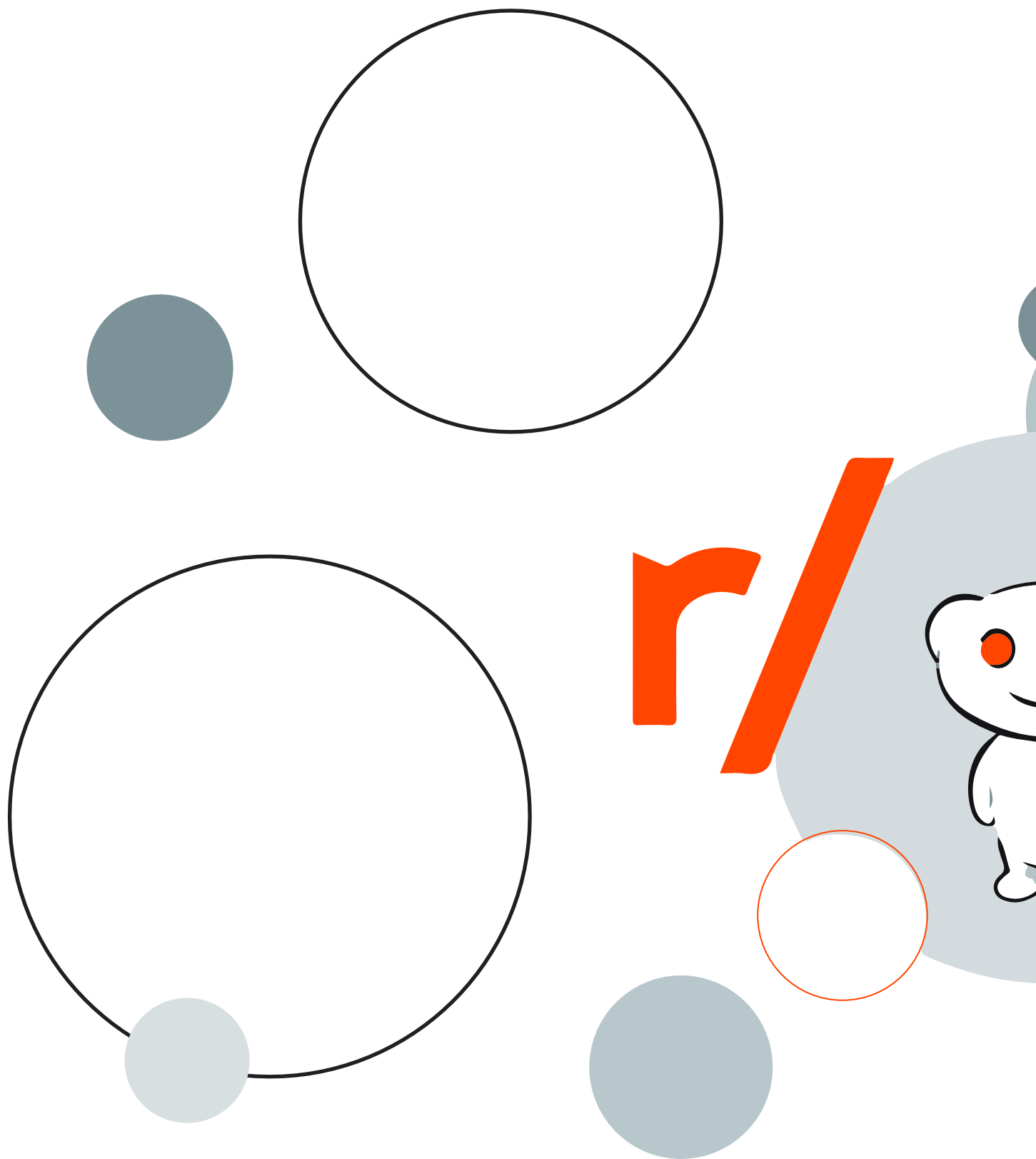

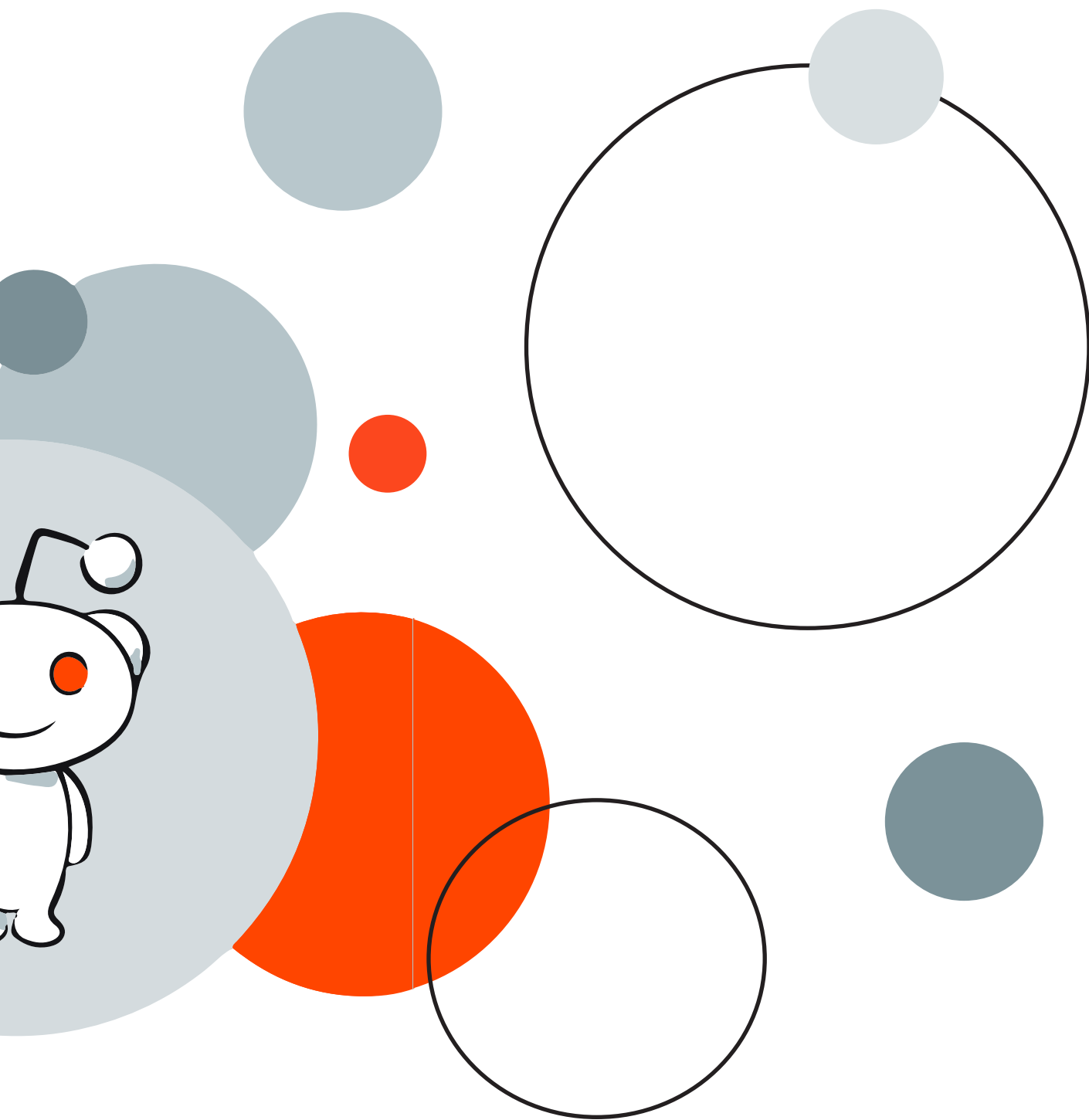

Germany has many traditions they celebrate. The first being, Oktoberfest. Oktoberfest started as a royal wedding celebration, and now it is a two week long folk festival. The festival is based in Munich and is full of drinking, eating, and merriment on the Wies'n. Christmas is celebrated by majority of German's, and Munich has traditional markets full of festive decorations, food, and gifts. Soccer is also very popular in Germany, and Germans often attend the games or meet up at a beer garden to watch the games.



Working culture:

In Germany, the working culture strives to achieve formality and efficiency. A typical work week is between thirty and forty-five hours with a lunch break from 12 pm- 2pm, and meeting up at a beer garden with friends after work.

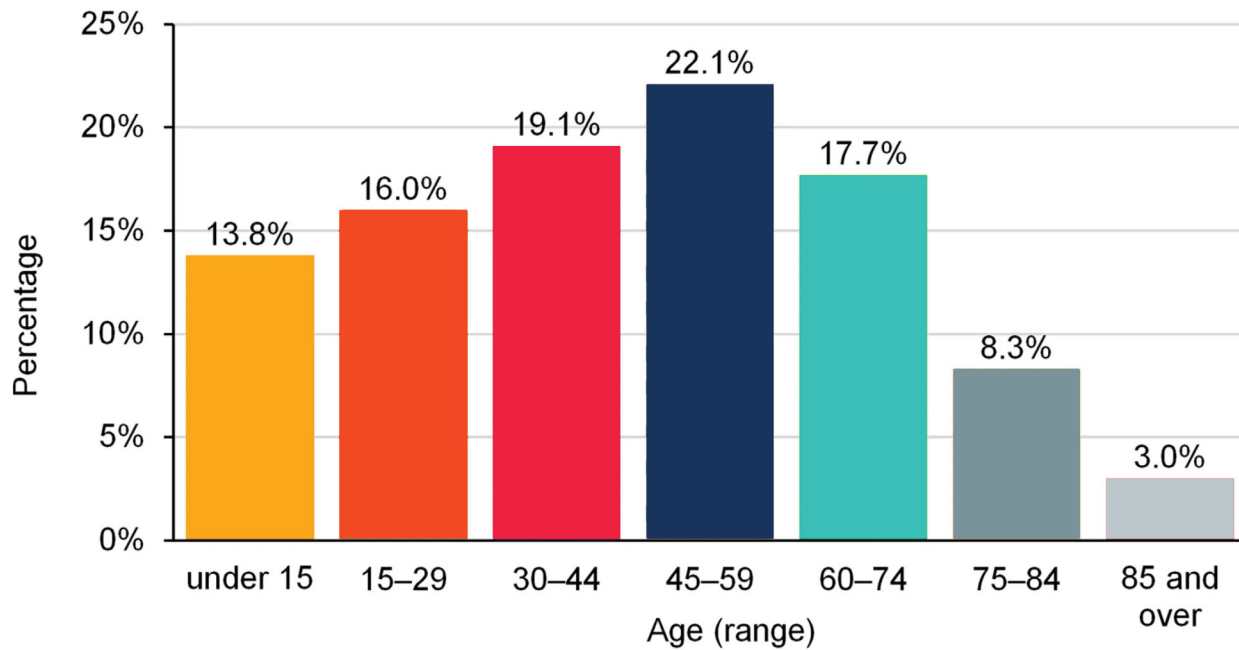


A population of 1.56 million makes Munich Germany's third-largest city, after Hamburg and Berlin.

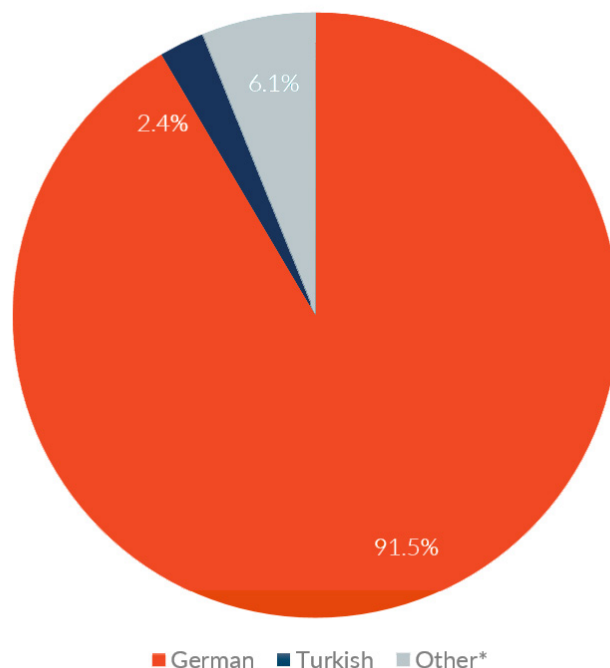
The number of marriages in Munich during 2021 was 357,785. The number of divorces in 2021 was 142,800. On average people are married about 14.5 years before divorce.



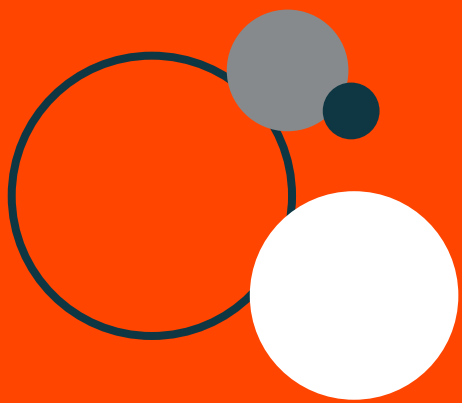
Germany age breakdown (2021*)



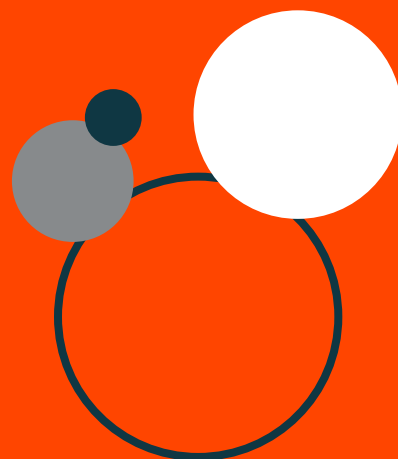
Ethnic Makeup of Germany

Munich is Germany's second largest venue for employment. On average for the whole of 2021, a new record figure of 908,457 people were employed in socially insured jobs in Munich. Overall, in 2021 the number of employees registered for social insurance showed a year-on-year increase of 1.2%. In absolute terms in 2021, most new jobs were created in the 'information and communication' sector (+ 22 223 new jobs). Next came 'corporate services' (all in all + 19 530 new jobs) with 'legal and tax advice, auditing and business consulting' making a particularly notable contribution of 19.9%. More than ever, also boosted by pandemic needs, 'healthcare and social services' experienced rising demand for labor and saw a 11 % increase in employment (10 682 jobs).

Munich has several different economic benefits, some include, technology, engineering, automobiles, manufacturing, publishing and printing. Germany is home to BMW, Allianz, Munich Re, and MTU Aero Engines. These large companies play a big role in creating jobs and bringing revenue to the country.



The first higher education qualification in Germany is the Bachelor degree. The standard period of study "Regelstudienzeit" in a Bachelor program is 6 semesters, or 3 full academic years. In Universities of Applied Sciences bachelor studies last 6-7 semesters, by also including the practical work.

The median salary in Munich is 3,860 EUR per month, meaning that half (50%) of the population earns less than 3,860 EUR while the other half more than 3,860 EUR. The average salary in München is €83,983 EUR per year. The most typical earning is €67,010 EUR.



The harmonized unemployment rate in Germany was at 3.0 percent in August 2022, unchanged from an upwardly revised figure in the prior month. The number of unemployed was unchanged at 1.30 million, while the number of employed was slightly down by 6,000, following a monthly increase of 34,000, at 45.3 million. For 2022 thus far, the annual average unemployment rate was 5.2 percent. For 2021 it was 5.7%.

HISTORY OF MUNICH

Munich was founded in 1158.

Munich (München in German) means "home of the monks", a name that stems from the Benedictine monastery founded in the area around the mid-8th century.

In 1923 Hitler and his supporters, who at that time were concentrated in Munich, staged the Beer Hall Putsch, an attempt to overthrow the Weimar Republic and seize power. Munich became the ideological centre of National Socialism.

During WW II Munich was heavily bombed and the population of the city sank from some 800'000 to 500,000 (during the years of WW II people moved out of Munich). Munich was completely rebuilt following a meticulous and - by comparison to other war-ravaged German cities - rather conservative plan which preserved its pre-war street grid (Wikipedia). Munich's population passed 1 million in 1957.

In 1972, the Olympic Games were held in Munich. However, the event ended in tragedy, with 17 people being killed in a terrorist incident.





r/Lifestyle Capital

Munich today is a city that thrives in industry as well as tourism. It is highly cosmopolitan with a beautiful historic center, vibrant cultural life, a high standard of living, and low crime rates. German life expectancy and quality is higher than average, which can likely be attributed to factors such as the economy, environment, social situation, education, and politics. They also do not focus on long hours at work and are able to take vacation days more readily than many parts of Europe. In general, the German lifestyle is very private and structured around routines and habits.

Munich is one of the world's great beer and brewing capitals in Europe with the city having several of the largest breweries in Germany. Munich is famous for its beer and its annual Oktoberfest celebration that is held over a two-week period that ends on the first Sunday in October. This celebration includes many parades, games, amusement rides, music, and dancing and draws more than six million people each year. Traditional German dishes and over 75,000 hectoliters (about 2 million gallons) of beer are consumed during Oktoberfest.

Climate

Located near the Alps in southeast Germany, the climate in the city of Munich remains cold for a large portion of the year, but Foehn (warm and dry wind that descends from the mountains and is capable of causing a rapid increase in temperature and a decrease in relative humidity) during the autumn months with occasional occurrences in winter and spring brings an unexpected warmth to the city. The city as a whole does not get a lot of sun in autumn and winter, with rare sunshine from November to February and an average of 7-8 hours of sunshine per day in May-August which far exceeds the average for most German cities.

A typical winter day averages at about $0^{\circ}\text{C}/32^{\circ}\text{F}$ and drops to much cooler temperatures during the night. During the winter months, snowfall is common although, usually in the form of light snow that can turn into snowstorms on occasion, and fog remains prevalent throughout the city but especially in northern Munich.

Autumn begins with pleasant days that quickly turn cold, wet, and dark and night frosts beginning as early as October. In this season, the infamous Oktoberfest, held in the last two weekends of September and the first of October, can expect minimum temps ranging from 41°F to 46°F and maximum temps of 59°F to 64°F .

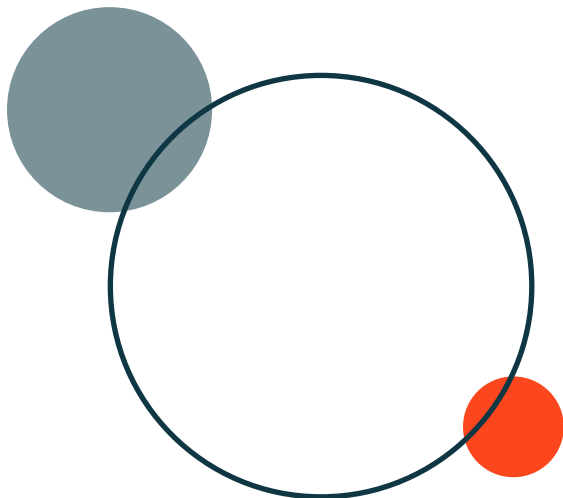
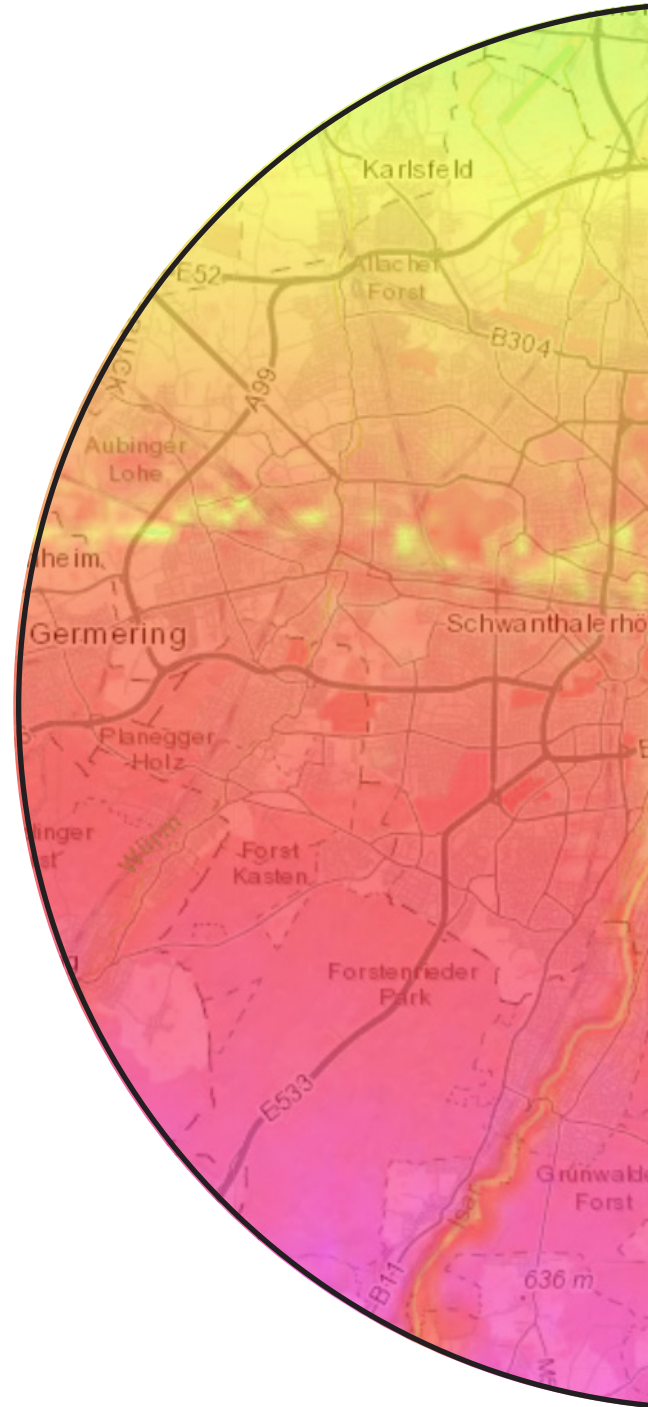
Summers in Munich are pleasantly warm during the days with temperatures remaining in the 60°F to 70°F range and occasionally reaching as high as 90°F. During these months, rain from the Atlantic can bring cooler temperatures and even thunderstorms or intense hail.

Spring in the city begins in March, but warmer weather won't appear until April, and even then, the threat of cold snaps persists until May when the sun appears and days become mild and even sometimes warm with cold nights.

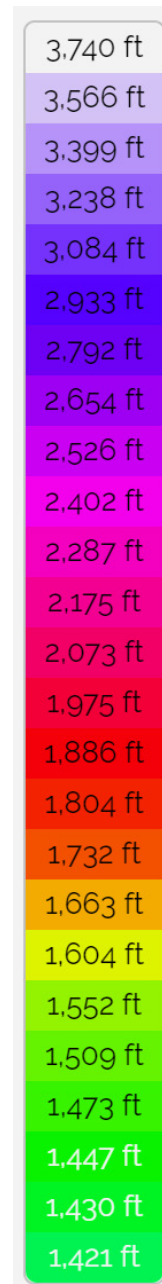
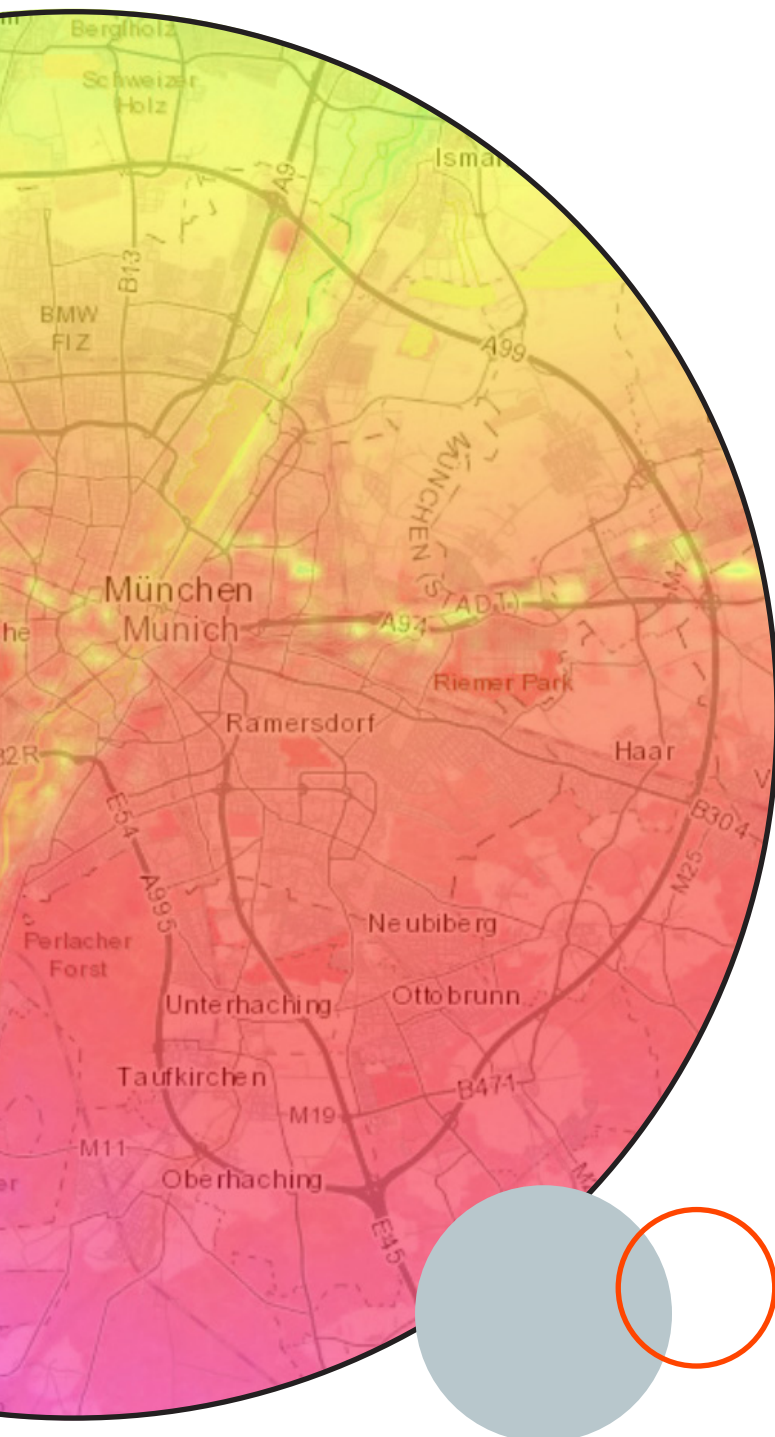


Terrain

Munich, the largest city and capital of the German state of Bavaria, is located on the River Isar just north of the Bavarian Alps at an altitude of about 520 m above sea level. Due to its location in the Northern Alpine Foreland, much of the city would have been a sandy plateau with highly fertile soil and morainic hills in the southern portion. In some areas of Munich, groundwater can permeate the gravel surface leading to marshes in the north and occasional floods. The Wurm River is also local to the city of Munich.

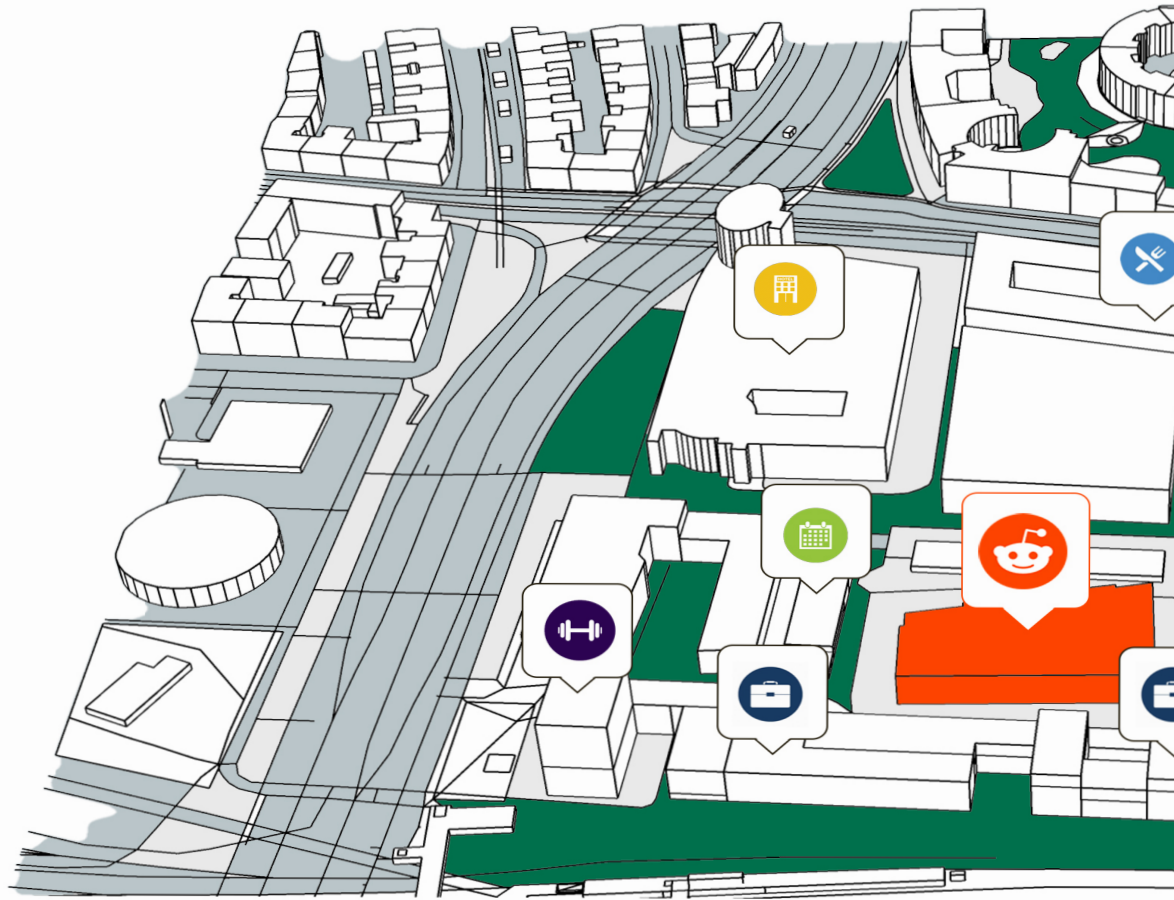


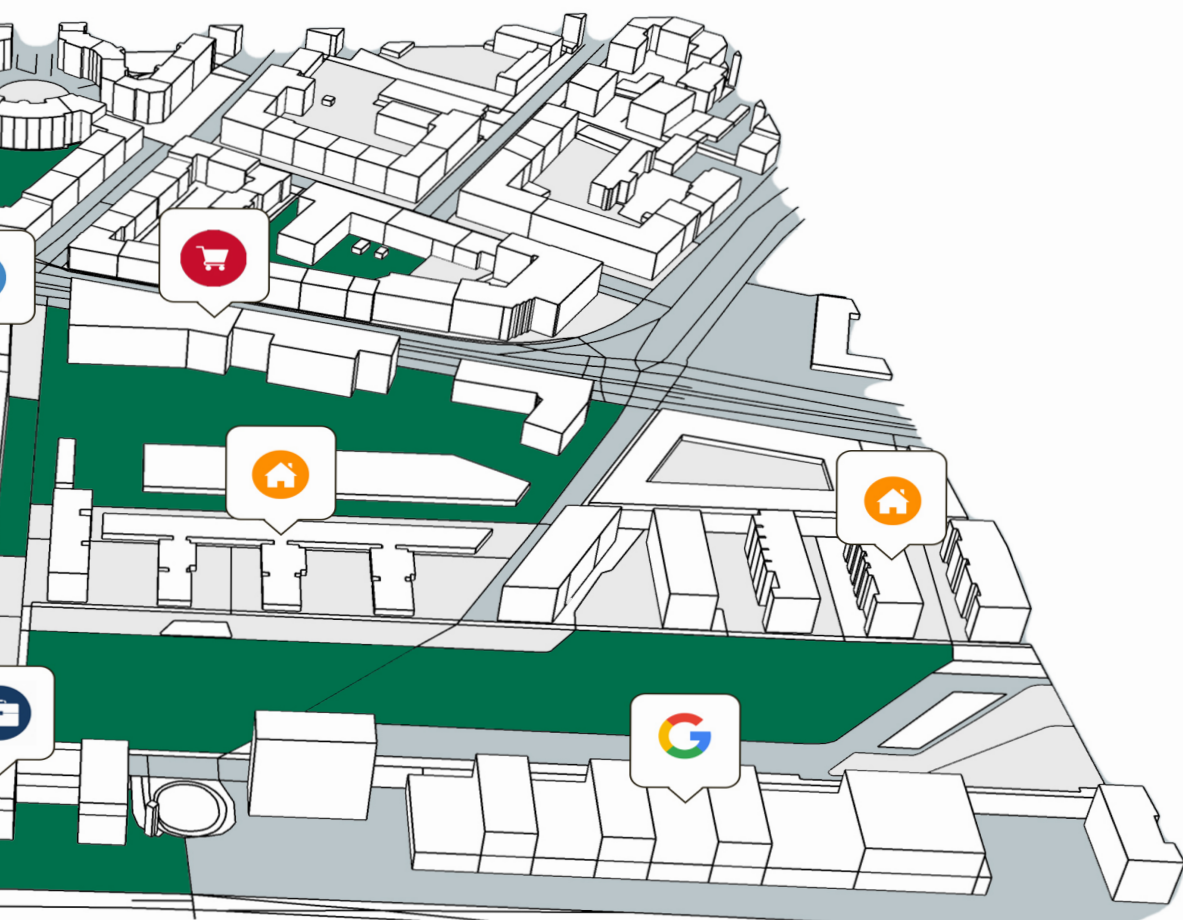

Gothic, Alpine and Bauhaus style are present and preserved in this town. Industrial and minimalistic design is common around Munich and in fact the German styles tend to be more modern throughout history. Raw, pure, unfinished materials and commonly found and designs also tend to feature elements including utilitarian objects, neutral tones, and metal and wood surfaces. Although, different shapes in the architecture, pops of color, unique furniture, and lots of light are typically used to add a little something different in the design. On the outside, you may commonly see half-timbered/fully-timbered buildings (key to traditional architecture), A-frame roofs (common in traditional Bavarian homes) and many historic houses made from brick (especially in the north where there was less rock available throughout history). On the inside of buildings you will see the common use of bar doors or sliding doors and the use of curtains.

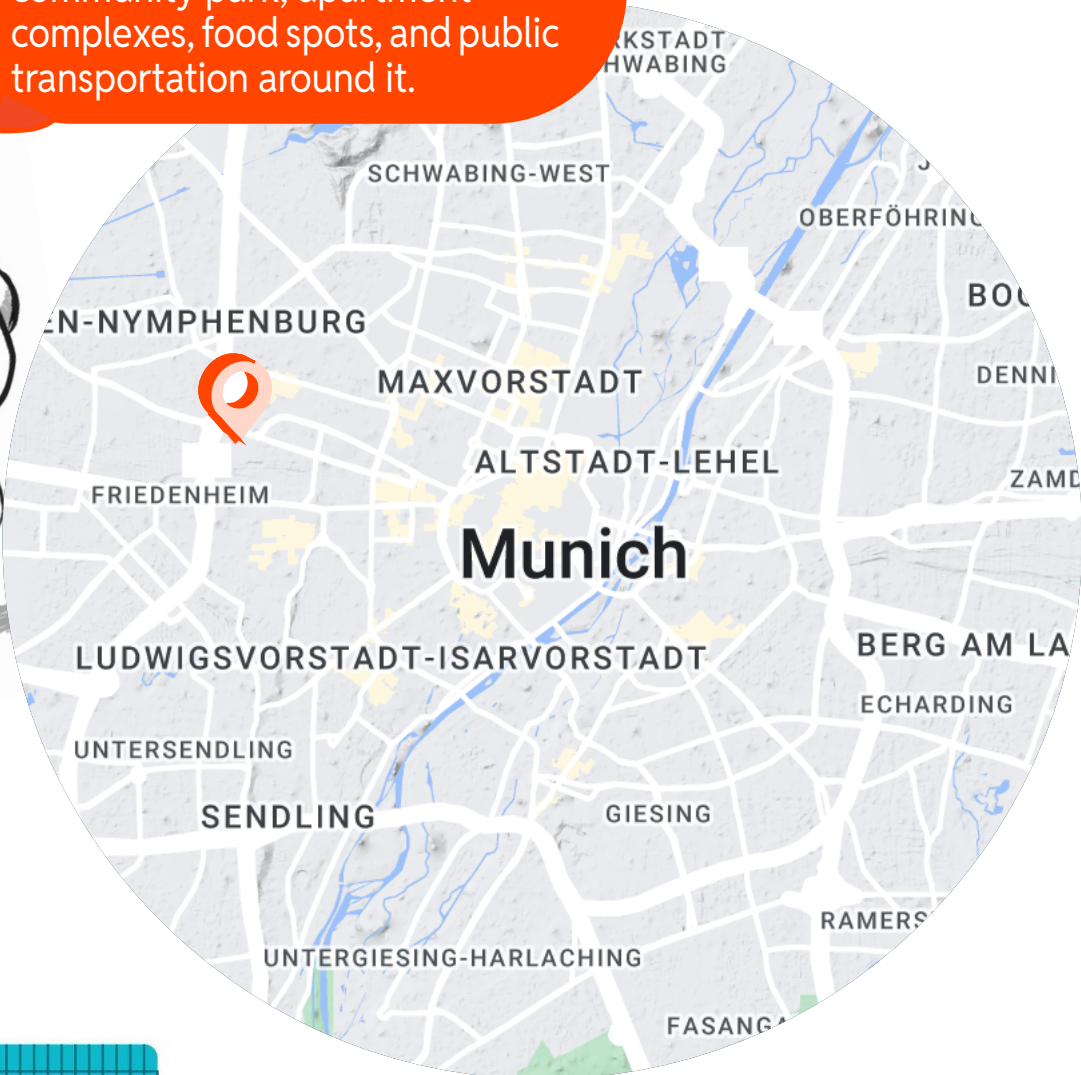

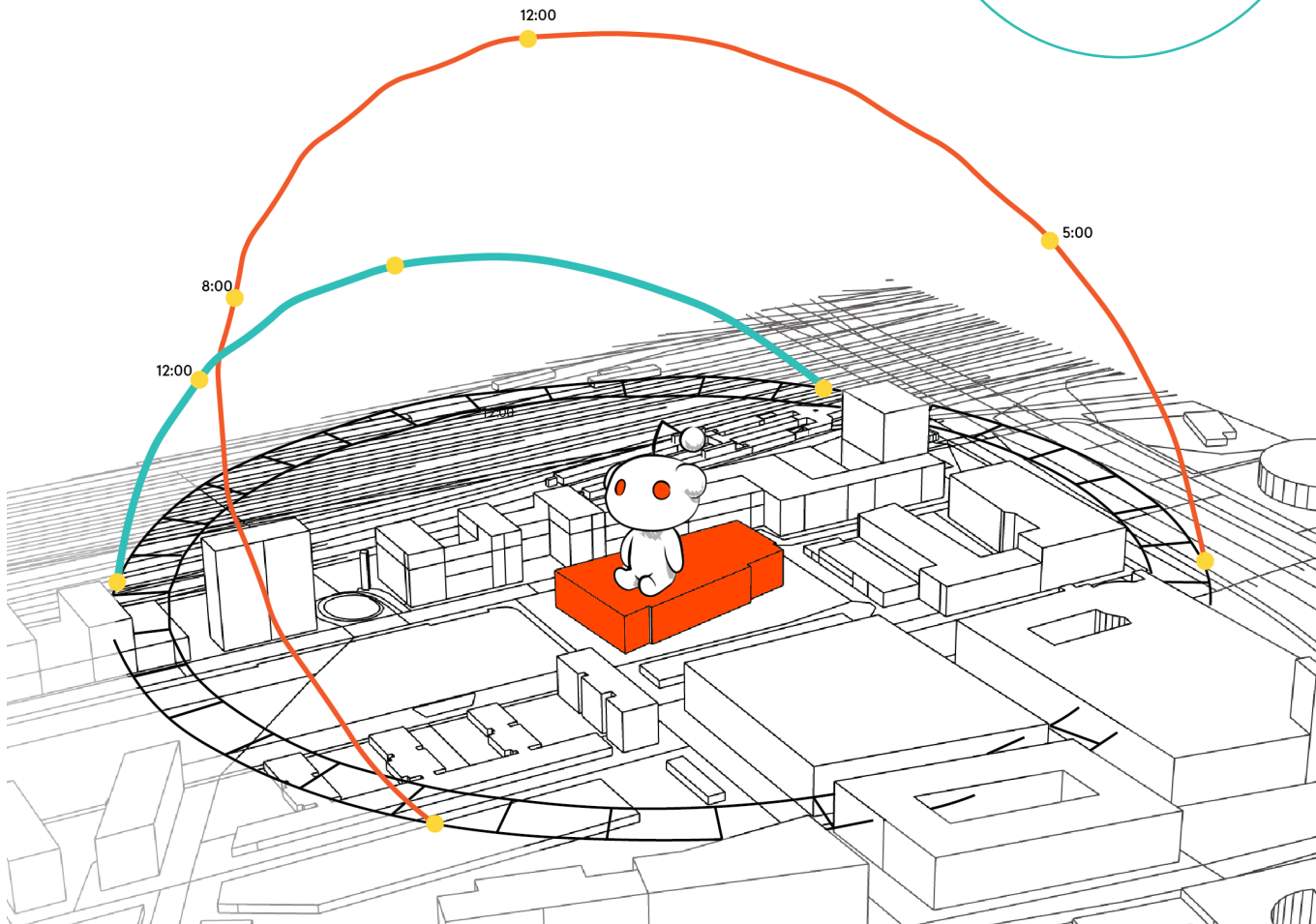

Building Codes & Requirements

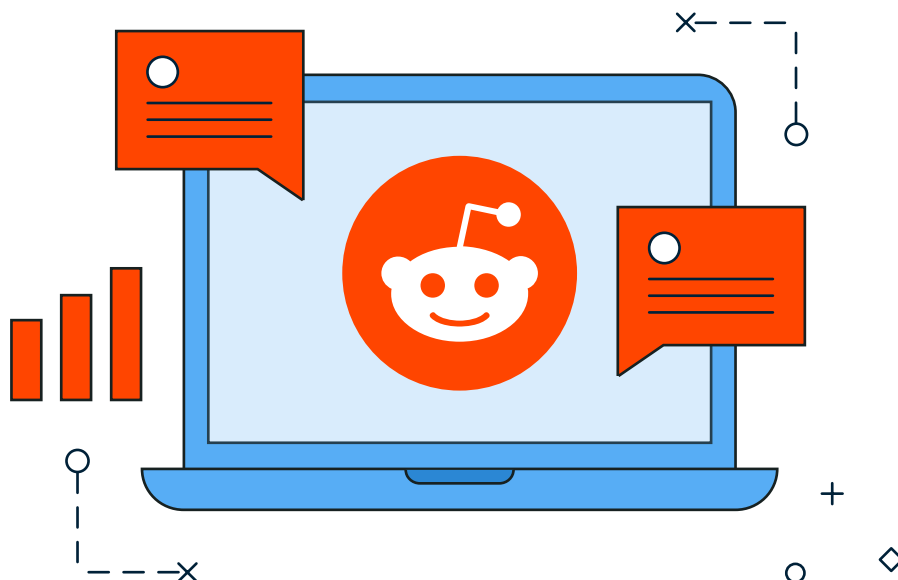
Codes

Building safety in Germany is a shared responsibility between federal and state governments, with the federal government issuing the zoning law and each state responsible for their building regulations.

The Model Building Code (Musterbauordnung) is a federal code that offers a prototype for each state to issue its own building regulations. To obtain a building permit (Baugenehmigung), a construction project must comply with all planning and building regulations and all other relevant regulations.

In addition, the city of Munich is prone to snow and wind that propose corresponding codes that the headquarters of Reddit must adopt and comply on a local and federal level. Occasional flooding the northern portion of the city requires local building and safety codes to be considered but is not necessarily a primary concern for the location of this project.

ADA Codes have been adopted throughout all public spaces and private spaces to accommodate a diverse and inclusive workplace at the Reddit headquarters in Munich, Germany. ADA clearances are annotated by appropriately scaled dashed geometry.





Security

Security throughout the building is addressed by the implementation of employee only access into office spaces that can only be accessed by employee tap-in via an electronic identification card on approved mobile devices. In addition, security surveillance monitored 24/7 by a third-party is in place as well as extra measures taken on the top floor where confidential information is stored. All devices are password protected for each employee.

Systems Thinking

Integrative and sustainable design requires the strategy of systems thinking. This holistic approach ensures that all of the systems within a project are interconnected and best utilized because it requires the evaluation of how strategies work for or against each other, potential risks of strategies, and the balance of systems to minimize risks. Throughout this design process, we have widened our design lens to take a systems thinking approach in order to best consider interdependence and the effects and outcomes of planning and design processes and decisions for the Reddit headquarters.



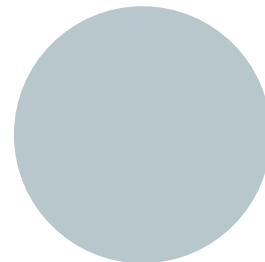

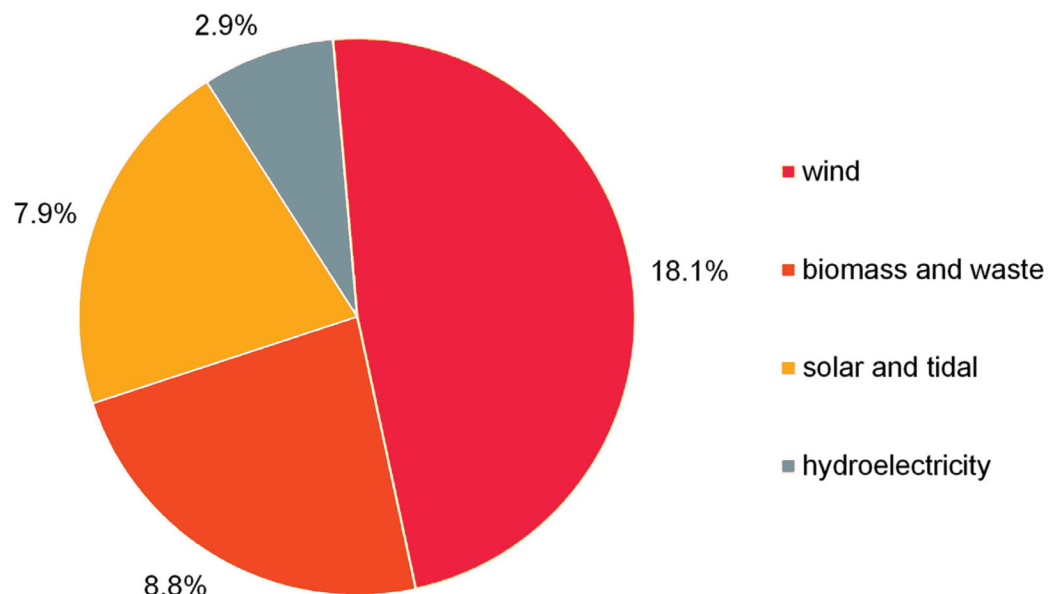
Sustainability

In 2002, Germany agreed on a National Sustainable Development Strategy and formed the German Council for Sustainable Development to actively pursue the path of sustainability. In 2018, the German Sustainable Development Strategy was updated to include other causes such as the reduction of hunger and poverty, climate protection, and gender equality. Some of the goals of the strategy include:

- 55% less greenhouse gas emissions than 1990 by 2030.
- 45% less air pollution than 2005 by 2030.
- 20% ecological agriculture by 2030.
- 34% market share for environmentally friendly products by 2030.

Currently, Germany remains well placed as an international sustainability pioneer, but according to a 2018 Peer Review, that raised warning to the country and challenged them to pursue their goals with an even greater determination if they hope to meet the new targets set that year.

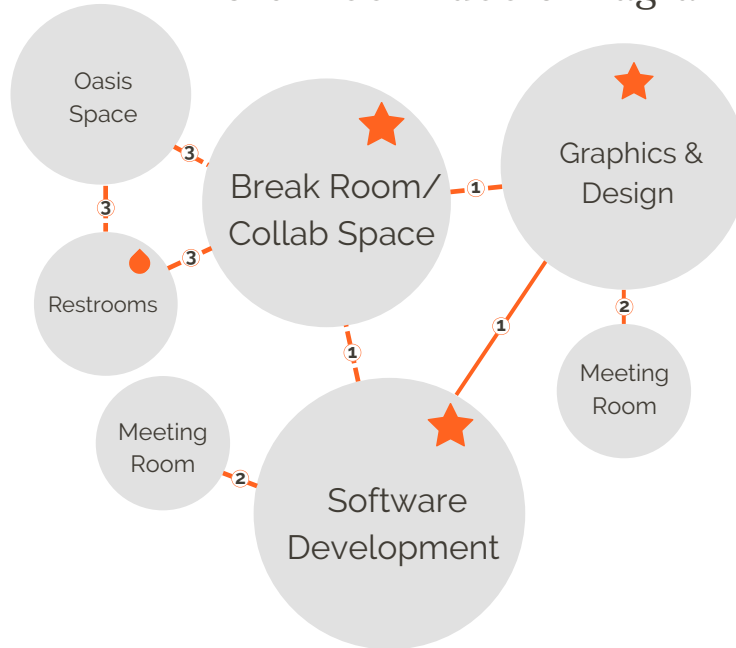


2nd Floor Bubble Diagram

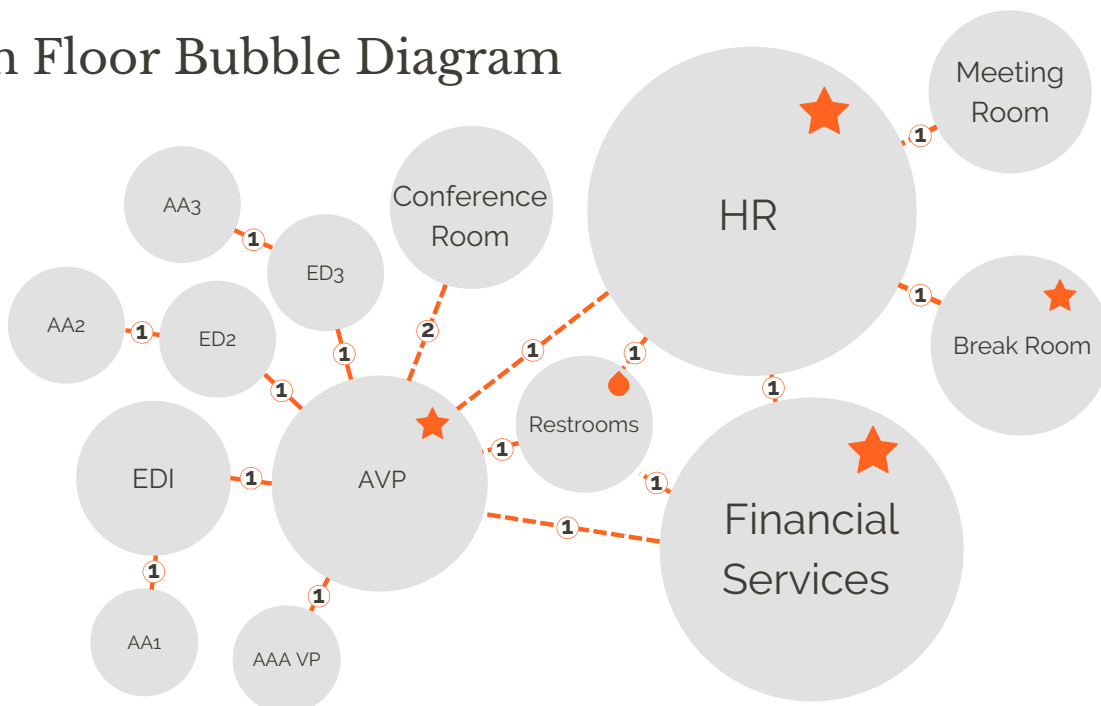




3rd Floor Bubble Diagram

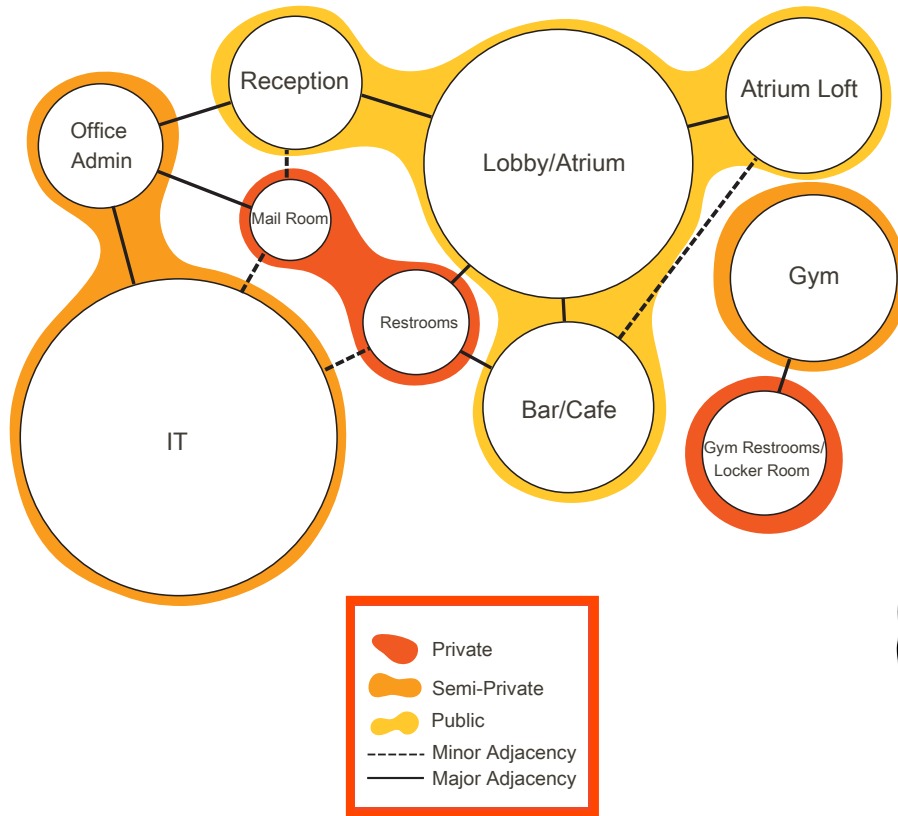


4th Floor Bubble Diagram

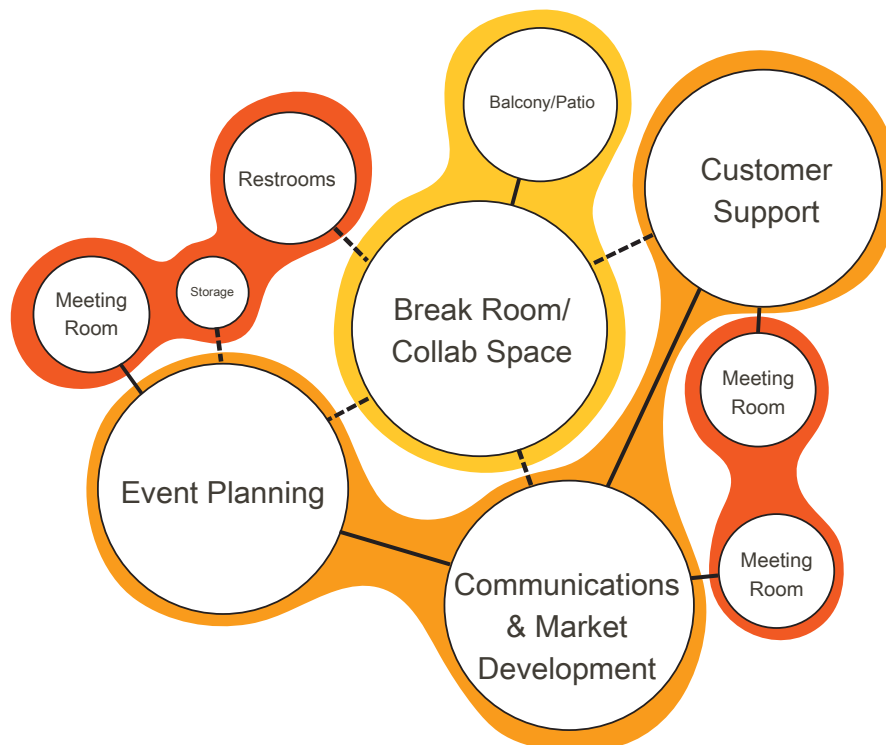

1st Privacy Zoning Diagram

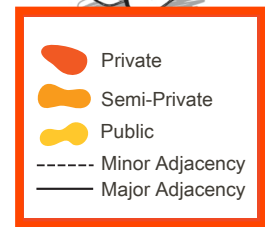


2nd Floor Privacy Zoning Diagram

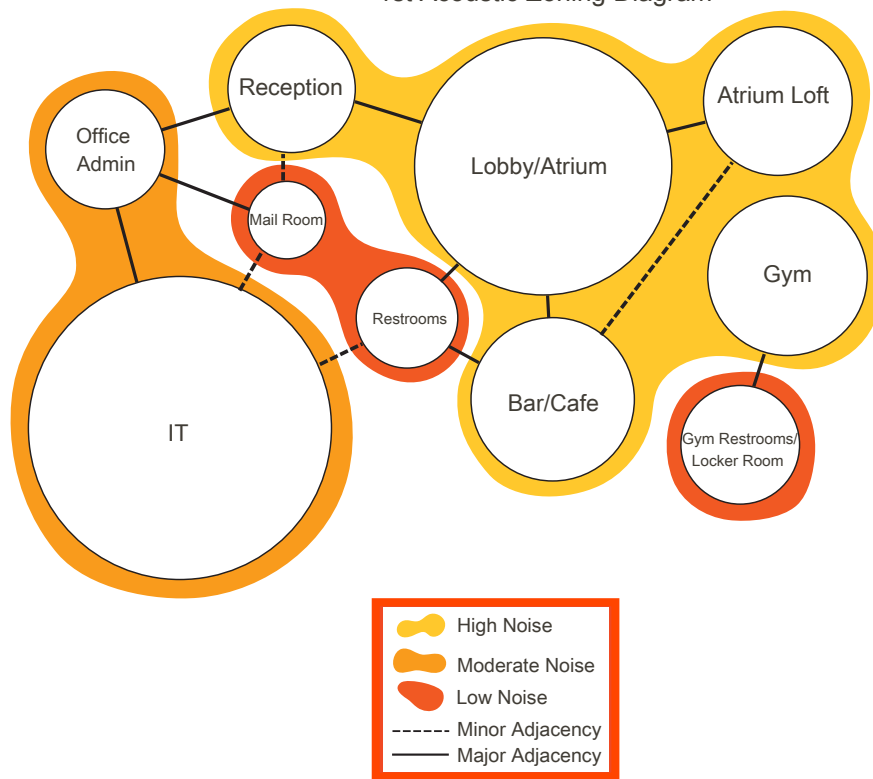

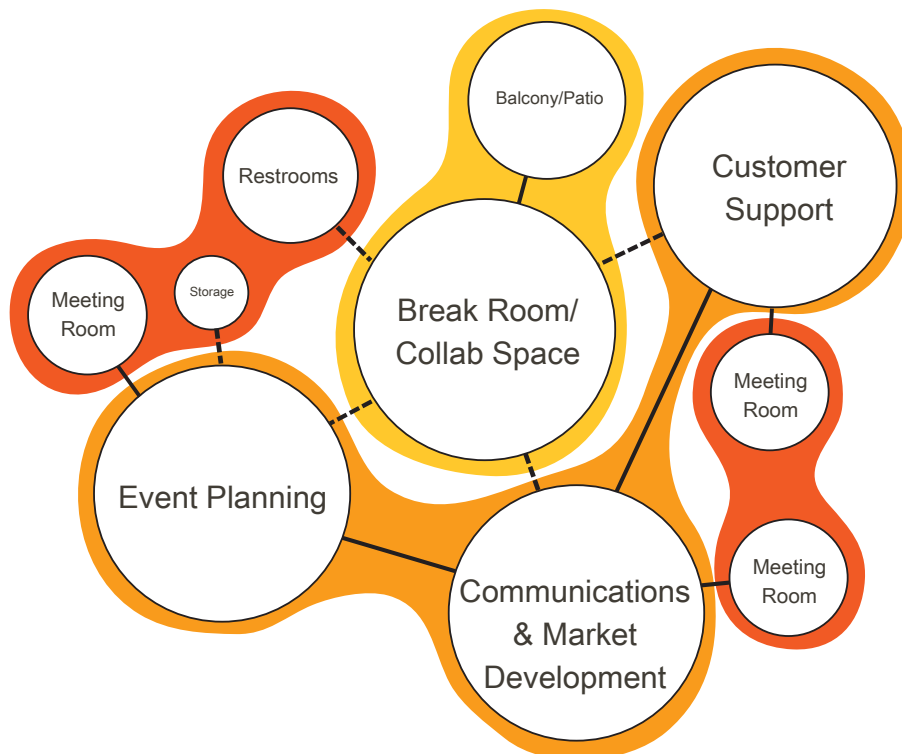

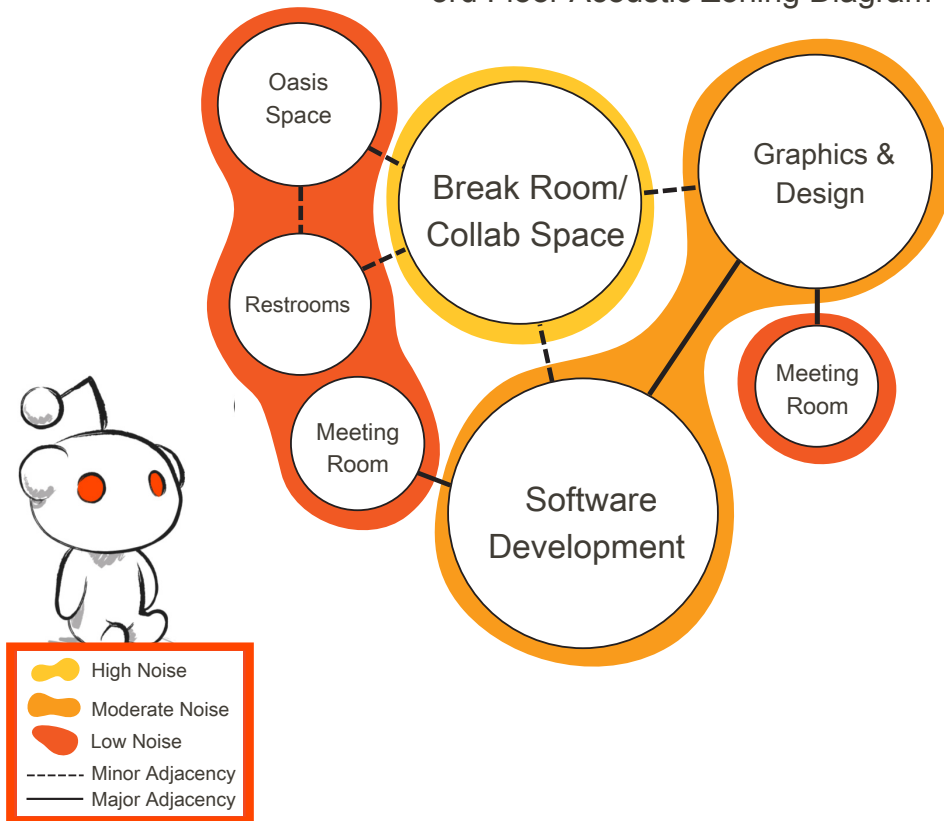
1st Acoustic Zoning Diagram



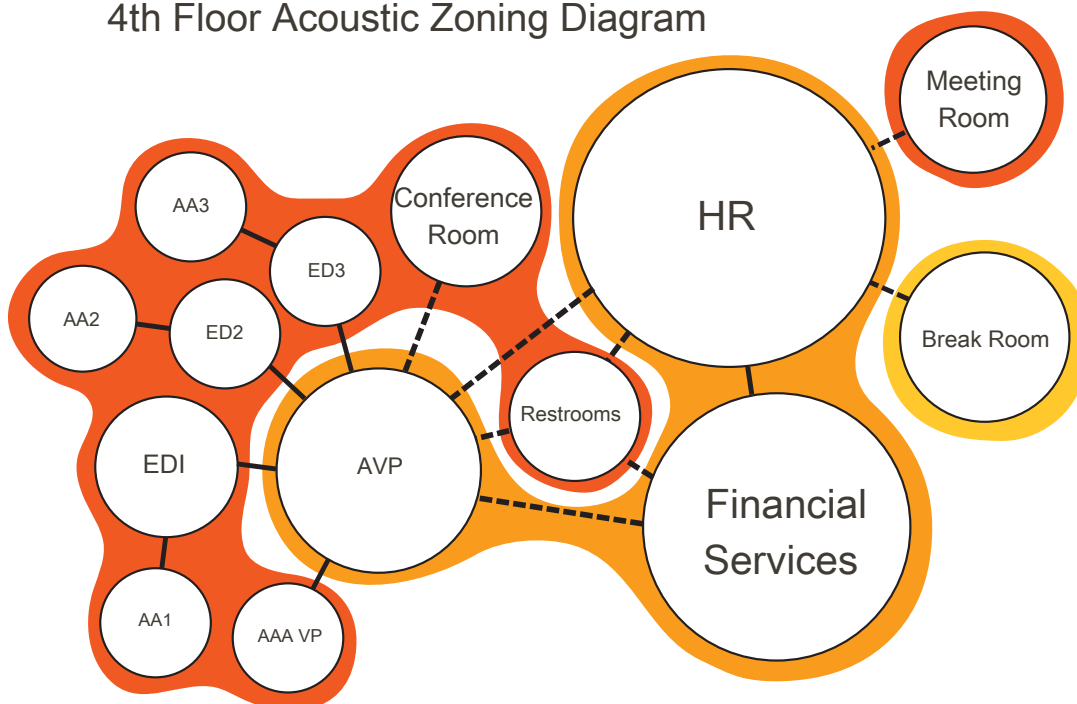
2nd Floor Acoustic Zoning Diagram

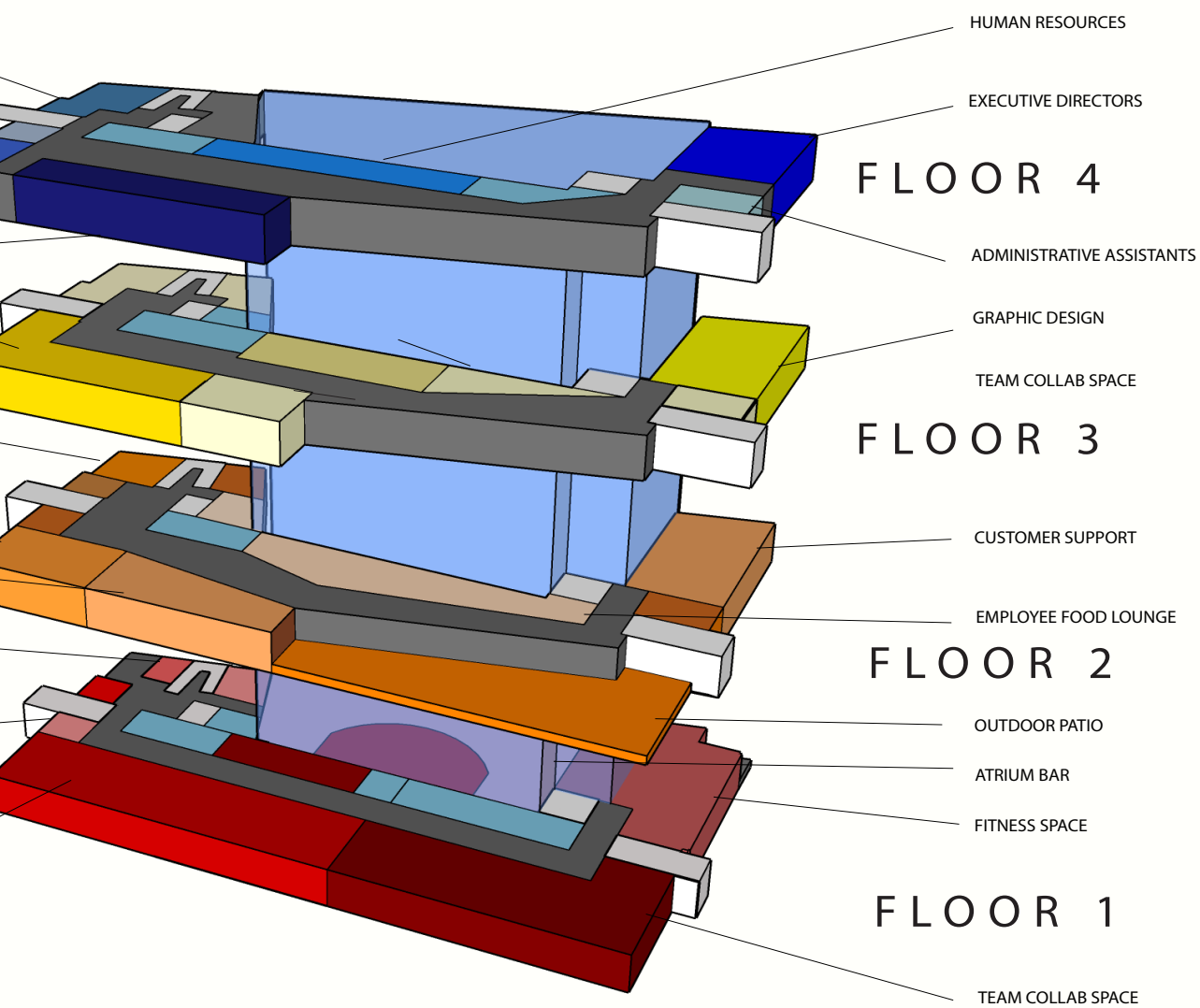

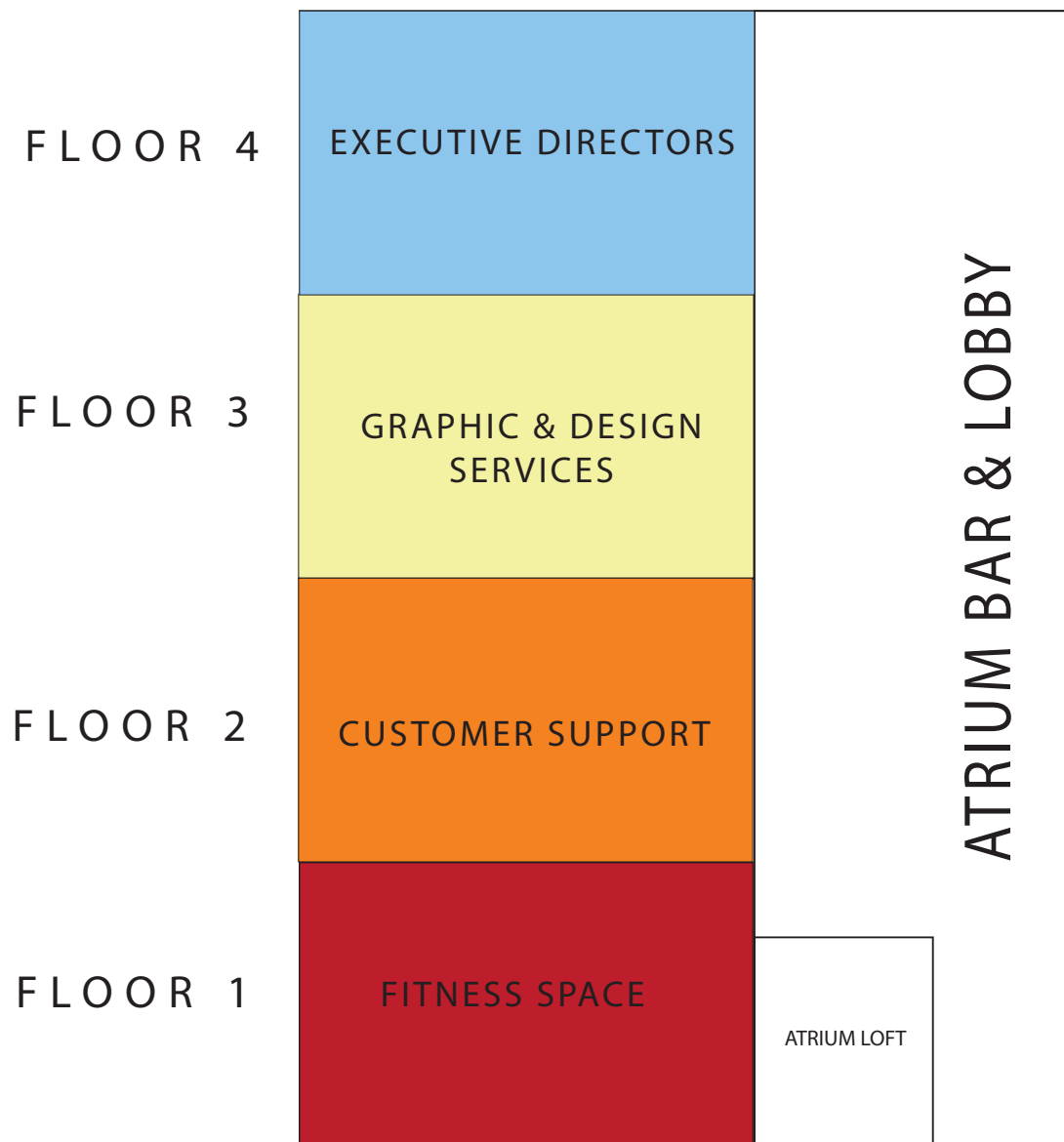

In a culture that seems to stand opposite of the company's foundational principles, we found a compromise between the rigidity of the German workplace and the dynamic structure of the Reddit company environment. In order to achieve this goal, we first payed respect to the importance of hierarchy by secluding higher ups in private offices that remain tucked away and less accessible, unless they are better benefited to overlook and monitor the workplace; however, each of these private offices include at least one wall of glass to promote company transparency. Secondly, we acknowledged the

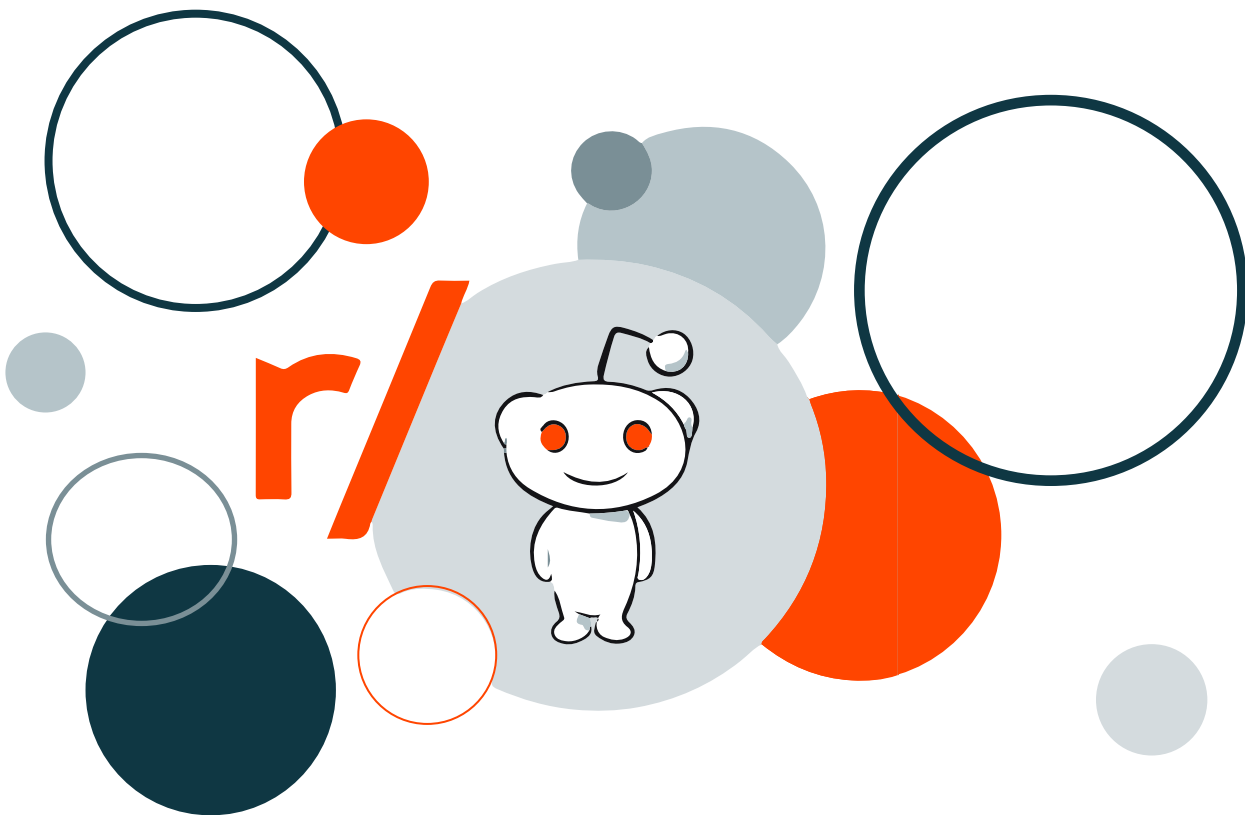
necessity for privacy for the individual by incorporating demountable walls, workspace partitions, and acoustical controls in all work and meeting spaces, unless the designated space is specifically purposed for collaboration among coworkers. Finally, we addressed the desire for flexibility to accommodate the changing expectations of the workplace to fit the individual employee's needs by creating various types of workspaces and moving away from the traditional assigned office style to a "rentable" private office system. With these three considerations as our focus for the design of the Reddit headquarters in Munich,

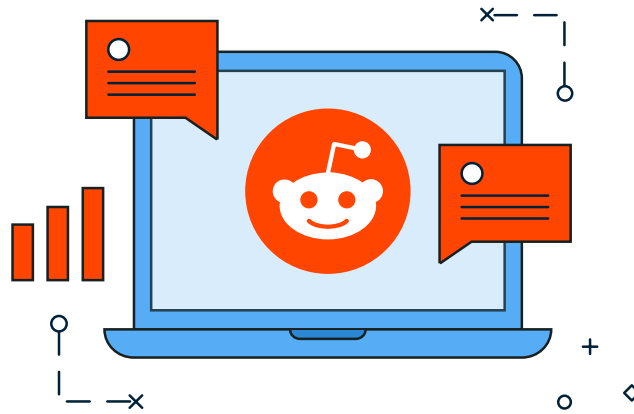

The native design style of Germany is defined by modern silhouettes and neutral minimalism. In contrast, the Reddit brand is defined by its loud and bold colors in conjunction with the youthful animation of the characters known as “snoos”. With these conflicting images in mind, we created the concept of the “Playful Professional” workplace to maintain a middle ground between the vibrant branding of the client and streamlined standard of the site’s culture. This

concept also provides a creative solution to incentivizing the office and catering to the experience of the workplace for those that may occupy it or just pass through. The “playful” aspect comes from the incorporation of the branding colors and dynamic furniture and fixture selections to compliment the additional amenities spaces such as the bar, fitness, and oasis spaces. The “professional” aspect comes from the architectural materials and finishes as well as the physical space allocation.
