From the Director's Desk

From the Directors Desk,

Well, we have prayed for water and it seems as though we prayed too hard. We are getting all the rain that we need and then some, and unfortunately, way too much rain and runoff for many areas here in Northern California. It has already caused some of our chapters to cancel their planned outings for February and March, which is adding to cabin fever. Of course, we reach out to our brothers and sisters who are now experiencing flooding issues. We pray that each of you are okay and not in harm's way.

Bonne and I, earlier this month, attended the Tuleburg Sams 40th anniversary celebration as a chapter of NorCal. I congratulate them on this milestone, and challenge them to reach 50 years. I have to add that they know how to put on a party, and we appreciated their hospitality.

Our efforts are now focused on the upcoming Rally, scheduled for April 27th through the 30th, at the Lodi Grape Festival fairgrounds, in Lodi, Ca.. As you know this year's theme is, "The Land of Oz". Darci Luihn has asked that each chapter that is in attendance to decorate a standard size floor tile, in this year's theme, as a center-piece for the dinner banquet. If you plan on having a large group and will need more than one table, then she asks that chapter's decorate a tile for each table. Only one decorated tile per chapter will be judged in the decorating contest. This was successful last year, with a lot of decorating talent out there.

We are initiating more changes for this year's Rally. Workers and vendors that will arrive on Wednesday or before, will enter the main gate as usual. However, those attendees that

arrive on Thursday through Saturday will enter the grounds at the South Gate on Lockeford Street, which will be manned by the parking crew, and will be easily visible upon your arrival. This should alleviate congestion that was experienced by using the main gate.

We are attempting to get new and better signage that will give directions to where each event will be held. A map will also be provided as an attachment to your program.

Every effort will be made to eliminate any over-lap of seminars and other popular events. This was an area of concern that was identified in an after-hour critique of last year's Rally.

I am asking that volunteer workers come to the Chardonnay Hall, by the registration table, on Wednesday, at 3:30 pm. The leader of each designated work area will have those volunteers gather with him/her, and work with the leader for a work schedule. This will eliminate the confusion that was experienced last year in scheduling.

Cricket Weight, Commercial chairperson, has been working hard at securing more vendors with new products for your shopping pleasure. Come and see what she has lined up.

Please keep her in your prayers and thoughts.

Remember, the Rally is for you and your enjoyment. Plan on making the Rally a chapter outing, participate, and revel in the fun. Also, please sign-up to be a volunteer worker. The more people that sign-up, then the less time that each worker will spend. Also, I am guaranteeing power and water to the first 150 rigs that register, on a first come, first serve basis, and all rigs are being planned to be parked within the fence this year. If, however, your chapter wants to park together in the "back forty" and

dry-camp, then this is an option for your chapter. Because we are offering power and water means that some chapters may not be able to park as a group together due to space restrictions. Every effort will be made to accommodate the groups.

Shifting gears, the Good Sam organization has made a significant change. They have decided to eliminate our Regional Directors, and in their place there will but one National Director for all of the Good Sam regions. This change should not impact our chapters, however, it will make my operations more difficult by not having a Regional Director to rely upon for any issues that may arise. Minutes from January 7, 2017

The NCGS State Committee meeting was called to order by Director, Wayne Wall at 10:01 a.m.

The meeting was opened with a call for the Colors This was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance lead by Director Wayne Wall.

An invocation was given by Marilee Ginoulis.

Past NCGS Director, Ken Ginoulis then formally reinstalled our present NCGS Director, Wayne Wall, as our 2017 NCGS Director.

Wayne thanked Ken for picking up the donuts for the meeting.

Roll Call was then carried out with 12 Chapters being represented at this NCGS State Committee Meeting for this January 07, 2017 meeting.

Wayne then introduced his Staff.

There were no special guests to introduce. Director Wayne Wall thanked all the chapter presidents/representatives for attending.

Minutes of the last SCM were accepted as published; motion made, seconded, and passed.

Treasurer's Report: Reported by Director Wayne.

A bill was submitted by Cricket Weight. A call for question was made. Motion made by Jack Kersten, seconded by Homer Hoglund and carried.

The subject of the large copier purchased during Bill Baker's directorship was brought up again. Wayne stated it was still in Bill's garage and is available for anyone who would like to have it.

Correspondence:

There was no correspondence reported.

Director Wayne asked for volunteers for our two vacant Assistant State Director positions.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Tel-A-Sam: Cary McCutchen, our Editor for the TAS stated the cut-off date for articles to be turned in for publication of the next TAS is **02/24/2017**. Any articles of information regarding the Rally, i.e. Craft Show, Carnival or other Rally activities should be turned in on time to be published in the next TAS. Charities:

Darci Luihn is now our Charities Chair as this position aligns with the Chapter of the Year chair duties. .All volunteer hours of members of any chapter for a charitable cause, (i.e. volunteering time at the school, a church, your city, local hospitals, etc.) are to be reported to Darci.

Marilee Ginoulis again reminded members to bring any outer-wear coats, jackets, etc., they no longer use, to any SCM or the Rally and are tallied for points to the chapter donating items. These are points garnered for Chapter of the year on the donations. These are donated to the Salvation Army and are very much appreciated. Marilee reiterated those who have these outer-wear items may also take them to their local Salvation Army facility and state it is from the NCGS and obtain a receipt for tracking purposes.

Chapter Attendance Awards were brought up to date. Chapters receiving Attendance Awards for the year 2015 were: Apple Dumpling Gang, Camillia City Sams, Camp Far West, El Dorado Sams, Free & Easy Sams, Gold Nugget Sams, Good Sam Mateans, Honey Do Sams, Lazy Daisy Sams, Lodi Senior Bells, Lucky Ones, Redwood Good Sams and Tuleburg Sams.

Chapter Attendance Awards for 2016

were: Apple Dumpling Gang, Camp Far West, El Dorado Sams, Gold Nugget Sams, Good Sam Mateans, Honey Do Sams, Lazy Daisy Sams, Lodi Senior Bells, Lucky Ones, Sacramento Rubber Bums, Tuleburg Sams, and Valley Cruisers.

WEB SIITE:

Ron Brown, Webmaster, explained why the NCGS website has been off for a period of time due to his moving and the logistics of technology, etc. He stated Bob McCutchen will be his back-up person. Ron stated the programs he has in place are his personal programs (regarding licensure, etc.) and has purchased them to set up the website. He explained the procedure for obtaining or purchasing the program software. Discussion regarding procedures for purchasing software, uploading and general constraints for licensure of programs took place.

OLD BUSINESS:

The issue of "Chapter of the Year" was again discussed. It has been decided to reinstate this program and the rules were presented by Darci and are printed in each President's Packet for their chapters. This includes the rules for earning points, additional Chapter Rewards, and Chapter of the Year Tie Breaker. Discussion regarding rules for Chapters gaining new members (such as a GS member transfers to another Chapter because of a dechartering of their chapter) took place. A motion was made for any member new to a different chapter would be considered a new member, by George Hatfield, seconded by Homer Hoglund and carried.

The issue of a different venue was again discussed. A change at this time would be cost prohibitive. Because our attendance has been low over the past few years, Wayne stated there are enough sites within the fenced area (not the "back 40") for all attendees wishing to have electric and water hook ups. The area of concern was if chapters wished to be in a group, they would have to come in as a group and brought in the "back 40" gait to be staged for parking.

It has been decided to change the routine of entering the Festival Grounds. All workers will come through the West Gate and all others will enter through the East Gate ("back 40") and be staged for parking sites. A question of what amperage of power (30 or 50 amp) was available. Wayne stated most sites are 50 amp.

Discussion was held regarding getting sponsors to off-set some of our costs. Consideration of sponsors for donating costs for golf carts or for the Ice Cream Social in exchange for advertisements of their business. to Contact Walt Luihn for any suggestions of sponsors.

If any chapters or member knows of a possible vendor at our Rally, please contact our new Vendor Chair, Cricket Weight.

Ken Ginoulis spoke on the values of chapter participation in our Rally Carnival. Activities are fun and all proceeds gained from their booth would belong to their chapter. Activities could be games such as ball toss, cake walk, etc. and foods (i.e. pies, tacos, hot dogs, etc.) Any chapter interested in participating is to call Marilee Ginoulis at (209) 333-1302.

It was suggested by Bill Stigman, the commercial vendors should close before the Carnival begins at 5 pm.

Wayne again reminded the Chapters to please send in their chapter campout schedule to him as well as to their Assistant Director of their areas if they have not yet done so.

NEW BUSINESS:

Wayne sadly announced the dechartering of several chapters due to various reasons. These are: Honey Do Chapter, Lodi Senior Bells, Redwood GS, Big Valley GS, Diablo Bounders, GS Camping Buddies.

Wayne discussed the issues of losing the chapters which includes low membership, and the lack of volunteers for positions in their chapters. He stated that there were no rules regarding the formation or having a chapter officer but helpful would be to have a trail boss and a treasurer.

Hopefully this information would be taken into consideration if a chapter is struggling to stay active.







