From the Directors Desk

Greetings to All,

It is hard to try and write a positive letter to reach out to each of you because of the CoVid-19 virus that has us all cowering down in our shelters in fear of becoming infected with this disease, and taking all of the prescribed precautions in an effort to avoid the virus and remain healthy. The virus has us all in a negative mind-set, and we are becoming very anxious and weary as we wait this thing out.

Okay, enough of negativity. Let's all start looking forward with a positive attitude about the great days that lay ahead. Be assured that there will be a bright rainbow at the end of this tunnel. We will be able to re-connect with family and friends, become involved with our favorite activities, and best of all...we can all get the cobwebs off the rigs, get them prepped, and start camping again. I am trying to be optimistic that this will all come to fruition, much sooner than later. Speaking of prepping our rigs, I want to share a problem that some of you may encounter just as I did.

I was sitting at home and thought about my rig just sitting in the storage area and to-tally idle. It came to me that I should go and check the batteries and be sure that they are fully charged. Well, of course, to my dismay, I found that the batteries were run down and needed to be charged. I was able to add power to the rig for a few hours, and then I returned to the rig some days later and found that the batteries were still discharged. My rig is only four years old, but that is about the magic age when the batteries can become problematic. So, new batteries are on my agenda. Now that I shared my tale of woe, I suggest that you check your batteries to be sure that they are in good operating condition so that you do not have a problem before or during your next camp out. While you are at it, check or replace your smoke and carbon dioxide detector batteries, and check your fire extinguishers, etc.

As you may recall, we eliminated one State Committee Meeting a year ago in a cost saving move. The SCM's are now to be held twice a year, once in conjunction with the annual Rally, normally in April/May, and the other in either September or October. Since this years Rally had to be canceled, we will only have one SCM, and hopefully we will hold it with the October Rally. This is important because we need to hold an election for the State Director position. I will be stepping down after 6 years and we need someone to step up. I ask that you all consider becoming our next State Director.

The nominations for Volunteer of the Year for 2019 were received in a timely fashion, they were reviewed, and the committee has made a decision on who should be the recipient of the award. The winner will be announced during the annual Rally.

Speaking of the annual Rally, yes, we are in a go mode for the Rally to be held October 22 -24, 2020, at the venue of Casa de Fruta RV Resort We were fortunate to keep all of the providers on-board with the new date, and all of the other preparations are nearly complete. We are very excited to have a new caterer for our dinner banquet, and great entertainment. We will try and hold a final staff meeting in late September to tie off any loose ends, and we are looking forward to staging the best Rally ever. The staff and I are doing our part to try and keep the Rally alive for this year. You can help by adhering to the health guidelines set forth by our government officials to keep safe and healthy. By doing so, hopefully we can, and will, get past this virus situation very soon and thereby we should not have any worries about attending an event that will have a large number of people in attendance. We ask all wagon masters to

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schedule their chapter camp out in October to be held during the Rally at Casa de Fruta RV Resort. Please remember, that the Rally is an event that is staged for the chapters and their members. It is for you, please consider attending this fun event.

Lastly, there are some of you that have heard rumors that the Good Sam organization is in its dying throes, and that it will be gone as we know it, very soon. I will try my best to enlighten you as to the current status of the Good Sam organization and its future. I will do this here, chronologically, and summarize the best that I can.

On March 11, 2020, all State/Provincial Directors received a letter from our Good Sam support person, Olivia Sisk. The letter simply indicated that the corporate office had no directive in place about how the Directors should hold their events, (Rallies), in relation to the Corona virus, but to use our best judgement. On March 16, 2020, we received an update letter from Good Sam support, advising of the CDC guidelines about the virus and to continue to use our best judgement about hosting any events. Then on March 20, 2020, we received a letter from GS support and this letter indicated that the Director program has been put on hold, 'paused', until further notice. This letter was gleaned by a company named RV Travel, who indicated from their view point that Good Sam was going to become defunct. Obviously, their printed article caused a lot of concern amongst some of our members who read this publication. Let me just say this, that the letter from GS support **did not** say that Good Sam was finished. It was intended to instruct the Directors not to continue any activities within their State/Province until further notice. It was meant to be related to the CoVid-19 virus pandemic. Several Directors contacted Good Sam inquiring if this is the end of the Good Sam Club. There was no direct response to these inquiries, however, most State/Province Directors wrote that they believed that these letters from GS support were only sent as a way to let us know that they do not want any activity from State/Province chapters due to the virus situation. On March 29, 2020, we were sent a 'survey' from Good Sam support asking for the Directors input in relation to the Director's program. We were instructed to complete the survey by May 8, 2020. There has been no indication about the 'why' that this survey was sent. However, I can relate that the responses were very candid and to the point about Good Sam in general. Mainly, the seemingly lack of support from Good Sam in many areas and especially pertaining to the lack of substantial support for the Rallies. This also relates to the lack of communication from Good Sam to the Directors and the lack of support because of a discontinuation of the Regional Directors program. There has been a noticed dislike by the Directors of Camping World's apparent non-participation at State Rallies, as well as non-participation by Good Sam. The Directors believe that there should be more incentives to being a Good Sam member, and the inability of Good Sam to assist the States in their efforts to try to increase their memberships.

The above has been shared with all of you in a manner to be transparent and to keep all members aware of the current situation concerning the Good Sam Director's program and as it relates to the chapters. As it stands, it appears as though Good Sam recognizes that there is a problem within the organization, and is asking for input on how to improve the Director's program. The belief that the Director's program was 'paused' is so that Director's, as a whole, will not try to entertain events during the virus situation, and for no other reason. As this plays out, I will go back to our email communication to keep all of you abreast of the current situation within Good Sam as it unfolds. Above all, and very important, I ask that each of you to not panic, or to not try to read into this situation with Good Sam and thereby attempt to make it into something that it is not. We are all in this together, so let's take the wait and see position for now.

Tuleburg Sams (Stockton, CA)

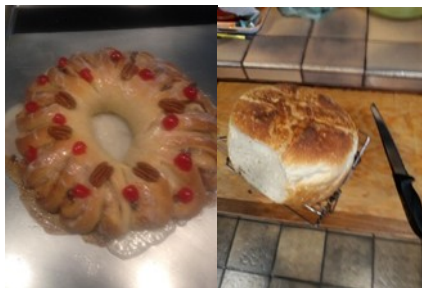
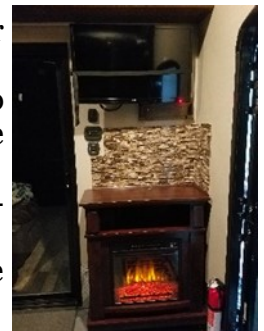
Before and Because of Covid-19:
