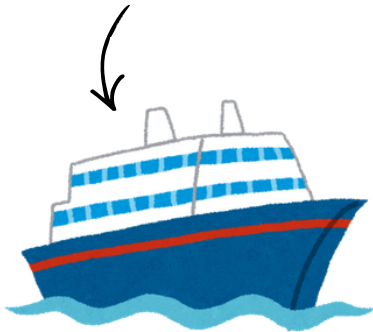

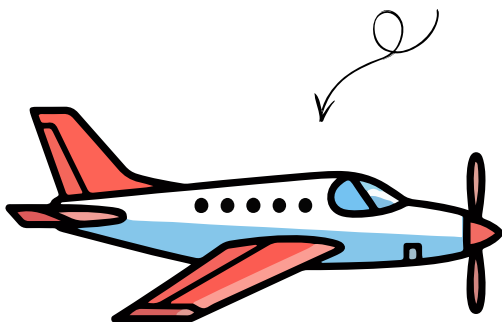

Santorini

Days 1–3 · 3 Nights

Iconic caldera sunsets, blue-domed churches, volcanic beaches, wine tasting in clifftop villages, and the magic of Oia at golden hour.



Naxos

Days 5–8 · 4 Nights

The authentic heart of the Cyclades—lush valleys, ancient temples, endless sandy beaches, mountain villages, and the iconic Portara at sunset.

Paros

Days 9–11 • 3 Nights

Laid-back Cycladic charm, golden beaches, traditional fishing villages, Naoussa nightlife, and the marble quarries of antiquity.



Athens

Days 12–14 • 3 Nights

The Acropolis, Plaka neighborhood, world-class museums, vibrant food scene, and a no-stress departure from the mainland.

Why This Route Works

A first trip to Greece can get exhausting fast if you try to squeeze in too many islands. This route gives you variety without spending half your vacation packing, checking out, and sitting in ports.

- **Start with the islands.**

You arrive ready for the fun part — sea views, villages, beaches, and that first real “I’m in Greece” feeling.

- **Slow the pace down.**

Three to four nights in each destination gives you enough time to actually enjoy where you are instead of constantly moving.

- **Mix iconic with authentic.**

Santorini gives you the famous Greece experience, while Naxos and Paros add a more relaxed island feel.

- **Save Athens for last.**

You finish on the mainland, which means less stress before your international flight home.

- **The goal:**

See a lot of Greece without feeling like you raced through it.

A Few Things I Wish Everyone Knew Before Greece

- **Book flights and hotels first.**

Ferry schedules are usually released later than airline and hotel availability, so don't panic if you can't book every ferry far in advance. Once schedules are published, book the important island connections you know you'll need.

- **Bring some euros with you.**

It's helpful to arrive with cash for small purchases, tips, taxis, or places that may not take cards. If you need more cash in Greece, use a bank ATM, not a stand-alone tourist ATM, whenever possible.

- **Always choose local currency.**

When an ATM or credit card terminal asks whether you want the charge converted to dollars, choose euros / local currency and decline the offered conversion.

- **Use the right credit card.**

Bring cards with no foreign transaction fees, and make sure your bank knows your travel dates so your card isn't unexpectedly declined.

- **Pack as light as possible.**

Ferries, stairs, cobblestone streets, rental cars, and taxis are all much easier with less luggage. Large suitcases can become a real hassle very quickly.

- **Think about transfers before you arrive.**

Know how you're getting from the airport or ferry port to your hotel before travel day. It makes arrival much less stressful, especially after a long flight or ferry ride.
