A Sacred Passing

A Sacred Passing's mission is to guide and assist people towards a more conscious dying experience while honoring individual autonomy. In the community, we work to actively dismantle systems of oppression as they present in death and dying through education, care, and advocacy.

ASP offers death and dying education to individuals, community associations, and medical organizations. Our organization educates, collaborates, and shares ways to be supportive nonmedical companions.

The organization's work in community is possible with the super skills of many people and groups, primarily living in traditional Duwamish and Coast Salish land (Seattle, WA).

Together we work in the community to create and sustain authentic partnerships in death care through consent, inclusivity, and active interruption of oppression. As an organization, we center Queer, Trans, Black, and Indigenous people's voices, and those systematically oppressed, as do the people we contract with.

DEATH CARE 8-WEEK COURSE

SEPTEMBER 12TH - NOVEMBER 2ND, 2022

Death Care Training is for new and experienced doulas, caretakers, and death workers to learn and broaden their practices to include end-of-life and death care skills. Together engage in comprehensive lessons and discussions surrounding histories and cultures of death care in the United States, highlighting themes of choice, access, oppression, and liberation in death care. All will practice grief care together through artwork, poetry, games, and a two part living funeral ceremony.

Course Topics Include:

- Media Literacy & Death Terminology
- Practice Consent & Non-medical Support
- Practical Skills for Support & Care in Endof-Life and Death
- Share Understandings of Access for Dying People & their Care Network
- Articulate the Role of Lineage and Tradition in Companionship
- Define and Explore Archetypes, including Dominant Cultural Norms
- Advocate for Choices, Options, and Informed-Consent in Death Care

ASP's unique curriculum is offered by a crew of educators and caretakers committed to working toward death care justice. Facilitators, guest teachers, and students learn in cohort with a shared intention to create learning space which is well resourced, shared space for dialogue, and curated for relationship building, understanding, and engagement.



SHROUDING & BODY WASHING

AUGUST 15TH & 16TH, 2022

This is a hands on training in which participants learn how to wash, shroud, and move the body of a person who has died. Join ASP to learn and practice how to shroud a body in preparation for a wake, funeral, celebration or disposition.

Course Topics Include:

- History of Shrouding & Body Washing
- Signs from Dying Person when Death is Near
- Common Requests
- Forms & Paperwork
- Materials & Resources for Care
- What Support Person's Might Say
- Shrouding & Washing a Body (Home Care)
- Shrouding & Washing a Body (Funeral Service)

This workshop is open to all death caretakers, such as physicians, funeral directors, midwives, doulas and any professional that works with dying people in any capacity; hosted in-person in Duwamish & Coast Salish land, Seattle, WA.



ABORTION CARE 6-WEEK COURSE

AUTUMN 2022

ASP Abortion Care Training offers evidence-based, cultural, socio-historical, and compassionate education on the topic of pregnancy and death, whether there is birth, miscarriage, stillbirth, fetal anomaly, or abortion.

Course Topics Include:

- Body Sovereignty & Somatic Support
- Legal & Historical Landscape
- Barriers to Access
- Medical Process of Abortion
- Herbal Process of Abortion
- Spiritual & Religious Abortion Care
- Community Storytelling & Listening
- Practical Nonmedical Support Skills
- Conflict Holding & Deescalation

Together with Shout Your Abortion, Full-spectrum Doulas, Cedar River Clinic, The Order of Good Death, Sabia Wade, The Womb Room, and Abortion Herbalist, join ASP facilitators to uplift choices and reflect on informed-consent, creating a learning space for dialogue, relationship building, understanding, and engagement.

ASP Abortion Care Training is created to support any person who wants to learn more about support techniques and options available related to choice. The curriculum is accessible online, in-person (eventually), and portions downloadable at no charge. Live, guided lessons and curriculum are offered to both individuals and community groups with reduced-tuition opportunities available as scheduled.


