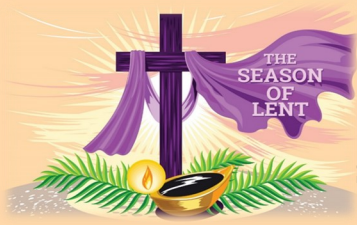

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT

It is hard to believe, but the Season of Lent begins in just a few days with Ash Wednesday fast approaching. I pray Lent is a time of renewal for you, your family, and our parish family. The “forty (40) days” of Lent is much more than a calculation of time between Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday. In the Bible, numbers often have a symbolic meaning, and the number “forty” represents a time of testing and preparation for a future mission taken on for God. For example, in the Book of Exodus, the Israelites wandered forty days in the desert before reaching the promised land. In the Gospels, Jesus went into the desert for forty days and was tempted by the devil before returning and beginning his new public life and ministry. That is what Lent is for us: a time of preparation and testing leading to our new life with Christ at Easter. I pray the Lenten Season is meaningful for you. 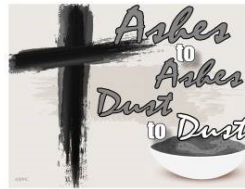

Black History Month: On the Road to Sainthood: Leaders of African Descent

Venerable Henriette Delille (1813-1862) was born in New Orleans, Louisiana, where she would live her entire life. For the love of Jesus and responding to the Gospel's mandate, she was determined to help those in need. Henriette was also a person who suffered as she made her way through life, and she bore many crosses. She taught those around her that sanctity can be attained in following the path of Jesus. It was in this manner that she dealt with her troubles and major obstacles to achieve her goals. Some of the troubles Henriette met were the resistance of the ruling population to the idea of a black religious congregation; the lack of finances to do the work; the taunts and disbelief of people in her mission; the lack of support from both the Church and civil authority; and poor health. However, Henriette practiced heroic virtue. She had faith, lived in hope, and practiced love. She was compassionate, forgiving, and merciful. She believed in justice and was not afraid to do what was right in the eyes of God. God blessed her efforts and, in 1842, she founded the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family. Henriette died 20 years later on November 17, 1862. Her funeral was held at St. Augustine Church. Her obituary stated, "... Miss Henriette Delille had for long years consecrated herself totally to God without reservation to the instruction of the ignorant and principally to the slave."



Venerable Augustus Tolton (1854-1897) was the first U.S. Roman Catholic priest publicly known to be black when he was ordained in 1886. A former slave who was baptized and reared Catholic, Tolton formally studied in Rome. He was ordained in Rome on Easter Sunday at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran. Fr. Tolton led the development and construction of St. Monica's Catholic Church as a black "National Parish Church", which was completed in 1893. Tolton's success at ministering to black Catholics quickly earned him national attention within the Catholic hierarchy. "Good Father Gus," as many called him, was known for his eloquent sermons, his beautiful singing voice, and his talent for playing the accordion. He is the subject of the 1973 biography from Slave to Priest by Sister Caroline Hemesath.

EL TEMPORADA SANTO DE CUARESMA

Es difícil de creer, pero la Temporada de Cuaresma comienza en tan solo unos días y el Miércoles de Ceniza se acerca rápidamente. Ruego que la Cuaresma sea un tiempo de renovación para usted, su familia y nuestra familia parroquial. Los “cuarenta (40) días” de Cuaresma son mucho más que un cálculo del tiempo entre el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Domingo de Ramos. En la Biblia, los números suelen tener un significado simbólico, y el número “cuarenta” representa un tiempo de prueba y preparación para una futura misión asumida por Dios. Por ejemplo, en el Libro del Éxodo, los Israelitas vagaron cuarenta días por el desierto antes de llegar a la tierra prometida. En los Evangelios, Jesús fue al desierto durante cuarenta días y fue tentado por el diablo antes de regresar y comenzar su nueva vida pública y ministerio. Eso es lo que es la Cuaresma para nosotros: un tiempo de preparación y prueba que nos lleva a nuestra nueva vida con Cristo en la Pascua. Oro para que la Temporada de Cuaresma sea significativa para usted. A continuación se muestra nuestro horario de Miércoles de Ceniza y Devoción.

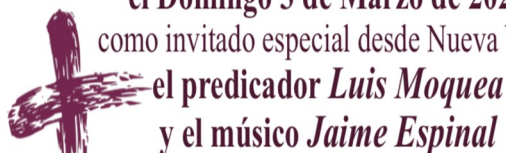
