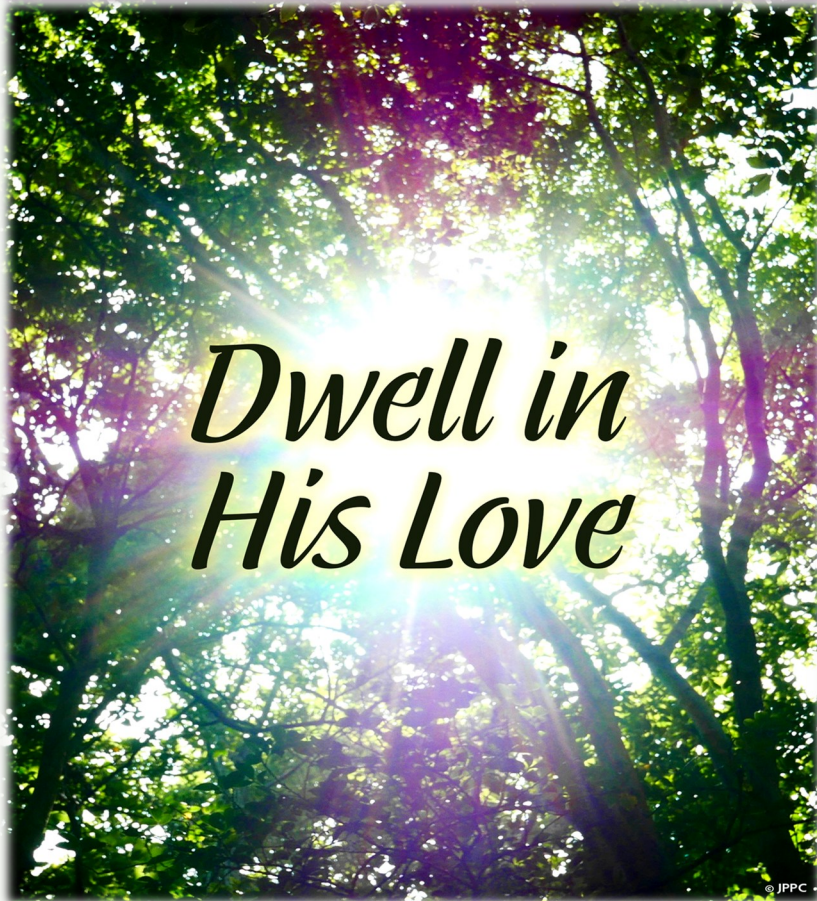

We Continue the Mission of the Early Church

During Easter Season we read The Acts of the Apostles at Mass. The Acts of the Apostles is the story of the early Church after the Death and Resurrection of Jesus. In this book, we read about Pentecost and the Coming of the Holy Spirit, the Conversion of St. Paul, St. Stephen the first martyr, and the work of St. Peter. As you read The Acts of the Apostles, Saints Peter and Paul emerge as leaders of the early Church, but the real force behind the work of the early Church is the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel today, Jesus says: "I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." (John 14:23-29) The good news is that the Holy Spirit, the gift of Jesus to us after the Resurrection - is still the power source of the Church today. We saw the action of the Holy Spirit in the election of Pope Leo as our new Pope. Who would have thought a man from Chicago would lead our Church?

As a parish family, we pray for Pope Leo and we continue the mission of the early church as we proclaim the Gospel and share the Good News that Jesus is risen. *"Indeed He is Risen."* The Acts of the Apostles continues with us. 1:00 p.m. – Procession with the Blessed Sacrament begins at Sacred Heart Church & continues down Broadway Ave.

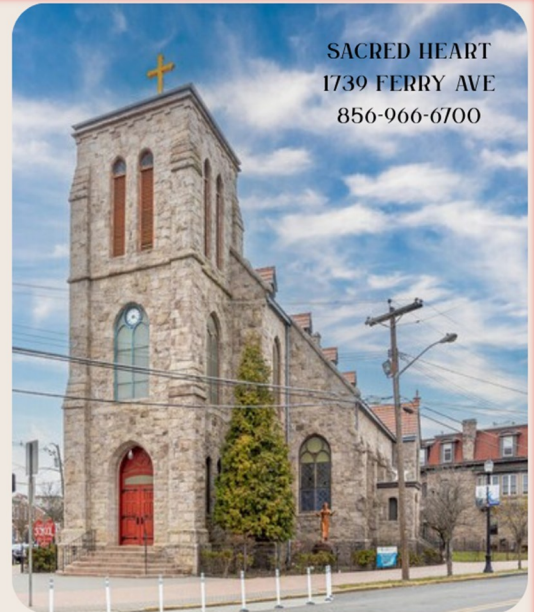
1:40 p.m. - Approximate Arrival at The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception for a brief time of Adoration & Prayer

2:00 p.m. - Depart from the Cathedral & continue up Federal Street

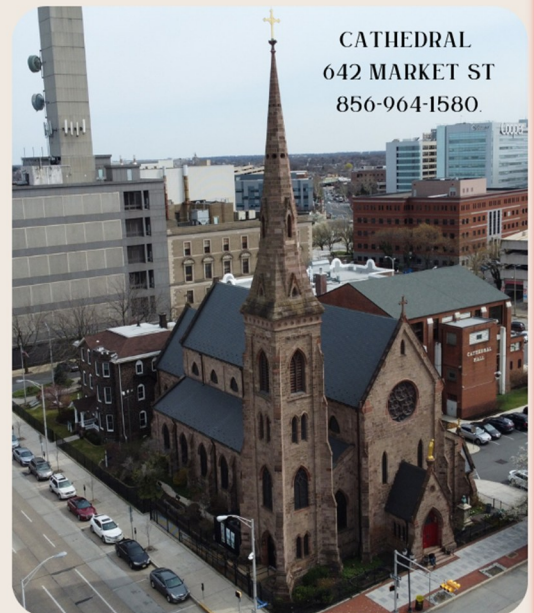
3:00 p.m. - Approximate arrival at St. Joseph Pro-Cathedral for final Benediction

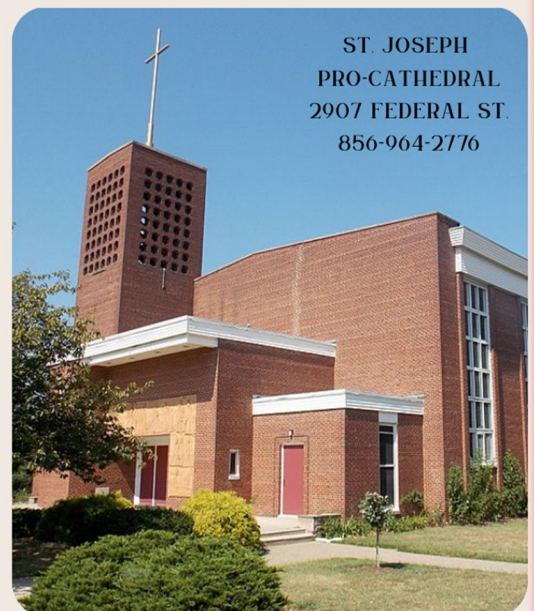

CONTINUAMOS LA MISIÓN DE LA IGLESIA PRIMITIVA

Durante la Pascua, leemos los Hechos de los Apóstoles en la misa. Los Hechos de los Apóstoles narran la historia del comienzo de la Iglesia tras la muerte y resurrección de Jesús. En este libro, leemos sobre Pentecostés y la venida del Espíritu Santo, la conversión de San Pablo, San Esteban, el primer mártir, y la obra de San Pedro. Al leer los Hechos de los Apóstoles, San Pedro y San Pablo emergen como líderes de la Iglesia primitiva, pero la verdadera fuerza detrás de la obra de la Iglesia primitiva es el Espíritu Santo.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús dice: “Les he dicho esto mientras estoy con ustedes. El

Paráclito, el Espíritu Santo, a quien el Padre enviará en mi nombre, les enseñará todo y les recordará todo lo que les he dicho”. Como familia Parroquial, oramos por el Papa León XIV y continuamos la misión de la Iglesia del tiempo de antes al proclamar el Evangelio y compartir la Buena Nueva de que Jesús ha resucitado. “En Verdad, Ha Resucitado”. Los Hechos de los Apóstoles continúan con nosotros. El Espíritu Santo está con nosotros. Ruegale al Espíritu Santo la sabiduría y la valentía para vivir y compartir tu fe.
