# Corner

## The Beatitudes of Jesus in the Gospel of Luke

This liturgical year, we will hear proclaimed the Gospel of St. Luke on most Sundays. The next three weeks, we hear proclaimed Chapter 6 of Luke's Gospel. I encourage you to read Luke Chapter 6 at home. It is called "The Sermon on the Plain," and it is very similar to the Sermon on the Mount we read in the Gospel of Matthew. Both Luke and Matthew begin the sermon of Jesus with a series of Beatitudes. But there is difference.

In Matthew, Jesus is on a mountain, he is the great teacher, like Moses in Mt. Sinai. In Luke, Jesus is on a level plain, he mingles among the people. Disciples and non-disciples, rich and poor, the sick and the healthy. In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus says, Blessed are the poor in spirit. But not in Luke. No, in Luke Jesus says: *Blessed are you who are poor; Blessed are you who weep; Blessed are you who are hungry.* Jesus is cautioning us that there is a hidden danger in wealth and possessions. The prophet Jeremiah this weekend says: "Blessed is the person who trusts in the Lord. Whose hope is in the Lord."

Dear friends, if we seek true joy, strength, from wealth or honors, or popularity we will be disappointed. We will be like that barren bush in the desert. With no real support, with no life. There is a hidden danger. Wealth, honor, popularity, and health can fade quickly and do not last forever. On the other hand, many who face poverty or illness, or even disgrace, know that true happiness, true blessedness, comes from the Lord. When things fall apart, they realize that the real anchor of their lives is not material – but spiritual. Listen to Jesus and Jeremiah. Place your trust and your hope in the Lord.

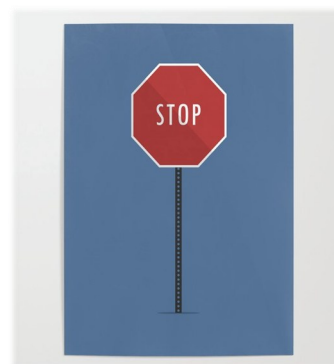

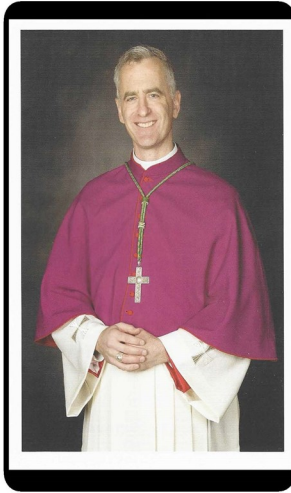

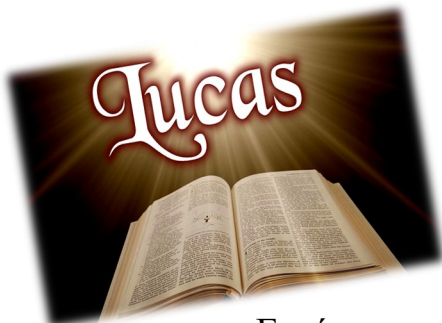
## Las Bienaventuranzas de Jesús en el Evangelio de Lucas

Este año litúrgico, escucharemos proclamar el Evangelio de San Lucas la mayoría de los domingos. Las próximas tres semanas, escucharemos proclamar el capítulo 6 del Evangelio de Lucas. Te animo a leer el capítulo 6 de Lucas en casa. Se llama “El Sermón de la Llanura”, y es muy similar al Sermón de la Montaña que leemos en el Evangelio de Mateo. Tanto Lucas como Mateo comienzan el sermón de Jesús con una serie de Bienaventuranzas. Pero hay una diferencia.

En Mateo, Jesús está en una montaña, es el gran maestro, como Moisés en el Monte Sinaí. En Lucas, Jesús está en una llanura, se mezcla entre la gente. Discípulos y no discípulos, ricos y pobres, enfermos y sanos. En el Evangelio de Mateo Jesús dice: Bienaventurados los pobres de espíritu. Pero no en Lucas. No, en Lucas Jesús dice: Bienaventurados los pobres; Bienaventurados los que lloran; Bienaventurados los que tienen hambre. Jesús nos advierte que hay un peligro oculto en la riqueza y las posesiones. El profeta Jeremías dice este fin de semana: “Bienaventurado el hombre que confía en el Señor, cuya esperanza está en el Señor”.

Queridos amigos, si buscamos la verdadera alegría, la fuerza, en la riqueza, los honores o la popularidad, nos decepcionaremos. Seremos como ese arbusto estéril en el desierto. Sin un apoyo real, sin vida. Hay un peligro oculto. La riqueza, el honor, la popularidad y la salud pueden desvanecerse rápidamente y no duran para siempre. Por otro lado, muchos que enfrentan la pobreza o la enfermedad, o incluso la desgracia, saben que la verdadera felicidad, la verdadera bendición, viene del Señor. Cuando las cosas se desmoronan, se dan cuenta de que el verdadero ancla de sus vidas no es material, sino espiritual. Escuchen a Jesús y a Jeremías. Depositen su confianza y su esperanza en el Señor.

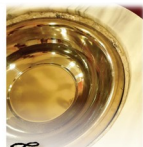
