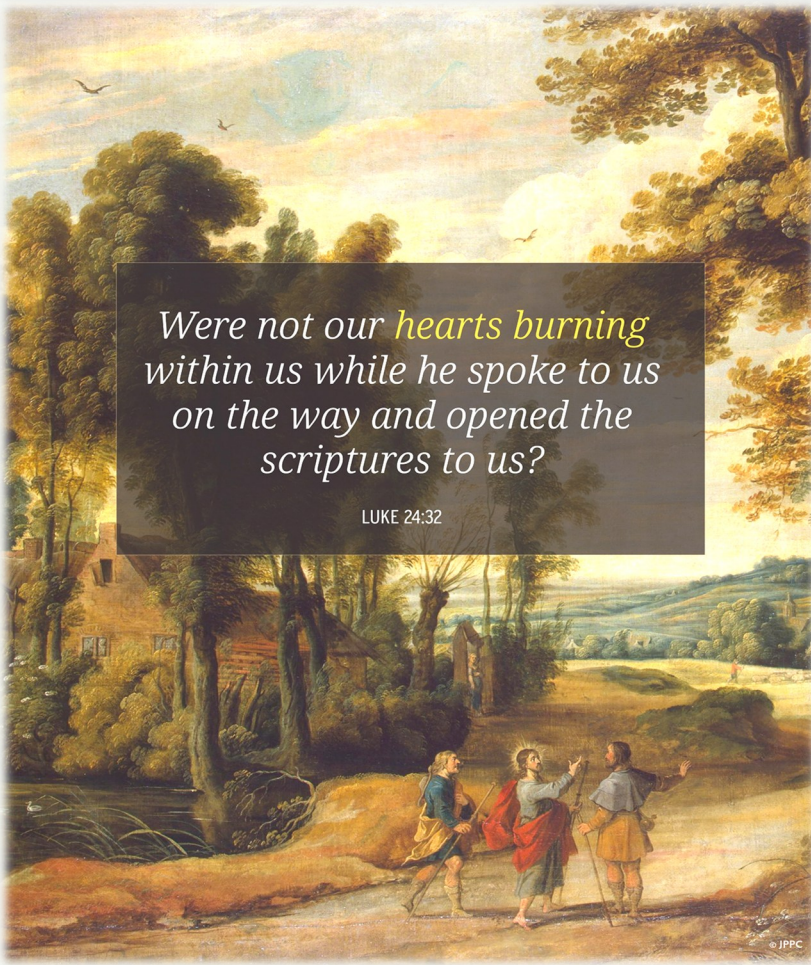

Pastor's Corner

“Were not our hearts burning within us...?” (Luke 24:32)

This Sunday, we hear the beautiful and familiar story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13–35). Two disciples, weighed down by disappointment and confusion, are leaving Jerusalem. Their hopes seem lost. Their hearts are heavy. And yet, in the midst of their sorrow, Jesus draws near—though they do not recognize Him.

How often this is our own experience. We walk our own roads—burdened by uncertainty, change, or even discouragement—and we wonder where God is in the midst of it all. Like those first disciples, we can be so focused on what we have lost, or what has changed, that we fail to see that Jesus is already walking beside us. The Gospel reminds us of a powerful truth: the Risen Lord is present, even when we do not expect Him, even when we do not recognize Him. It is only in the breaking of the bread that their eyes are opened.

Here at Sacred Heart in Camden, we find ourselves walking a kind of “Emmaus road” together. The “Road to Emmaus” Gospel invites us to look with the eyes of faith and find Jesus in unexpected places. In the elderly and homebound, the addicted walking the streets, in our school children, at Joe’s Place, St. Bart’s Soup Kitchen, the Thrift Store, and the hungry person knocking on our rectory office door. The disciples did not recognize Jesus at first, but then, in the Breaking of the Bread and the opening of God’s Word, their heart were open. The story of Emmaus does not end in disappointment—it ends in mission. Once they recognized Jesus, the disciples returned to Jerusalem with renewed faith and joy. They go back, not as they were, but transformed. That is our call as well. May our eyes be opened.

May our hearts burn with renewed faith. And may we recognize Him in our midst, especially in unexpected places.

“¿ACASO NO ARDÍA NUESTRO CORAZÓN DENTRO DE NOSOTROS...?” (Lucas 24:32)

Este Domingo escuchamos la hermosa y familiar historia de los discípulos en el camino a Emaús (Lucas 24:13–35). Dos discípulos, agobiados por la decepción y la confusión, abandonan Jerusalén. Sus esperanzas parecen perdidas. Sus corazones están apesadumbrados. Y, sin embargo, en medio de su tristeza, Jesús se acerca, aunque ellos no lo reconocen.

¡Cuántas veces esta es también nuestra propia experiencia! Recorremos nuestros propios caminos —cargados de incertidumbre, cambios o incluso desánimo— y nos preguntamos dónde está Dios en medio de todo ello. Al igual que aquellos primeros discípulos, podemos estar tan centrados en lo que hemos perdido, o en lo que ha cambiado, que no logramos ver que Jesús ya camina a nuestro lado. El Evangelio nos recuerda una verdad poderosa: el Señor Resucitado está presente, incluso cuando no lo esperamos, incluso cuando no lo reconocemos. Es solo en la fracción del pan que se les abren los ojos.

Aquí, en el Sagrado Corazón en Camden, nos encontramos recorriendo juntos una especie de “Camino a Emaús”. El Evangelio del «Camino a Emaús» nos invita a mirar con los ojos de la fe y a encontrar a Jesús en lugares inesperados: en los ancianos y los enfermos que no pueden salir de casa, en los adictos que deambulan por las calles, en nuestros niños de la escuela, en Joe’s Place, en el comedor social de St. Bart, en la tienda de segunda mano y en la persona hambrienta que llama a la puerta de nuestra oficina parroquial. Al principio, los discípulos no reconocieron a Jesús; pero luego, en la fracción del pan y en la apertura a la Palabra de Dios, sus corazones se abrieron. La historia de Emaús no termina en decepción; termina en misión. Una vez que reconocieron a Jesús, los discípulos regresaron a Jerusalén con fe y alegría renovadas. Regresan, no como eran antes, sino transformados. Ese es también nuestro llamado. Que se nos abran los ojos.

Que nuestros corazones ardan con una fe renovada. Y que lo reconozcamos en medio de nosotros, especialmente en lugares inesperados.
