## Happy Anniversary!

Whose anniversary is it? It's OURS!

How can it be August already? And . . . how can it be that we have shared a whole year in ministry together? Did it go fast for you too? You know what they say, "Time flies when you're having fun." Are we having fun together? Ministry is work, but it doesn't have to be all work and no play. Dr. Stuart Brown, the founder of the National Institute for Play, suggests we are built to play, and we are built through play. In other words, God creates us to play, and God strengthens us through play. According to Dr. Brown, "The drive to play is as fundamental as our drives for food and sleep." Playing energizes us, lifts

us out of the mundane, eases our burdens, renews our optimism, and opens us to new possibilities. Whatever our age, we are never too young or too old to play. Play stimulates our brains for learning, growing, and creating.

I've also heard it said, "A family that prays together stays together." I wonder, is this also true for a congregation? And . . . might it also be said and true, "A congregation that plays together stays together?" Are work and play mutually exclusive or can they happen simultaneously? When is ministry work? When is ministry play? When does work become play? When does play become work?

When I served in Jesup and Denver the children served as my assisting ministers in worship. Every week at the close of worship the children were excited to dismiss the congregation saying, "Go in peace. Serve the Lord." The congregation responded, "Thanks be to God." The children enthusiastically said, "And have fun doing it!" And the congregation responded with spirit, "We will!"

The first year of ministry together may be compared to a courtship. Brought together by the Holy Spirit, we could say our relationship was arranged by God. In our first year of ministry together we have devoted much time getting to know each other and building trust. We rolled up our sleeves and worked side by side. We laughed together and cried together. We continue to grow our relationship as we work and play together.



I remember how you wore nametags to help me learn your names. How wonderful it is to know and call each of you by name. It is with a sense of excitement, joy, and hope that I look forward to sharing another year of ministry with you, working and playing together in Jesus' name. I am so thankful for each of you. I am so blessed!

## **Council Corner**

Holy Redeemer's Council met on Thursday, July 11. Here are a few highlights from their printed reports and meeting minutes:

Finances: While we are not currently meeting our monthly budget, a big **thank you** must go out to the congregation as giving for June was up 13% over last year and total giving for the year is up 18% over last year. That said, we did not meet our monthly goal of \$15,317. We had a **general fund shortage of \$3,655** and a **building fund shortage of \$471** for a total shortage of \$4,126. This puts year-to-date giving at \$9,894 below budget in the general fund and \$3,871 short in the building fund. \$2,623 was moved from the contingency fund, leaving a balance is \$19,663. Our end of June mortgage balance was \$263,977.

**Old Business Topics:** Under the heading of old business, council discussed a raffle license, live streaming, teams, parking lot, back door alarm, and October training for financial secretary/treasurer. [After the meeting, the raffle license application was mailed Saturday, July 20.]

**New Business Topics:** It was decided to contact Affordable Pro (Dave Hernandez) to handle current and future flat roof repairs.

The next council meeting is scheduled for **Thursday**, **August 8**, **2024** at **7:00** pm.


## **Blood Drive Recap**


