Pastor's Corner



Dearest Church Family:

I wanted to keep you in the loop about my Doctorate of Ministry program in Pittsburgh. The classes were Discernment (Dr. Oden) and Race, Scripture and Response (Dr. Kaalund).

Nouwen defines discernment as follows: "Discernment is a spiritual understanding and an experimental knowledge of how God is active in daily life that is acquired through discipline's spiritual practice. Discernment is faithful living and listening to God's love and direction so that we can fulfill our individual calling and shared mission" (3).1

For the next three weeks, we are to do what is called an Examen. I wanted to give you the outline, for you to practice too. Looking over the last six days, ask yourself these five questions:

- 1. What bubbled up for you this week and got your attention?
- 2. When did you feel alive, most yourself, or energized?
- 3. When did you feel deadened or drained?
- 4. What did you discover about yourself?
- 5. What might God be showing you as you go forward? Do you sense any holy invitations?

Dr. Kaalund told us to "feel comfortable getting it wrong." I appreciated this reminder that the work we do is messy. We all have "blind spots in awareness, but we can relax knowing God's revelation will occur." Without engaging with our assumptions, we perpetuate not only marginalization (insiders and outsiders), but an understanding that they need us. We are not the Savior in this story; that is Jesus. Part of our work is to de-couple the assumptions we hold from the work God has called us to do.

We were encouraged and taught to do communal reading of the text. Practicing this together as a community reminds us, helps us to see the possibilities of the text when we don't privilege a lens and are honest in our approach. Asking, "Who is centered in this story and why? Who is centered in my research and why? Who is not present? Who is excluded?" As part of my homework, we will need to do this together. The scripture we will focus on comes from Matthew 25, and I will lead this conversation during the Coffee Hour. It may take more than one week. I can't wait to do this work together.


The House of Concern
