Pastor's Corner



It occurred to me that I was accepted into a Doctor of Ministry Program, but I didn't explain what it means or, more importantly, what it means for us as a church.

This degree is meant to be done in a particular context; the coursework is in relationship to the work I do for the church. Therefore, it doesn't involve moving or leaving the church to become a full-time student. The hope is this will enhance what I do for the church.

The Doctor of Ministry Degree is generally a cohort-driven professional doctoral degree providing space for renewal, growth, companionship among peers, and rich dialogue with faculty. The purpose of the Doctor of Ministry Degree Program at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary is to engage the challenges, opportunities and vocation of ministry through a systematic and sustained curriculum involving disciplined study and reflection over a period of three to four years. The program is based on a cohort model that facilitates peer relationships and shared learning throughout the D.Min. journey. Classes meet in two-week blocks twice per year for 2.5 years. The doctoral project at the end of coursework is undertaken under the supervision of carefully selected faculty. The project provides an opportunity for candidates to explore in-depth an aspect of their ministry to which they seek to bring new insight, knowledge, and imagination.1

There are 12 of us in the program from a variety of states and denominations, though predominantly Presbyterian. For many of us it was the first time we had been students in 20 years. By the end of our two weeks together, we each had a starting Research Question, though we have been informed that this will change at least six more times. It has already changed twice.

The mission practice I intend to focus on is stewardship. My current draft of Research Question: What do the stories and practices of good stewardship say about our church identity in the surrounding community and the legacy we desire to leave?

I still have to define "good stewardship" and other ideas also need to be flushed out, but this is the start of this journey. While I will be doing the class work, reading, studying, etc., I will also need your input and help when the time comes, so thank you. Thank you for giving me the courage to bravely be me and become a student again after 20 years. Thank you for helping my family in this transition. Thank you for your support, it is a priceless gift for which I am grateful.

While the research doesn't start for two years, the work of ministry has never ended. Please feel free to ask me questions. Peace.

At its Thursday, June 23, 2022 Meeting, the Session:

- Received the May Financial Report for the church showing Income: \$12,795.96 (pledge & non-pledge, investments, plate offerings, memorials & rentals) and Expenses: \$31,554.77 (includes maintenance of all church buildings, payroll, capital improvements in Eastman Hall, Manse) and YTD Fundraising Income: \$3,539
- Received card of thanks from Ginny Konz for cards, flowers and prayers at the time of her surgery
- Heard report of Pastor's participation in Geneva Presbytery Congregational Vitality Committee and recommendation of book, *Autopsy of a Deceased Church*, by Thomas S. Rainer with copies available to Elders and interested others
- Moved to approve additional four weeks of Continuing Ed., (including two Sundays) leave for Pastor during doctoral program in Mission Leadership
- Learned of current project completion for manse insulation and of donation of Ping Pong table for manse attic (and of historical significance of the latter); and of back-ordered items for heat pumps to be installed in Eastman Hall and manse
- Was advised of energy-efficient window (manse basement) replacement scheduled for Fall, this year


