





At its June 15th meeting, [via Zoom Teleconferencing] the Session:

- Received the May budget report of \$6,349 Income and \$12,841 Expenses
- Was advised that Pledge and non-pledge income has been down, during the pandemic
- Heard notes of thanks from Kae Hoyle for flowers; Jean Morris for bulletins, newsletter, cards, prayers; Back Pack Program for volunteers and church monetary support
- Learned of new hire Laurie Weller to the position of church Office Manager
- Heard positive feedback for 'Communion Kits' delivered on June 6
- Discussed suggested guidelines from Geneva Presbytery for future re-opening of church buildings and in-person worship with consideration for elevator, rest room, seating, cleaning issues, among others
- Discussed possibility of location[s] and time[s] for outdoor worship
- Heard news that church parking lot and driveway paving is complete and contractor engaged to mark parking spaces; ceiling and drywall work in balcony closet underway; pigeon-screening and clean-up completed in steeple
- Heard plans and discussed rationale for conducting Rummage Sale in Fall 2020 or Spring 2021 Discussed church's participation in FaceBook, YouTube, Boost, and Instagram media
- Looked at estimates for replacing roof over church rear entrance and planned to seek additional estimates
- Formed a Task Force to work with Pastor in planning for re-opening the church; Elders Marc Smith, Jim Clark and Marion Crull have volunteered
