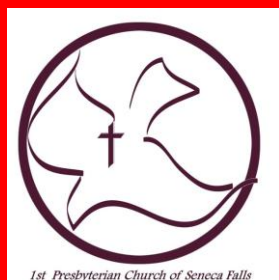

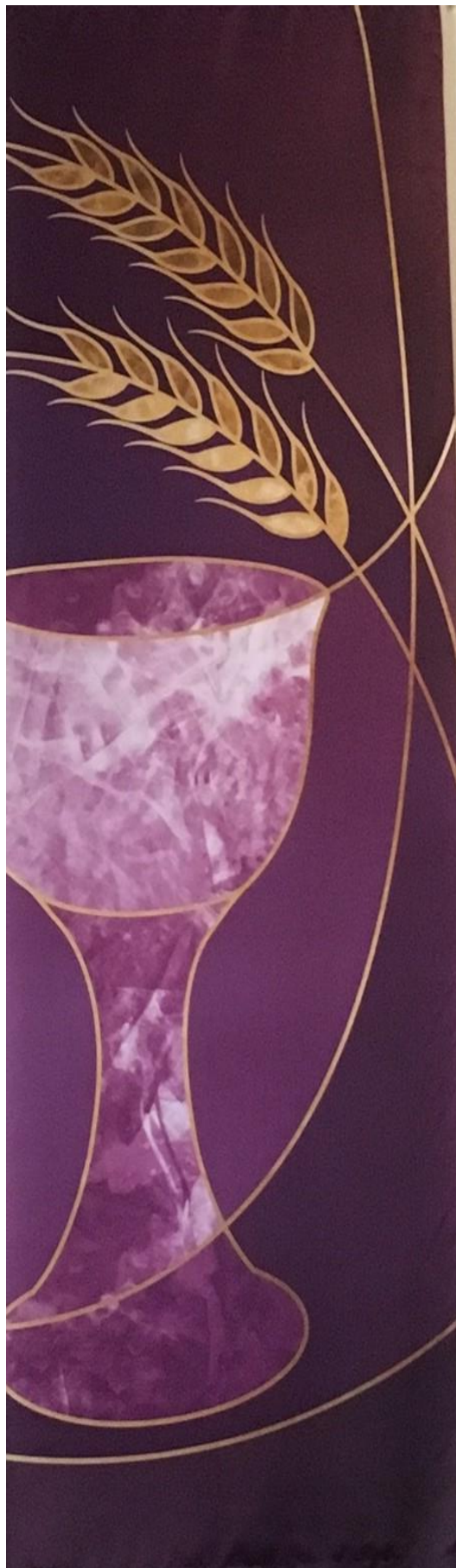

He signs your name in His book, your policy's fully paid.*

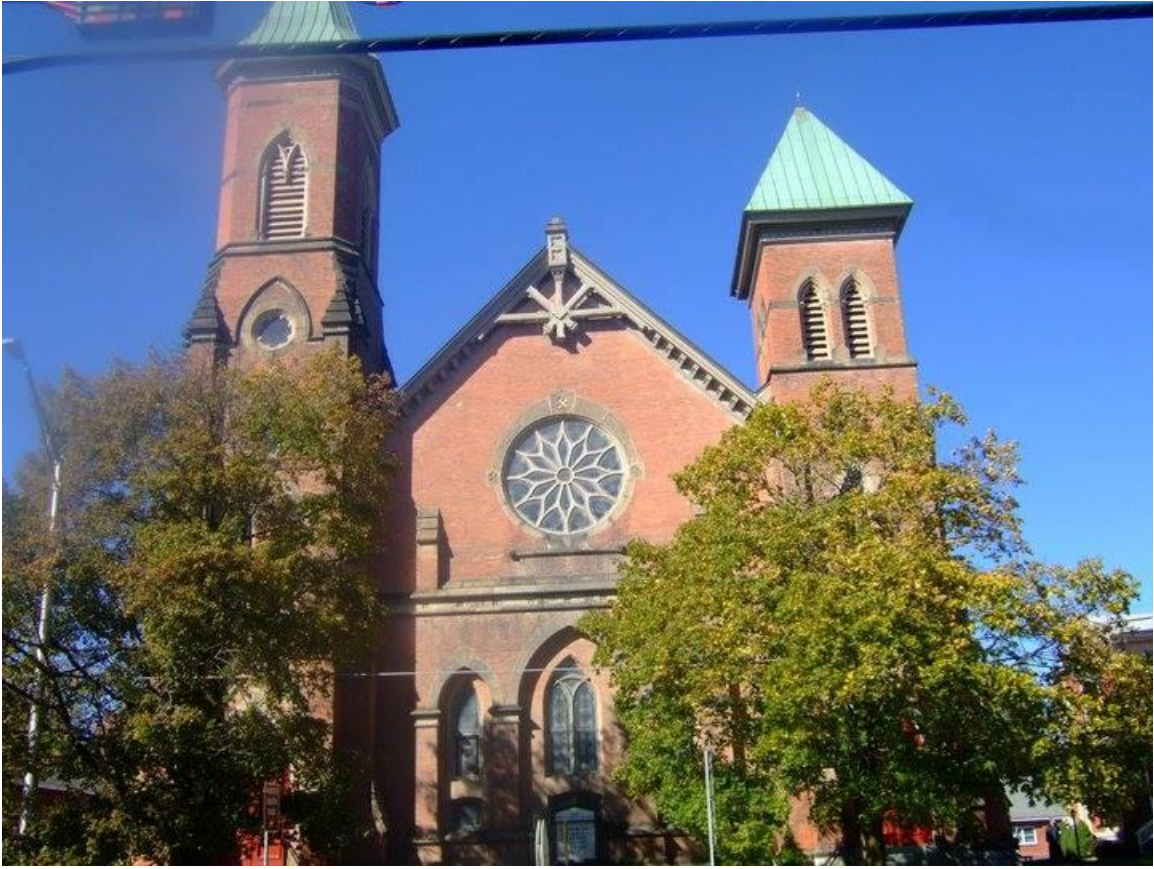
*Jesus put it plainly so friend you need not doubt,
