Call to Presence

Some Thoughts

But love is perhaps the last thing we need to be reminded of in these days following the election. Yet maybe love is what we need to talk about, since love is God's mandate for us. Love is who we are, and how we are called to treat one another. Many Christians say they know God because they read the Bible, go to church and pray, but their actions do not show that they know God's love. The scripture says, "Whoever loves is born of God and knows God" (1 John 4:7). Few of us show God's love by loving what God loves, so how can we say we know God?

Jesus says that the entire law and the prophets are summed up in two great commandments: love God and love one another (Matthew 22:36–40). It is hard to hear these commandments because they require a new understanding of knowing and loving God, something we cannot do on our own. Our understandings of God and of love are affected by so many factors, our experiences and culture. We think love means liking our enemies and forgetting the trauma we've experienced. We think knowing God means reading the Bible and going to church. We are caught in our own minds and there's little room for listening to and learning from God.

We are all beginners. We are all starting over each day, and we rely on the mercy, grace, and compassion of God. This is what opens us to knowing and loving what God loves.
