Recognizing Janice Negus, an Outstanding Woman of Windsor (WoW)! By Joy Stone



The Windsor Outreach Budget provides financial assistance to numerous organizations. Among them are local groups (Harvest Hope, Sistercare, Oliver Gospel Mission, Epiphany Ministry, Cooperative Ministry, Scout troops at Windsor), United Methodist groups (UMCOR, Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry, UMVIM, Killingsworth Home, Epworth Children's Home) and financial assistance for members serving on Salkehatchie and global mission trips.

In previous issues of *The Vine*, four groups were highlighted—Epiphany Ministry, Killingsworth Home, Harvest Hope and Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry. This month we highlight Oliver Gospel Mission and Epworth Children's Home.

Outreach thanks you for your support of all of these programs as Windsor seeks to help those in need.



Epworth Children's Home has been a place for children to grow, learn and be loved since 1896. Children ages four -18 come to the home from severely stressed family systems. Approximately 65% of residents are placed at Epworth by the SC Department of Social Services after being

removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. The remaining 35% arrive as a private placement as a result of a fractured family system that often includes addiction issues, homelessness or other forms of instability. Each child is evaluated academically, emotionally, physically and spiritually and an individualized care plan is developed. Housing, health care, fitness, counseling, tutoring sessions and meals are all provided on campus. The goal is to nurture and love them by providing education, counseling, medical care and spiritual enrichment.



Since 1888, **Oliver Gospel Mission** has helped those who are broken and homeless, adopting new programs to adapt to the changing times and needs of the community. In 2017, Toby's Place, a new center housing homeless women and homeless women with children opened. Through a variety of programs, Oliver Gospel Mission and Toby's Place serve men and women, providing them with the gospel of Jesus Christ, meals, shelter, clothing, addiction recovery programs and programs that help to secure employment and housing.




