# WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE

Hello Windsor, I trust this message finds you well in the after Easter glow of our church year.

It has been almost a year since Rev. Leatha Brown accepted the appointment to Windsor United Methodist Church. What a year it has been—a 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration, an annual Revival and Unity Service and all the additional outreach activities that keep us a busy church. We have addressed the look and feel of our church campus and buildings. This past year, the pastor has reinstituted Bible studies at different dates and times to accommodate our schedules. She has been the rare combination of pastor and preacher-visiting, praying, and teaching throughout the week and then bringing a message on Sunday morning.

Upon her appointment to Windsor UMC, we knew that change was in the air and a chance for the Lord to do things with our ministry. With that in mind, prior to her arrival at Windsor, Rev. Brown took study courses, on her own, on how to blend a multicultural ministry. Part of what she learned that she needed was coaching from a senior UMC pastor who had successfully navigated a multicultural appointment. She found one she admired and found the support funding. She has enjoyed that relationship over the past several months. Thus far, the blending and the acceptance of change have been successful in the eyes of Windsor's Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC).

The SPRC team has discussed what we need to do to put some of the coaching to practical use in this ministry. This is an SPRC question because it involves tasking the staff with what Windsor decides. To that end, the pastor and the SPRC have concurred that there should be "listening" sessions. The purpose of the listening sessions is to get feedback from the members and input on our future ministry here at the church.

Volunteers will conduct small group sessions over the next several months to determine what direction Windsor's congregation wants to go and/or grow. SPRC will not host these sessions, but an SPRC member will be present at each session. The group sizes will be 8-10 people, sharing in a safe setting among other congregants what is on their hearts and what they would like to see Windsor become. These listening sessions are not designed to be grievance sessions or staff evaluations; we respectfully reserve that right for SPRC.

Sample Listening Session questions:

- What do you like best about this church? How would you enhance this?
- What is one dream you have for our church?
- What would you not want changed?
- What do you like least about the church?
- If you were the new pastor, what would you do in the upcoming year?

We do a wonderful job here at Windsor of answering need. Windsor is known for that throughout our area. We have members dedicated to leadership and the success of various Salkehatchie camps. We support and lead in the Soup Kitchen, Scouts, Epworth, Killingsworth and other organizations. But on this corner, at this address, on this campus and with this ministry, could we do more for the Lord? That will be a part of our conversation with the listening groups.

Ideas for consideration, but not limited to these ideas...

- Youth/Children's Ministry at Windsor and involving the community and local schools
- Senior Ministry with activities throughout the week or month
- Conducting community Bible studies
- Conducting community prayer vigils

Now, what are some of your ideas?

I close with this story.

On weekends, a friend of mine rides motorcycles as part of a ministry. On his phone he had a picture of a long-abandoned church—windows busted, parking lot broken up, overgrown grounds—as I said, longabandoned. Someone had placed a handmade sign in front of the church at some point in time that read...

'This Church didn't vote to Die, It just didn't vote to LIVE."

I pray that in the next 50 years Windsor will be just as vital to the Lord's work as it has been for the last 50 years.

The pastor will be taking a much-needed rest during early May. We hope to put some groups together following her respite.

Thank you for all you do Windsor congregants. I am blessed to be associated with you all!

In Christ's name and for His sake, AMEN!


Windsor United Methodist Church's tub project helped those folks in their packing once they knew where they were going to live permanently. We gave 77 tubs.

# Windsor's Outreach Programs

The Windsor Outreach Budget provides financial assistance to numerous organizations. Among them are local groups (Harvest Hope, Sistercare, Oliver Gospel Mission, Epiphany Ministry, Cooperative Ministry, Scout troops at Windsor), United Methodist groups (UMCOR, Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry, UMVIM, Killingsworth Home, Epworth Children's Home) and financial assistance for members serving on Salkehatchie and global mission trips.

In the March Vine issue, two groups were highlighted-Epiphany Ministry and Killingsworth Home. This month we highlight Harvest Hope and Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry.



Harvest Hope, a shared vision of the faith community and business leaders, began in 1981 to provide for the hungry in Columbia. The mission has now increased to feed the hungry in 20 counties across South Carolina

with locations in Columbia, Florence and Greenville. In 2018, 22.9 million meals were distributed, feeding approximately 40,425 people each week! The Columbia location serves Calhoun, Chester, Fairfield, Kershaw, Lexington, Newberry, Orangeburg, Richland, Saluda and Sumter counties. Washington Street UMC Soup Cellar acquires the bulk of their food for the noon-day meals from Harvest Hope.



Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry is a United Methodist agency. It was formed by families and

friends seeking to prepare for the future of their loved ones with developmental disabilities. Aldersgate maintains three homes-located in Columbia, Orangeburg and Florence-for adults with special needs to live in a loving, Christian home environment. The homes provide life-skills training and work experiences, daily-living skills such as cooking and laundry, and connections to Sunday worshipping communities.

Outreach thanks you for your support of all of these programs as Windsor seeks to help those in need.
