Windsor Spoke, We Listened!

In May of this year, I penned an article for *The Vine* on behalf of SPRC entitled Open Letter To Windsor—Where Do We Go From Here? We outlined that SPRC would be conducting Listening Sessions to determine how the congregation wanted to proceed with our ministry.

Below is a brief recap of the five sessions that were conducted in August and September. As you read these highlights, Administrative Council will already have heard them and started formulating plans based on the ideas that seemed universal among all five sessions.

First, there were 46 Windsor UMC congregants, five facilitators and five SPRC committee members that attended these sessions. SPRC would like to thank those that participated from the congregation. We also want to extend our gratitude to those folks who volunteered to facilitate these sessions, and I personally want to thank the members of SPRC who audited the sessions and reported back the results. Pastor Brown is the only person who, by design, attended every session. I think she now has a wealth of information that would be hard for her to obtain in any other way.

You are all truly Disciples of Christ and his Church!

Common Themes for "Why you like Windsor."

Most participants liked or loved our Church because of the warmth, friendliness, openness, fellowship and the message on Sunday, but many of the folks participating were concerned about growth—no surprise here. One respondent was even anxious that we might end up closing if we don't grow.

Common themes for "Enhancing Our Church" were to include, but not limited to:

• Community Involvement – events, prayer vigils and open to all Bible studies. Advertise events inside and outside of our community differently.

- Children and Youth we should focus on getting young families into our church. We should facilitate activities for children and, by extension, youth.
- We should redevelop and support small groups—including Sunday School—fellowship more, be with each other outside of the worship service, and combine services on 5th Sundays.
- Communication We should invite people we interact with in our daily lives. We should be more transparent within the church to curb rumors and speculation.
- We should do more Listening Sessions.

Common themes for "Dreams for Our Church" were, but again not limited to:

- GROWTH, mentioned over and over
- More involvement in Missions and Outreach
- Focus on worship and creating disciples
- Children and youth in church including acolytes
- More robust music programs: Choir, Children's Choir, Youth Choir, Hand Bells, etc.

Common themes for "Liked Least About Our Church," not limited to these:

- More volunteerism to serve within the church. The same people are on the same committees, by default.
- No young people. Can you see a trend?
- Low attendance, it came up in every group repeatedly. Trend again.
- Facilities, parking lot, etc. (Trustee questions, not SPRC)
- That more is not known about everything going on...being able attend leadership meetings. (All meetings are open to any congregant to attend, without voting privileges, with the exception of Leadership Development and SPRC). Most are listed monthly in the calendar.
- No senior activities

SOUP CELLAR 40th Anniversary Celebration

On October 20, Washington Street UMC celebrated the Soup Cellar's 40th Anniversary during their 11:00 worship service followed by a luncheon for the soup cellar volunteers. The service included a history of the start of the soup cellar which began October 15, 1979 with 12 individuals coming through the doors for lunch. Today, they average 150-200 guests per meal. Nearly a million meals have been served during the 40 years with more than 45,000 provided in 2018!

Volunteers from 18 churches were recognized during the service and Windsor was well represented with 11 attendees!

A lunch consisting of chicken and dumpling soup, sandwiches (turkey, pimento cheese and peanut butter and jelly), a variety of cookies and a drink followed the service. The Soup Cellar's chef, Terrence Chisholm, prepared the delicious meal with help from Washington Street UMC volunteers.









Many thanks to both Windsor and the Soup Kitchen volunteers, past and present, who have helped this ministry feed the hungry. Through the years, Windsor UMC and the volunteers have helped with financial donations, support of our jam and soup fundraisers, homemade desserts, fresh vegetables from the garden, ham bones, toiletries, scarves, caps, t-shirts and socks, entertaining us with music, and the monthly preparation and serving of sandwiches, soup and pasta salad.

At our next meeting, Tuesday, November 12, we will collect paper products and cheese or peanut butter crackers for the Free Medical Clinic.

Denise Lane has recently concluded assistance to both the Men's and Women's Walk to Emmaus, having completed her own walk in March 2008. Denise re-joined Windsor's United Methodist Women in 2017. This year, she continued in her service to Windsor with the Altar Guild, helping to maintain altar displays, with kitchen duties for the Lenten lunches, with kitchen duties at Salkahatchie and, most recently, with the Emmaus walks. Denise is active in Saturday Blessings as well as the UMW and participated in the Trunk 'n Treat program with Terry Mulholland. In addition to her Windsor activities, Denise is active with the Colonial Dames and the Daughters of the American Revolution, which brought her to the nation's capitol for Easter services at St. Peter's Cathedral this year.

3 Hours = 281 Free Flu Shots!

On Saturday, October 19, Windsor was again the site for our members and community to get free flu shots and health screenings through our partnership with Prisma Health Midlands. During a three-hour time period, 281 flu shots were given and 26 health screenings performed.



None of this would have been possible without a dedicated team of volunteers. In addition to our own team—Kara and Gene Lewis, Becky Leonard, Charles Shipman and Monya Havekost—Prisma Health nurses and pharmacy students from various colleges kept busy registering, assisting or administering shots. Nelly Jolley, who administers Richland 2's Skills for Life and Work Program at Windsor,

and Mayte Nicolas, who heads the Richland Library tutoring program, kindly served as interpreters when needed. Prisma Health Children's Hospital also provided a Child Life Specialist to help ease the concerns of our youngest visitors and an Italian Ice treat.

Consecration Sunday Is Coming November 17

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Church Council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.


