

Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." Matthew 13:32

The Hemingway Kingstree East Salkehatchie camp is still a small camp by many standards, but like the mustard seed, we are beginning to grow. Compared to last year's initial efforts, we doubled the number of participants and the number of homes we selected to repair.

The challenges were great. Williamsburg County is a very large rural county with no Walmart, no Wells Fargo, no Lowe's or Home Depot, and no Verizon. This means that we have to travel to Andrews (Georgetown County) and Lake City (Florence County) to purchase building supplies or to bank. Phone reception is spotty at best.

The blessings were greater. The rural United Methodist and AME churches have embraced us with some of the best home-cooked meals of "Real" fried chicken, chicken pilau in a cast-iron pot, vinegar-based barbecue, mac and cheese and creamy desserts. We did not go hungry.

Hemingway High School welcomed us like long-lost family even though it was our first year staying there. The showers were warm and air was cool.

Yes, the wind blew when the rains came, tearing the black felt off one roof, causing additional leaks and ceilings to cave in and yes, the July sun baked us until we couldn't work for long stretches. Yes, we had to work three additional Saturdays to complete the roofs and accrued damage.

Yet, at the end of the day, two families can stay in their homes with "tops" that no longer leak. One lady can now safely access her front and side doors. One family has a kitchen floor that no longer sags and a new kitchen window to let in the light.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; A Holy Land Insight

On my recent trip to Israel, our tour bus ventured into the Judean Desert, away from the crowds of Jerusalem and off the main road where beige and pink rock, mountains and valleys, is all I could see from every direction. We climbed to a rocky plateau overlooking what many believe to be the location that David referred to as "the valley of the shadow of death." It was so deep, we couldn't see the bottom, but some researchers believe that David led his sheep through this dark valley, a canyon where even the sun can't reach. It was windy on the day we were there so, truthfully, most of us stood far from the edge of the cliff.

Off in the distance stood St. George's Monastery built into the side of the rock. This amazing cliff-hanging monastery, one of the world's oldest, was originally started in the fourth century by a few monks who wanted to live like John the Baptist and Jesus. They chose the spot around a cave believed to be where the prophet Elijah was fed by ravens. (1 Kings 17:6)

The monastery was destroyed by the Persians, rebuilt by the Crusaders, and renovated by the Greek monk, Kalinikos, in 1901. It was named after the most famous monk who lived there, Gorgias of Coziba.

Today, the few Greek Orthodox monks who still inhabit the monastery welcome visitors. St. George's Monastery can be reached via the main Jerusalem— Dead Sea highway. There is a 3-hour long hiking path through the valley and up the side to the monastery. It gets very hot at times, making the hike extremely challenging. To add to the challenge, there is a strict dress code. Men must wear long pants and women must wear long skirts with modest tops. Needless to say, our group enjoyed the glimpse of St. George's Monastery from afar.

Speaking the words of the well-known "Lord's Prayer," it is understandable to sense the potential for fear as David trekked through this creepy and dark valley. Yet, his faith kept him strong because he knew God was with him..
