Troop 900 has completed another successful Scouting for Food drive. Scouts distributed door hangers throughout the Briarwood neighborhood on Saturday, February 5. The following Saturday, scouts arrived bright and early and cheerfully collected bags of donations placed on the porches of the Briarwood neighborhood homes. In total, more than 670 items were collected and donated to Windsor United Methodist Church's food pantry.

Collected items from Troop 900 and Troop 2870 were combined to amass nearly 2000 items total. Mrs. Becky Leonard and Ms. Nelly Jolley (a Richland 2 outreach worker) were onsite and able to facilitate providing necessities to 35 families as well as restock the food pantry closet. Troop 900 would like to thank all the volunteers who participated and the neighborhood families who dug deep to make their contributions.







#### WINDSOR SOUP KITCHEN AT WASHINGTON STREET UMC

Windsor's first serving of 2022 at Washington Street UMC Soup Cellar was in February. We did not serve in January as the New Year's holiday coincided with our regular first Monday of the month serving day.

Terrence Chisolm, Soup Cellar manager, made hot vegetable beef soup for February 7 — a cold and rainy day. Our bagged meal also included a turkey sandwich, crackers, applesauce, granola bar for dessert and a bottle of water. Windsor's four-person serving crew of Ferrie Ward, Kathy Hart, Debbo Lackore and Becky Leonard handed out the noon-time meal to the 85 folks who came through the Soup Cellar doors.

Since June 2021, the Soup Cellar has welcomed back volunteer groups on a limited basis. At the beginning of the COVID pandemic, all volunteers were suspended and the noon meal operation was kept going by a small group of dedicated Washington Street UMC staff and members. Adjustments were made to be able to continue serving a meal to those in need. Those changes are still in effect. Bagged take-out meals replace the sit-down meal. Masks are required of

guests and serving crew. Each guest comes to the serving counter one at a time to receive their bagged meal and departs so that the next guest can get their meal. For added protection, servers stand behind a plexiglass screen and pass the meal to the guests. Volunteer groups, including Windsor UMC, make sandwiches, pack items included in the bagged meal and hand the meal out.

While numbers of those being served in spring 2020 began in the low 60s, they have climbed with some days now serving more than 100 people.

In 1984, I moved to Columbia. I came from a treatment for drugs and alcohol. I was homeless living in the Women's Shelter. Every day for two months, I took the bus or walked around town looking for a job. During that time you fed me spiritually and with food. For that I am grateful. Enclosed is a check to help pay back for my 29 years of clean and sober.
