

Prior to Covid, Candee had joined our Windsor crew to help serve.

The following month our serving day was June 5. Terrence made a ground beef with bean soup. Soup has been a daily menu item, no matter the weather, as it is nutritious and requested by the Soup Cellar guests. Along with the soup, guests received a chicken salad or

Having been trained in the classics, classical music remains a favorite to play and listen to. He loves Liszt, Rachmaninoff, Debussy and....well how much time do you have?

Rodney said, "If I had to name a favorite pianist, my love and appreciation for music seems to be ever expanding into various genres. Whether it's classical, sacred, worship and praise, jazz, pop, ambient etc., I've come across pieces that can bring me to tears from their beauty. It makes me perceive music to be a language that can reach the Divine."

He remembers being around seven years old when he took his first radio apart to get to the bottom of where those sounds were coming from.
