#### July 1, 2025

I can't believe it's already July, and I've been at Windsor UMC for one year. It feels like I've been here longer than that, and I say that positively. The year has flown by, and in that time, together, a lot of ministry has been done. Beginning with the Outreach Backpack Drive, Windsor provided bookbags filled with school supplies for children in need. In September and October, I taught a study on our United Methodist heritage and what we believe as Methodists and we filled 15 blue flood buckets in response to the devastating flooding from Hurricanes Helene and Milton. The Fall into Faith Festival, co-hosted with Christian Faith Fellowship, was a big community success. The United Methodist Men served six hundred hot dogs; even Bishop Leonard Fairley and Mrs. Fairley stopped in. Later in the month, the men sold pork ribs and pork butts.

In November, we remembered All Saints Sunday and recognized the great cloud of witnesses who had gone before us. November thirtieth was the first Sunday of Advent. We celebrated by telling the story of the Chrismon Tree. Through Windsor Families Helping Families, 17 children had a happier Christmas and we participated in Samaritan's Purse shoeboxes. There was an Advent book study on how the Grinch's heart grew three sizes, based on the Dr. Seuss story, How the Grinch Stole Christmas. I introduced to Windsor a "Blue Christmas" service, which, although sparsely attended, the ones who came said the worship experience deeply moved them. The Sounds of the Spirit Choir brought the Christmas spirit by singing Christmas carols to the residents at Forest Lake Manor and Terra Bella. The Advent season came to a beautiful conclusion with the evening Candlelight Christmas Eve service as we rejoiced at the birth of Jesus Christ.


The Lenten season was busy. It started with the Shrove Tuesday/Fat Tuesday pancake supper that the United Methodist Men prepared, followed the next day by the solemn Ash Wednesday service. Two groups met for the Lenten book study *The Third Day Living the Resurrection* by Bishop Tom Berlin. The daytime group enjoyed the study, followed by homemade soup (cooked by yours truly) and sandwiches brought by folks each week. The evening group met for dinner and book study at Lizard's Thicket. Both groups had in-depth discussions of the material and had wonderful fellowship.

Holy Week was jam-packed with a Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday prayer vigil, a joint Easter sunrise with Pastor Jake and the Fil-Am Friendship Ministry of Christ, with breakfast provided by the United Methodist Men (do you all

see a theme emerging?) Those UMM fellas can cook! After that, I managed to take a little time away at the beach. And here we are in July! I wish you a happy and safe Fourth! And for another year of blessed ministry to the glory of God.

#### WINDSOR SOUP KITCHEN AT WASHINGTON STREET UMC

Windsor UMC continues to help with the Soup Cellar servings at Washington Street UMC. If you would like to participate in a serving or have any questions, please contact Becky Leonard.

The Soup Cellar first opened its doors in October 1979, serving a simple, nutritious meal to those in need in downtown Columbia. Changes to the noon-time meal have occurred over the course of the past 45 years. Their current bagged meal format arose as a necessity to be able to continue to safely provide a meal to those in need during Covid. The Soup Cellar has retained this bagged meal format for five years and plans to continue it in the foreseeable future.

Churches throughout the Columbia area help Monday through Friday with the preparation and serving of the noon-time meal. Windsor UMC helps on the first Monday of the month. 158 guests came through on Windsor's May 5 serving day. The meal included a cup of vegetable, chicken and rice soup, along with either a tuna salad, bologna, turkey sub or peanut butter and jelly sandwich. An orange, can of sparkling water, and dessert item (donut, cupcake or cookie), completed

the meal. Michelle Nicholson, Debbo Lackore, Patty Fowler, Tremaine Sails-Dunbar, Candee DePew and Becky Leonard were the serving crew that morning.

On June 2, Windsor again served more than 150 guests with 152 guests coming through to pick up a meal. This meal included a cup of vegetable beef soup, turkey or peanut butter and jelly sandwich, an orange, a donut and can of Pepsi. The morning's serving crew included Michelle Nicholson, Debbo Lackore, Patty Fowler, Candee DePew, and Tremaine Sails-Dunbar.

- individual fruit/applesauce cups


