Sodbury Yarn Over 2025 Exclusive Crochet Pattern: The Sodbury Sampler Cowl by Suzanne Booth

The Sodbury Sampler celebrates Chipping Sodbury's textures, patterns, and rich heritage and has been designed exclusively for the 2025 Sodbury Yarn Over.

The pattern draws inspiration from features of the town and surrounding Cotswolds, incorporating stitches that evoke its landscapes, architecture, and history while inviting you to explore a unique combination of crochet stitches.

It's designed to be versatile and customisable, allowing you to create something that suits your needs and budget. It also reflects my love of introducing people to new techniques and inspiring possibilities. It's simple and achievable, making it accessible for all skill levels, but it also encourages you to try new stitches and explore your creativity.

The basic pattern is based on using just one 100g skein of Aran-weight yarn, which you can join together to make a neck-warmer cowl. However, you can easily add more skeins and repeat the pattern to make it larger or don't join and leave it as a scarf, or even experiment with colour changes and surface crochet.

I've included inspiration and ideas for adapting the design —typical of how I approach my patterns—offering suggestions to empower you to make your own creative decisions and truly make the project your own. I'll show you these design possibilities in my introduction and design video, which you can access easily by scanning the QR code below.

rat you'll need

YARN

Suggested yarn: Any Aran weight yarn of your choice.

HOOK As suggested by yarn label

NOTIONS Wool needle Scissors



SKILL LEVEL

Confident beginner

MEASUREMENTS

Gauge is not important for this design.

This design can be worked to your desired length or dictated by the skein length (See pattern notes),

ABBREVIATIONS (UK TERMS)

Ch(s) = chain(s)

SS = slip stitch

YO = Yarn over hook

Sk = Skip stitch

Dc = double crochet

[Insert hook / YO / Pull up a loop (2 loops on hook) / YO / Pull through both loops on hook]

Tr = Treble crochet

[YO hook/insert hook / YO / Pull up a loop (3 loops on hook) / YO / Pull through first 2 loops on hook / YO / Pull through both loops on hook]

Htr = Half treble crochet

[YO hook/insert hook / YO / Pull up a loop (3 loops on hook) / YO / Pull through all 3 loops on hook]

Special stitch: Little Puff

[YO hook/insert hook / YO / Pull up a loop (3 loops on hook) / YO / Pull up a loop (5 loops on hook) / YO / Pull up a loop (7 loops on hook) / YO / Pull up a loop (9 loops on hook)/ YO and pull through all 9 loops.



Gauge is not important for this pattern.

The design is a collection of stitch blocks. It has been designed with one 100g Skein of Aran weight yarn in mind, where you keep crocheting until the skein is used up. Therefore, the width and length may vary according to your tension.

The relaxed nature of the pattern allows you to explore using different yarns and amounts to create something unique to you. Working with one 100g skein, I found I got 34 of the way back through the pattern, but the cowl was too long to be a small neck warmer and too short to get two wraps around my head, so for consequent samples, I used less to make a more snug fit. My video will support you with the design choices to help you think about what you'd like to make.

Blocking is recommended to open up the filet crochet stitches and to straighten the design, but it is not essential.

I reference the right side and the wrong side, as in the puff blocks, the puffs are worked on the wrong side to show on the right.

FOUNDATION

Chain 29 +1

Row 1: 1 DC into the 2nd chain from the hook and in each chain to the end (29 RS), Chain 1 and turn.

BLOCK ONE: Butterflies



Row 2: Slip Stitch (SS) into first stitch, Half treble crochet (Htr) in next, repeat SISt then Htr across to the end (29 WS), chain 1 and turn.

Row 3: Htr in the first stitch, SS in next, repeat Htr, then SS across to the end (29 RS), chain 2 and turn.

(Doing the opposite of row 2 basically)

Row 4: Crochet 1TR in the next 4 stitches, then *ch1, skip 1 stitch, 1 TR, Ch1, skip 1 stitch, 1 TR in next 3 stitches. Repeat from * up to 4 stitches remaining. Crochet 1TR in these last 4 stitches. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 5: Repeat Row 4, working into the top of the stitches below.

Row 6: Crochet 1TR in the next 7 stitches, then *ch1, skip 1 stitch, 1 TR, Ch1, skip 1 stitch, 1 TR in next 3 stitches. Repeat from * up to 7 stitches remaining. Crochet 1TR in these last 7 stitches. Chain 1 and turn.

Row 7: Repeat Row 6, working into the top of the stitches below. Chain 1 to end



BLOCK TWO: Floral Iris Stitch



Row 8: Slip Stitch (SS) into first stitch, Half treble crochet (Htr) in next, repeat SISt, then Htr across to the end, (29 WS), chain 1, and turn.

Row 9: Htr in the first stitch, SS in next, repeat Htr, then SS across to the end (29 RS), chain 2 and turn.

Row 10: 1Tr in the first stitch, skip next stitch, [2Tr, Ch1, 2Tr] in next stitch, * Skip 3 sts, [2Tr, Ch1, 2Tr] in the next stitch, repeat from * to the last 2 stitches, skip 1 stitch, Crochet 1Tr in last stitch, Chain 2 and turn.

Row 11: 1Tr in the first stitch, skip across to work in the chain 1 space in the row below (Between the two sets of trebles) and crochet [2Tr, Ch1, 2Tr] in this space, * Skip across to the next chain 1 space [2Tr, Ch1, 2Tr] in here and repeat across to the last set to make a final [2Tr, Ch1, 2Tr] in this space. Skip the remaining stitches at the end of the row and crochet 1Tr in the LAST stitch, Chain 2 and turn.

Row 12 and 13: Repeat Row 11, end chain 1 and turn.



BLOCK THREE: Medieval heritage



Row 14: ONLY WORK IN THE TREBLES - NOT THE CHAIN ONE SPACE! Skip 1st stitch, Slip Stitch (SS) into 2nd stitch, Half treble crochet (Htr) in next, repeat SS, then Htr across to the end, chain 1, and turn.

Row 15: Htr in the 1st stitch, SS in next, repeat Htr, then SS across to the end, chain 1 and turn.

Row 16: Slip Stitch (SS) into 1st stitch, Half treble crochet (Htr) in next, repeat SS, then Htr across to the end, chain 1, and turn.

Row 17: Crochet 1Dc in each stitch along the row (29) chain 2 and turn.

Row 18: Crochet 1Tr in each stitch along the row (29) chain 2 and turn.

Row 19: Crochet 1Tr in the first stitch, then *Ch1, Skip 1 stitch, 1Tr in the next, and repeat from * along the row until there are 2 stitches left. Skip a stitch and TR in the last stitch. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 20: Repeat row 19, working the same stitches into the top of the stitches below to form a double row of grid-like stitches. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 21: Work a row of trebles - 1 in each stitch along the row. (29)

Row 22 - 24: Repeat rows 19 - 21 chain 1 and turn on the last stitch.



BLOCK FOUR: Rolling hills



Row 25: Crochet 1 Dc in each stitch along the row (29), chain 1 and turn.

Row 26: Crochet 1 Dc in the first two stitches, * in the next stitch, create a puff (See abbreviations). Crochet 1 Dc in the next 3 stitches. Repeat from * along the row until only 2 stitches left. Crochet 1Dc in the last 2 stitches. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 27: Crochet 1Tr in each stitch along the row (29). Chain 1 and turn.

Row 28: Crochet 1 Dc in the first four stitches, * in the next stitch, create a puff (See abbreviations). Crochet 1 Dc in next 3 stitches. Repeat from * along the row until only four stitches left. Crochet 1Dc in these last four stitches. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 29: Crochet 1Tr in each stitch along the row (29). Chain 1 and turn.

Row 30- 31: Repeat row 26 and 27

Repeat the pattern from Row 2 and go as far as you want to-either until the skein runs out or until the cowl Is the size you require, or if you want to make a scarf, keep going until it's the length you require.
