Here's what Job lost:

## Job's initial suffering:

• Messengers Speak of the Fire of God Job 1:13-22 (LSB): Summary: This passage describes how Job's life is first struck by a series of catastrophes, including the loss of his livestock, servants, and even his children.

## Job's afflictions and conversations with his friends:

Satan Strikes Job's Flesh Job 2:1-10 (LSB): Summary: Job's physical affliction is added to his suffering as he's covered in painful sores.

### Job's speeches and questioning of God:

- Job 23:1-17 (LSB): Summary: In this chapter, Job expresses his desire to find God and present his case before Him.
