### From the President's Desk:

From the bottom of my heart, thank you. In the previous SDFRW newsletter, I begged for help in the Sioux Falls City Council at large election. That race, which involved roughly 10x a legislative district's population, featured one Republican against two liberal Democrats, including one who called the GOP a "terrorist organization." Election Day produced a runoff. Over the ensuing weeks, SDFRW made sure the Republican candidate prevailed. We hosted a party at which hundreds of conservatives gathered to pick up campaign signs and coordinate efforts. Our digital billboards racked up 60,000 views a week over a guarter of a million views in total! MLRW President Dee Van Deest issued a series of emails supporting our Calls to Action. After we trained volunteers in Campaign Sidekick, the door knocking app used by the SDGOP, our teams pounded the pavement, imploring voters to keep Sioux Falls from going the way of drug addled Portland and crime ridden Minneapolis. In the end, our four-part plan helped secure victory! Surprising nearly every expert, turnout actually increased for the runoff. What's more, voting rates were highest in neighborhoods and precincts where we focused our efforts. It's abundantly clear that without you a socialist would have won.

As a mother of two young boys, I thank you from the bottom of my heart! Your hard work ensured Republicans will continue to govern the place I am proud to call home. It is by your tremendous effort that – at least for now – we have kept Sioux Falls from going the way of Minneapolis, and South Dakota from going the way of Minnesota.

While we were busy winning a critical city council seat, we also won NFRW's first-ever March Madness Membership Competition! Not only does that honor come with national bragging rights, it earned us free registration to the 2025 NFRW Convention, saving SDFRW nearly \$600! The Presidents of the five local clubs with the largest membership increases are:

### SDFRW Campaigns Committee was out in force to answer Sioux Falls' call for help!

Our SDFRW Campaigns Committee jumped to answer the call for help winning the Sioux Falls City Council At Large Seat! In that race, one Republican ran against two woke Democrats, one of whom called the GOP a "terrorist organization." This single election would not only determine who would fill the At Large seat on the Council, it would also determine whether Republicans would hold on to the majority on the Council: if the Republican won, we'd have 5-3 Republicans vs. non-Republicans on the Council. If the Republican lost, the Council would be split 4-4. There was no disputing that this was a must-win race!



We began by offering a series of in-person trainings on Campaign Sidekick, the door knocking app that the SDGOP uses. Then we recruited volunteers and organized a series of days for lit drops and door knocking. Temps in the low 40s and 55mph gusts of wind couldn't keep us home!



The Republican owners of BookYourBillboard donated ad space to us on their digital billboards across Sioux Falls, which allowed us to run Get Out the Vote ads that garnered **over a quarter of a MILLION views**!! Every one of those views not only stressed the importance of voting and informed the viewer of the time frame in which to vote, each view also helped build our name brand, familiarizing the viewer with our organization. We'll continue to reap benefits from that name recognition for years to come!

On Election Day, SDFRW and MLRW hosted a Watch Party that doubled as a Sign Distribution Event! Not only did we get a chance to energize volunteers to continue to fight as the race went to a runoff election, we gave the Republican

candidates in 11 districts – almost a third of the state! – an



opportunity to connect with constituents and send supporters home with yard signs and palm cards. Over the course of the evening, hundreds of people attended from Sioux Falls and beyond. With delicious food, fantastic live music, and a Republican elected to the school board, it was a pretty fantastic evening!



In the end, all of our work paid off – the Republican candidate (Richard Thomason) won the runoff election with more constituents turning out to vote in the runoff than in the main election, which is extremely rare!

Special thank you to SDFRW Campaign Activities Chair **Val Higgins**, MLRW President **Dee Van Deest**, and MLRW Member-At-Large **Trish Murphy** for all your work to bring home the victory in this critical election. With your help, we were able to maintain the Republican majority on the City Council, protecting Sioux Falls from Minneapolis' and South Dakota from Minnesota's fate – at least for now!






### Thank you for tuning in!


