From the President's Desk: A Banner Year for SDFRW!

What a year for Republican Women! We smashed record after record. Our membership surpassed 500. Our Facebook followers shot up 42%, meaning we're more popular than Pennsylvania, Illinois, or North Carolina. Obliterating every previous threshold, we TRIPLED fundraising. Hundreds of newspaper, TV, and radio spots featured SDFRW. Nearly 1000 social media posts and tweets discussed our events and initiatives. We set all-time records for Rushmore Regents as well as campaign and political service hours. At the National Federation's Biennial Convention in Oklahoma City, for the first time ever, we took home multiple prizes – the Betty Heitman State Excellence Award, the Caring for America Award (2nd Place), and the prestigious PR Award (3rd Place), ranking alongside Florida and



Texas. South Dakota was 1 of 8 states recognized for dramatic membership growth. And it was my personal honor to serve as NFRW's National Elections Supervisor and to Chair NFRW's Election Audit Committee.

While accolades are fantastic, it matters more how we earned them. In Brookings, we hosted the Property Rights and Pipelines Debate, drawing 400 attendees and media from across the Midwest. Per The Dakota Scout, it was "the first debate on eminent domain reform ever in [South Dakota]." We provided trainings, online and in person, explaining how citizens can look up bills, how bills become law, and how to approach elected officials. We helped activists and volunteers understand effective ways to win local elections, scoring key victories in Watertown and Rapid City. We enjoyed an exciting Legislative Day and a beautiful Christmas at the Capitol, where we decorated a stunning 10-foot tree! We hosted a historic First Ladies and First Gentlemen reception with Fmr. Governor Dennis and First Lady Linda Daugaard, Fmr. First Lady Pat Miller, as well as Senator (and Fmr. Governor) Mike Rounds' sister representing the Rounds family. After cleaning the Inaugural displays – with help from our SD Constitutional Officers -- we unveiled a plaque for the First Ladies and First Gentlemen Exhibit. We hosted fun play dates for young Republican families, and we brought recent college grads together over pedicures. We launched Instagram and Twitter accounts, attracting influential followers and Fox News personalities. We expanded our Youth Voter Registration Drive, and initiated a College Send-Off program, giving freshmen the tools and inspiration to resist woke indoctrination and defend conservative principles. In Madison, we introduced an incredible day of family fun, raising awareness about South Dakota Kids Belong and the need for loving foster families. To support our SDFRW sisters, we established the HEART Committee, celebrating good times and offering encouragement in bad times. We created a committee of Prayer Warriors who answer prayer requests and send out custom-made SDFRW prayer cards, letting folks know we're praying for them.

Even as 2023 winds down, we haven't taken our foot off the gas. We're launching a website to help veterans find businesses that appreciate their service. We're raising awareness about conservative children's literature, hosting a September Zoom call with Fmr. White House Press Secretary Sean Spicer (author of *The Parrots Go Bananas*). Then, on December 13, we hosted a Zoom call with Fmr. Housing Urban and Development Secretary Dr. Ben Carson (author of *Why America Matters*). We passed resolutions in support of Israel and Keep 9. We stood against revisionist history and cancel culturists who dream of destroying Mt. Rushmore. We demanded the Biden Administration stop using taxpayers' money to support traffickers at the border. At least once a month, we offer club leaders private trainings with state and national experts. We're establishing a transition system for committees including After Action Reports so future leaders can learn from past successes and struggles. We've continued building organizational infrastructure – streamlining and systematizing processes, expanding communication, creating a text-based notification program, improving transparency, and growing accessibility.

Highlights of My Term as President



It has been an incredible experience serving as NFRW president these last two years. The highlight of my term has been meeting many talented Republican women during my travels and learning so much about my Republican sisters.

The NFRW Board of Directors contributed their talents and time to innovative projects and were devoted to serving. The staff at headquarters were efficient, professional and supportive.

Together with the commitment and dedication of each one of you, we have made outstanding progress building a stronger, bolder organization. Here are a few highlights.

- The NFRW commemorated its 85th Anniversary at the Blennial Convention in Oklahoma Giby with a celebration of the incredible reporges we have achieved as the largest grassroots Republican women's organization in the nation, and with a renewed commitment to our enduring mission of engaging and empowering women from all backgrounds in the political process.
- NFRW members worked tirelessly in 2022 and 2023 on campaigns. Your total hours and calls saved campaigns over \$435 million! We set a new record for campaign volunteer work, and those we elected took notice of our efforts. The Campaign
- We expanded programming and training by offering an award-winning campaign school free to members and virtual programming featuring high-level speakers who informed us on important issues. These programs are on our website and YouTube
- The Youth Outreach Committee connected with state presidents, and the response was exceptional, with 80% of state federations appointing a youth outreach chair to develop strategies to reach young women.
- The Faith Coalition Committee produced resources to engage women of faith at events with the goal to register them to vote and provide information on how to join a Republican Women's club.
- A record number of clubs totaling 153 were chartered in 2022-23 (see list). We added new federations in Vermont and Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia has a club for the first time in several years.
- The Virtual Club Coalition was formed to strengthen virtual clubs and provide speakers.
- In 2022, NFRW paid off the mortgage on the president's condo which was purchased in 2015. The NFRW is debt free!
- I worked tirelessly to be more visible as your president and to be unstoppable to promote YOU and this organization that I believe in with all my heart and soul.
- I was interviewed by Fox News Channel, attended CPAC, engaged in many media interviews with syndicated media and print media, and wrote op-ed pieces on topics related to the mid-term elections.

Thank you for your part in making these accomplishments possible. United we will continue to achieve success in electing Republican leaders and standing up for Republican descriptions.
