

SDFRW Convention Updates

The Convention Planning Committee has been working hard to ensure we have a fantastic convention this year!! This year, the Nominating Committee asked that all nominations be submitted through their online fillable form. Not only does that avoid the game of phone tag with committee members, the online form keeps all the nominations together, ensuring nothing slips through the cracks. Two weeks before the submission deadline, we emailed our entire list the link to the online form; you can also find it at any time until the deadline on our convention webpage. **The deadline to submit nominations is Friday, June 28.** There's no need to submit nominations for multiple positions for the same person – the nominating committee will take all the nominated ladies into consideration for positions that need to be filled. Any Active Member in good standing can nominate any other Active Member in good standing. **Please note that, from one term to the next, nobody is automatically nominated, and nobody is automatically included on the slate.** Every term, every elected officer must be nominated and selected by the Nominating Committee in order to gain a spot on the slate.

If you're thinking you might like to serve as a delegate or alternate at convention, please communicate your interest to your Club President!

The parameters for delegates at convention are laid out in Article IX, Section 3 – if you qualify as a delegate under B(2) below, then you should not run as a Club Delegate. No matter how many hats someone wears, she can only vote once.

A. Each club must as a minimum send one delegate or pay the total registration fee for one delegate.

Convention Updates Continued:

- B. The voting body of the Convention shall be:
- 1. Three (3) delegates-at-large from each club and one (1) additional delegate-at-large for each twenty (20) members or major fraction of twenty.

Members of the Board of Directors consisting of:

- a. All State Officers.
- b. Presidents of the clubs or the 1st Vice Presidents.
- c. Chairmen of Standing Committees or, in the absence of the Chairman, the Vice Chairman as her alternate.

C. A club of the State Federation is entitled to an alternate for each elected delegate. There shall be no alternate for State Officers.

We'll be communicating with the Club Presidents when we get closer as to the number of delegates they get to send based on their specific circumstances. It's a good idea, though, to go ahead and make your Club President aware of your interest!

Our fabulous Convention Chair **Lauri Davis** and her Convention Planning Committee are working hard to make sure we have a fantastic time at convention! You do not want to miss it!!
