CARING FOR AMERICA ACTIVITIES

In July 2021, eight members of <u>Charles Mix Republican Women</u> formed a committee to work with Call to Freedom, the organization who has visited our state conventions in the past. This organization deals with sex trafficking. Wagner Silva gave us training with a zoom meeting and then sent us posters. Our goal was to get posters displayed before the motorcycle rally in Sturgis. The 8 of us each chose a location where we distributed the pull tab posters and larger posters. We visited the following towns: Platte, Geddes, Wagner, Lake Andes, and Pickstown. We also put the large information posters in churches in Platte.

Our group will need to meet in the future and decide if we want to do any more activities. Education and a clothing collection are possibilities. We feel this is a very worthwhile activity for a Caring for America Project.

In July the **Beadle County Republican Women** collected school supplies to be distributed to elementary schools. We have also contacted school counselors to determine what clothing articles can be provided for emergency situations for students. We are having a rummage sale the first weekend of August with some proceeds going to our Caring For America project. In addition, we will be placing posters from Call to Freedom in bathrooms on the State Fair Grounds, especially under the Grand Stand and near the beer gardens/entertainment areas.

-Cen-Kota won the SDFRW Membership contest award for "Largest % Increase in Active Members" and received a trophy during the Summer Board of Directors Meeting



On September 11, 2001, a horrified world watched al Qaeda terrorists hijack four airplanes and murder nearly 3,000 innocents. Together we mourned these deaths, wept to read heart-wrenching tales of heroism and sacrifice, and, for a time, united against evil. The French paper *Le Monde* made the statement, beautiful in its simplicity, "Today, we are all Americans."

Please join us on Thursday, September 9th as we memorialize that tragedy's 20th anniversary and discuss the important lessons our nation learned at such dreadful cost. We are deeply honored to hear from an American hero and 9-11 attack survivor, Lt. General Richard "Tex" Brown who was, upon his retirement, the single most decorated member of the Air Force. Among his many, many honors, he earned the Silver Star on three separate occasions.

In remembrance of the Pentagon attack, our call will begin at 9:37am CST / 8:37am MST.

This Month in History ~ Olympics

- Margaret Abbot took first in women's golf in Paris in 1900, making her the first female American Olympic champion.
- Fourteen-year-old Aileen Riggin, the youngest athlete on the US team, won the diving gold medal in 1920 in Antwerp, the first games to include women's aquatic events.
- Elizabeth "Betty" Robinson of Riverdale, Illinois won the 100 meters in 1928 in Amsterdam, the first Olympic games to include women's track and field events.
- While elite, predominantly white universities eliminated women's athletic programs, many historically black colleges retained them. The most prolific program arose at Tennessee State University where Ed Temple served as head women's track coach from 1950 to 1994. During his tenure, forty members of his famed Tigerbelle teams represented Tennessee State in Olympic competition, winning a total of 23 medals (13 Gold, 6 Silver, and 4 Bronze). Temple coached famed Olympian Wilma Rudolph to three gold medals at the 1960 Rome Olympics.
- US Representative Patsy Mink (D-Hawaii) was a principal author of the Education Amendments of 1972—later renamed the Patsy T. Mink Equal Opportunity in Education Act. A former high school basketball player who was restricted to half-court play under the girls' rules, Mink made fighting gender discrimination a hallmark of her Congressional career.
- In 1991, the IOC implemented a requirement that new Olympic sports include women's events, exponentially increasing the number of female Olympians. The London 2012 US team was the first to feature more women than men. Correspondingly, US women outperformed the men in the medal count.
