

1784: Born July 22 Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel German Astronomer. German astronomer whose measurements of positions for about 50,000 stars and rigorous methods of observation (and correction of observations) took astronomy to a new level of precision. He was the first to measure accurately the parallax, and hence the distance, of a star other than the Sun.
