Basin Villages Forum

A Shoalhaven City Council Consultative Body

HOW TO BE INFORMED ABOUT DEVELOPMENT Shoalhaven Council recently wrote to the Basin Villages Forum to provide support advice for community to better connect to Development Application Tracking. That advice is provided below. It is our long term experience at the Forum for both Basin and other CCB communities that knowing how to access and work with DA TRACKING is critical to both the knowledge and understanding of the development process and likely outcomes.

COUNCIL DA TRACKING DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALSTo promote community participation in decision making processes that impact individuals and their local community Shoalhaven Council want the community to be able to access Council's DA Tracking website.

The DA Tracking website allows community members to view the plans and relevant information for each development application and is the best way to make an enquiry or comment on a specific DA through the dedicated DA enquiry form. Complete, up to date information on DAs can be accessed by the community through the Shoalhaven City Council DA Tracking website at any time.

Additionally, individuals can track the progress of their Development Applications from lodgement through to determination. This is the same information as in the attachments – it is uploaded automatically to Council's website and can be accessed at any time. If your community needs support in accessing or using the DA Tracking website please encourage them to reach out to Council for support by calling Council on 1300 293 111 or emailing development@shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au

The July meeting heard a report from a recent meeting of Sanctuary Point Community Pride where Clr. Bob Proudfoot addressed the continuing issue of the Sanctuary Point Library. He indicated that parking for the Country Club was an issue for the selected site at the shopping centre and that Clifton Park would be a preferred site. Forum discussion in July indicated it does not accept either of these contentions. The Forum will continue to support Pride's position and petition, which now has 1000+ signatures.

Artist-led Open Studio Trail Launches in Jervis Bay

There's a new cultural attraction on the South Coast with an artist-led initiative taking place every month across the Jervis Bay & Basin region – the Jervis Bay Arts Trail.

On the last Saturday each month, up to 20 local artists open their studios to visitors, showing their unique processes, materials and works-in-progress. The artists also have finished works for sale, including framed paintings and photographs, wearable art, greeting cards and gifts.

Pop-up locations such as the Vincentia Connections Hub, a shop within the Vincentia Shopping Village, and the Jervis Bay Shellfish Market in the Huskisson industrial zone, serve as high foot traffic touch points for the Trail members.

These pop-ups are updated regularly, so that frequent visitors to the Trail always have new artworks to see and buy. They also act as a reminder for people to add the open days to their calendars, for something interesting to do in Jervis Bay.

Debra Quartararo, a landscape painter and founding member of the Jervis Bay Arts Trail, said: "This is a group of very talented and motivated artists who have joined forces to offer a regular cultural attraction in our region. We are already experiencing excellent visitor numbers in the few months we have been together, as well as sales of our work."

The Jervis Bay Arts Trail has gratefully received sponsorship support for marketing from the Shoalhaven Art Society, the Jervis Bay Shellfish Market, Jervis Bay Brewing Co and Jervis Bay Weekend. They recently held a group exhibition at the community gallery at Cambewarra Estate, which was a showcase of the variety of mediums and techniques within the Trail members.

The team of artists installs an abundance of signage around the Jervis Bay area the week before each open day. The website is updated with the details of which artists are open that month, and where to find them. On the day, artists place an "open" sign out the front to help visitors find their way along the Trail.

The Jervis Bay Arts Trail studios are open 11am-2pm on the last Saturday of the month.

Spaghetti Marinara

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium brown onion, finely chopped
- 1 tsp chilli flakes (optional)
- 400g can diced tomatoes

- 400g thawed seafood marinara mix
- 375g Spaghetti No.1
- 1 bunch flat-leaf parsley, thinly sliced

METHOD

- 1. Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the onion, cook stirring for 5 mins or until onion softens. Stir in the chilli, if using, and cook for 1 min or until aromatic. Add the tomato and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 5 mins or until sauce thickens slightly. Season.
- Add the marinara mix and gently fold through the sauce. Reduce heat to very low. Cook for 2 mins or until seafood is just cooked through. Remove from heat.
- Meanwhile, cook the pasta in a saucepan of boiling water following packet directions or until al dente. Drain.
- 4. Add the pasta and two-thirds of the parsley to the seafood mixture. Gently fold to combine.
- 5. Top with the remaining parsley. Serve immediately.







MUCKING IN

CLIFTON COMMUNITY FOOD GARDEN

The Fundraiser or Open Day is the day we invite the locals and visitors too, into the garden to check on the progress of our labour and of course present the fundraising produce. And, do you know, they are such fun! It is such a lovely sunny spot, and folk are all so happy and friendly, laughing and joking and mixing with one another. Always excellent value, the produce and preserves are delicious and everyone has their favourite flavours.

Our members are always happy to share a recipe or a chat with all who come. Children can see how their food grows. The members enjoy a morning "cuppa" and a special, homemade cake for that month's birthday celebrations, while they, the birthday folk, get a bit of a ragging!! We are always so grateful for the donations of citrus fruit from the local fruit trees too, as this provides us with the resources for the maintenance of the garden. It is also appreciated that so many people are happy to return any jars they have. Cheers all 'round.

The Open Morning for September will be Saturday 20th, come on down and enjoy the fun and sun, grab a jar of delicious "taste sensation" to enjoy with your lunch.

There was a huge donation of magnificent citrus fruit this winter so our members have been busy chopping and stirring, and may I mention preparing jars for these preserved creations. Flu fighters in jars! Thank you sincerely to these friends of the garden who heard our pleas for fruit.

Our gardeners have managed the white cabbage moth so well this winter, so far. Frequent very close inspections of both the back and front of the leaves have kept the green caterpillars away, and keeping the doors of the

netted areas firmly closed helps too. In the past, the gates have blown open allowing access to those white moths with disastrous results when their green babies appear, munching all in their sight.

The Panama Passionfruit gave a bounty of fruit this year, much to the delight of many who enjoy the tart/sweet juicy fruit on their yoghurt in the breakfast bowl. It enjoyed full sun in the front garden and certainly performed beyond expectation. Certainly a treasure plant and worthy of a trellis or fence in any garden.

A number of the raised beds in the garden have been planted with green manure crops to nourish and improve the condition of the soil. This is turned into the bed and rested further allowing the plants to breakdown in this soil. This is another part of companion planting – the bed being rested further and not planted with a crop until summer. Also, it is a valuable part of crop rotation and to help control viruses and nematode infestation in the soil.

Many enthusiastic members of the garden gathered for a social evening during the deluge which was the start to August. The previous BBQ was cancelled due to inclement weather but our President declared that the show must go on; after all "he had chopped all those onions." So a wonderful winter feast was shared by the brave foodies who gathered, happy to share their creations and new recipes. Due to the previous hard work of the construction team and willing workers the undercover area is large enough for several folding tables, so a sit down dinner was enjoyed by all.





HOW DO YOU SLEEP?

Ashwagandha seems to be the flavour of the month. When we last reviewed it (Oct. 22) the herb was little known. Lately, the name seems to be on the bottle of every stress formula in the "natural" section of the chemist. Does it reduce stress? Well dear reader, read on.

Alert readers would notice "somnifera" in the Latin name - meaning sleep inducing. When people ask me what is this herb good for and I tell them that it gives you a good night's sleep they seem unimpressed. Apparently they want something a little more exciting than just good sleep. But what is wrong with sound, restful sleep? The kind where you wake up in the morning and realise you have slept all night long; the kind of sleep that gives you that "get up and go" feeling. The kind of sleep that makes you say, "It's great to be alive"!

Ok, as you stagger out of bed in the morning that last part sounds a bit deranged - let's move on.....

The other supposed effects of Ashwagandha is a reduction in stress levels, a surge in vitality, increased stamina and even a higher libido. I agree – that's all part of the package. However in my view these are secondary effects. If you sleep well, for sure you're going to feel better in the morning.

Traditionally, this herb is prescribed for anyone who feels stressed, run down and tired all the time. They might be trying to do too much or even doing too little – both tend to have the

same outcome. When tired it is easy to make poor decisions, stress over little things and lack enthusiasm. Ashwagandha can help.

Unfortunately, no amount of Ashwagandha seems to increase enthusiasm for washing the dishes or taking out the garbage.

You can buy Ashwagandha as a chopped up root and boil it for 10 minutes and drink the tea – the traditional way.

Or if you can't be bothered with all that rubbish, you can pay the usual ridiculous prices and buy it in a bottle from your local chemist. Use it for a week or two and then stop it for a week to see if you can notice the difference.

Best results come from intermittent use – do not take it all the time, just when you feel the need. Not suggested for use during pregnancy and may not mix well with anti-depressants.

Fun Fact:

This herb has an earthy smell. "Ashwagandha" in Sanskrit means "smell of the horse". One sniff will make you think you are in the stables holding the reins of the next winner of the Melbourne Cup.

Also it tastes a little bitter (okay a lot bitter). It may be "the flavour of the month", but don't expect vanilla flavour with caramel swirl and choc chips. Get real!



The program is free to attend and no diagnosis or NDIS plan is needed.


PlayConnect is held at: Noah's Sanctuary Point on Wednesdays 10am to 11.30am during school terms.

Wool Road Spinners & Weavers

WHAT CAN I SPIN?

There are many questions that a spinner can ask as there are so many different fibres to consider. The next question is to consider what fibre will give the result desired.

When considering wool these are some of the more common varieties: Merino, Corriedale and Polworth

- Merino wool is renowned for its ultra softness, fine fibres and its warmth. Within merino you can get Ultrafine, superfine, fine, medium and strong. However the finer varieties are often used for garments that sit close to the skin like base layers and sweaters due to its softness and its moisture wicking ability.
- Corriedale is from a sheep that is a cross from Merino and Lincoln sheep and has the characteristics of softness and durability with a medium-fine texture. This is a wool that is easier to spin, giving a sturdy but soft yarn.
- **Polworth** is another crossbreed of a Merino and Lincoln sheep noted for its balance between softness and durability. It is also good for felting.
- Then there are other fibres:
- Cashmere from the undercoat of cashmere goats and it is used in high-end garments like sweaters, scarves and shawls that offer warmth without bulk.
- Mohair produced from Angora goats and is known for its shine and strength however it can feel scratchy to sensitive skin
- Alpaca is soft durable and silky with superior thermal properties. It is an excellent choice for those sensitive to sheep wool.

- Camel is from the soft undercoat of the camel and it is known for its warmth, softness and natural tan colour.
- Angora is from Angora rabbits and famed for its softness, fluffiness and warmth. It is perfect for delicate, lightweight, and warm items like baby clothes, luxury scarves and fluffy sweaters
- Mulberry silk is produced by silkworms fed exclusively on mulberry leaves, this is the highest quality silk and known for its smoothness and lustre
- Tussah silk is made by wild silkworms and is slightly coarser than mulberry silk. It is stronger and more textured than mulberry silk
- Cotton is a soft, fluffy fibre that grows in a boll around the seeds of cotton plants.
 It is known for its versatility, durability and absorbency. It is lightweight and breathable, and it produces a cool, soft yarn that is ideal for warm weather wear.
- Linen is from the flax plant. Linen creates beautiful garments, table linens, bed linens. It is appreciated for its natural, elegant drape and crisp texture.

Then there are the more unusual fibres that can be spun: Bamboo, nettles, coir, pineapple fibre from the leaves, banana fibre from some of the stems. And yes, you can spin dog fur, cat fur and even human hair but with great difficulty and with regards to dog and cat fur very thorough cleaning is needed to get rid of oils and odours otherwise it could smell like a wet dog!!!

It Takes a Village: BCR Volunteer Driver Mentors are Changing Lives



After 40 years in education, including two decades as a school principal, Greg Woods thought he had seen it all but teaching his grandson to drive from scratch was a new kind of challenge. "When we started, he hadn't even turned on a car," Greg laughs. "But we took it step by step." Every gear change and road rule was patiently explained until his grandson earned his P-plates and now drives himself to university. "I was so proud when he got his licence."

Even when his grandson didn't pass the first time – going just 2km over the limit in a school zone – Greg turned it into a learning experience. "You just need to stay calm and try again," he says. "If you're relaxed, your learner will be too."

That experience inspired Greg to share his patience beyond his family. When he saw an ad for BCR Communities Ls to Ps Driver Mentoring Program, he knew he could make a difference for young people without someone to help them at home.

Now as a volunteer mentor, Greg helps young drivers like Julia (pictured) build confidence behind the wheel. He is also mentoring a young man who lives with his grandfather who doesn't drive or own a car – making Greg's support essential for reaching the necessary hours of supervised driving. "Where we live, a licence isn't just handy – it's essential. Public transport won't get you to a job or apprenticeship."

And while he's the one giving his time, Greg insists he is learning just as much in return. "Spending time with young people is the best. They see the world differently, and they teach you things you'd never expect – like how to fix your phone in five seconds flat!"

The Pied **Oystercatcher**



The Pied Oystercatcher is a striking black and white shorebird found along Australia's coastline. With its vivid orange-red bill and eyes, plus pink legs, it's easily recognisable and often seen probing sandy beaches, mudflats, and estuaries for molluscs and invertebrates Their long chisel like bill is perfectly adapted to pry open shells, especially bivalves like pipis. Once widespread and common population has declined especially along our heavily developed coastline. It is an endangered species in NSW, with a vulnerable population of an estimated 200 pairs found along the coast, including at Jervis Bay.

Pied Oystercatchers are monogamous and often return to the same nesting site year after year. They nest directly on the sand above the high tide line, laying well camouflaged eggs in shallow scrapes. Due to their exposed nesting habits, eggs and chicks are vulnerable to predation and human disturbance, particularly from beachgoers, unleashed dogs and vehicles. Their population faces numerous threats, from habitat destruction to climate change, making their breeding sites even more critical.

At Jervis Bay, the sandy beaches and sheltered shores provide potential nest sites for these birds. For the last couple of years two pairs have successfully bred at suburban beaches in our area. With ongoing conservation efforts such as signage, fencing and public education our local population will hopefully successfully breed again this spring and summer. 

BRIAN'S NOWRA

This month, the About Monthly Feature will continue looking at A DECADE IN TIME. Brian Forrester's book produced in the 2000s, written in his unique fashion, is About the characters who previously operated businesses in Nowra's C.B.D. As mentioned in the book's text by Brian, History's most interesting aspects are often the people that make it, just as much as any events or 'things' that are recalled.

Three 'things' that defined Nowra long term were that the original street grid for the town was laid out south of the Shoalhaven River, and then in the ensuing decades before the end of the 1800s, a major bridge crossing the river was constructed. In the decade after that, a railway line arrived. The fact that this line emanated at Central Station in Sydney, and terminated at Bomaderry, put the Bridge Road entrance to the town in to prominence. It fed road transport and passenger services in to the main shopping precinct of the town, and wider district that it served

Like many towns across NSW, in the mid 20th century, highways tended to go through the centre of them. In the 1937 historical society photo mentioned in last month's **About**.....*Feature, North Street coming off Bridge Road, before turning in to Kinghorne Street, then heading south through town, was the North/South highway alignment. East and Berry Streets appeared as second tier roads of importance on either side of the highway through Nowra.

On the final pages of A DECADE IN TIME, Brian Forrester made three maps of Central Nowra to illustrate where the characters of the town did their 'things' at certain times. The old highway alignment map was the third of these. The first map showed 25 locations in his 'Old Days' Nowra circa 1950. The second map had exactly two dozen features on it, which he labelled as 'New Days' Nowra circa 2008; the year he published his book. A DECADE IN TIME's beauty was not being burdened with piles of facts. Brian explained in his INTRODUCTION that "the changes to Nowra's C.B.D. can be

best appreciated by taking a walking tour". One might suggest armed with his book, to get the comparison between 'Old Days' and 'New Days' Nowra.

Brian suggested a walking tour could logically start in Junction Street at the 'Old' Post Office and head east. However, for the purpose of this About Monthly Feature, we'll go to the odd, unique, triangular northern entrance to the town grid which became known as 'Batt's Folly'. This means we'll begin wandering around BRIAN'S NOWRA of the 1940s and 50s from a point of interest that he included on all three of his maps. This rock garden featured in and advertised many town promotions when Bridge Road was the northern entrance into Central Nowra, Floral arrangements. Chamber of Commerce events. and banners for upcoming 'things' of interest happening in the town would often be centred on Batt's Folly, for passing internal town traffic and tourists alike. Named after William Batt, Shoalhaven Council's Shire Clerk from 1948 to 1966, this small monument still sits near the traffic lights at the corner of North and Berry Streets

Surrounding Batt's Folly at that intersection of BRIAN'S NOWRA circa 1950 was Francis' Garage, on the SE corner. Across the intersection at the end of Berry Street was Lawrence Motors, owned by Jimmy Lawrence, who would remain a prominent local businessman for many years. Dr Rodway practiced and lived on the NE corner as the highway curved in to North Street, while the Bridge Hotel (only closed as a licensed premises in the 2020s) was located on the other side of the end of Bridge Road, a couple of doors up from Jack Ison's hardware store and timber mill.

Moving up Berry Street to the corner of Junction Street beyond the SCHOOL OF ARTS (About* Monthly Feature July 2021), a building occupied by the English, Scottish & Australian Bank was right at that corner. With the Methodist Church and the Post Office on the respective SW and SE corners, the final NE



corner of that intersection was a second cinema in Central Nowra known as West's Theatre.

On the next intersection to the south, Brian included his father Ken Forrester's mixed business corner shop mentioned in last month's **About** article. On the corresponding NE corner of the next block, at the Plunkett Street/Berry Street intersection, a business known as the Old School Shop operated. For many years after 1950 that was the purpose that it served, with Brian finishing up at Nowra Intermediate High School as a 17 year old in the few years just after this map was depicted. His nickname for his Alma Mater was "the Nowra Isolated Horse Stables".

At the other side of this intersection was the Church Of England. Moving east of the school were residences for the school principal and the police. After the Court House was the Police Station (now used by the Historical Society as its museum headquarters), while diagonally opposite on that Plunkett and Kinghorne Streets highway intersection was The Central Garage. A few buildings along Kinghorne Street to the north was the Ambulance Station.

At the very northern end of Kinghorne Street where it intersects with North Street stood the Presbyterian Church and the Empire Hotel. Of interest here is that of all the 25 features Brian noted on this circa 1950 map, this is the only intersection of the eight most central intersections in this C.B.D. still providing the public with the same services today, three quarters of a century later.

BRIAN'S NOWRA brings to notice About the churches around town all having their own tennis courts. And, within the town grid there were numerous individual courts owned by families, where social occasions could revel in the glory of our international tennis success. These years of the early 1950s were the beginnings of Australia's Golden Era of Davis Cup victories. Scarlett's Court was up towards the top end of town in Douglas Street, while down on the other side of the highway in the same street was Moore's Court. Next street south was Lymbery's Court in Jervis Street, while beside where Brian was born in St Ann's Street was Goodsell's Court.

A decade after the 'Old Days' map, Brian Forrester married a young teacher in 1962. Joan Piper had

come to Nowra to work at the Infants Department of Nowra Public School. The Infants School was built on the western side of Berry Street and the church, in addition to the main Plunkett Street site, as the town expanded in the 1950s.

As a young married man Brian opened a fruit shop in Morison's Arcade, on the northern side of Junction Street. This side of his business would eventually be relocated to Graham Street, just off North Street. In the late 1970s and 80s Brian became best known **About**.....* town as the proprietor of the Darrell Lea Chocolates Shop in Morison's Arcade. That company and the town were expanding rapidly. As he proudly drove his 1928 Chevrolet truck around the C.B.D. that he had bought for \$10, and fully restored, his reputation was enhanced and cemented.

Brian Forrester and Nowra's business district were both diversifying. Alan Clark summed up the rest of his career this way before Brian retired in 2005. He wrote this for a Uniting Church magazine in the weeks after Brian died in May this year. "During 1988, he left the shop and took on a Model Shipyard mail-order business that he regarded as his greatest success, for it had 11,000 customers from around Australia and other parts of the world".

Brian had grown up with the names of business owners that were synonymous with Nowra's shopping centre. He then worked alongside those family names and businesses during his career. Names like Tom Davis' Shoe Shop; Albert Morison's Menswear; Lionel Seyferr's Watchmaker and Jewellery; a delicatessen shop run by Harold Last and the Gewohns; Patricia Clarke's 'Dainty Lingerie' shop; Pat Maguire's footwear and menswear; Schofield's Butchery; Alice Baxter's Hamburger Shop; Beryl's Handicrafts; Ashcroft's Newsagency; Comfort Shoe Store; Lamond's Shoe Repairs; Reg Legge's music and radios shop; Basha's haberdashery, menswear, furniture and floor coverings; Ted Hewlett's Milk Bar, the Baby Shop, owned first by Florance Elyard then Joan Yarrow; the Red Rose Café: and the New York Café.

On this list taken from BRIAN'S NOWRA that he recorded for posterity, would you believe that it doesn't exhaust the names of Junction Street's businesses, and their owners?

Delving Deeper into Records and Indexes

My research this month is taking me to the Isle Of Wight in Hampshire, England. These projects are more difficult than usual as

These projects are more difficult than usual as the family in question is not known to me, so it's definitely a case for building a tree out of not very much information.

In this case the client has provided some certificates which are more than welcome, but the background story is not present, so the brain gets a real workout.

When I was gathering Henry Master's family, there was a big gap between two groups of children, which raised the question "had he been married twice?"

The 1851 & 1861 census listed the family, with Henry's wife named Mary, but there was no entry in the 1841 census for Henry & Mary.

As the first group of children were born from 1838 to 1845, any first marriage was likely to have been before September 1837 when civil registration began. This meant it was not on the Freebmd indexes, and Parish registers were not conclusive or complete, so I could not guarantee the name of his first wife, with a few to choose from.

My next stop was to log in to the GRO website (General Register Office) UK. A search for the births of the earliest children gave me, in two cases, the mother's surname, so it was then easy to confirm the marriage, which took place in January 1837, and a check in the 1841 census for that village confirmed again. Ann died in 1847, and Henrys 2nd marriage, to Mary in 1848 was known to my client. Mary died in 1876 and Henry Remarried in 1877 to Hannah, but there were no children to find.

A contributing problem is the lack of information given on English certificates; UK Marriage & Death certificates only name the father and his occupation.

The GRO UK has recently introduced a digital image service for births & deaths, so for £3 you can download a historical image of the entry using your credit card.

I hope this has given you some clues on how to progress when you seem to be stuck, and this is the kind of advice you will get from any of our experienced volunteers in our research library — so come along and see what we have to offer

WHAT LIES BEYOND Allan Power - Vanuatu

Three issues ago of my articles, I detailed diving the wreck of the President Coolidge in the waters of Espiritu Santo in Vanuatu. The grounding and subsequent sinking of the once luxury ocean liner gave an Australian by the name of Allan Power, a new lease of life that he never dreamt of.

When the ex luxury liner sank after being commandeered as a troop carrier and fitted out for that purpose, a large contingent of divers from Australia was commissioned in 1969 to try and salvage what was salvageable – Allan was one of them.

Small in stature but huge on presence and knowledge of the wreck, put Allan at the forefront as the 'caretaker' and a recreational dive leader once the salvaging operation was completed. You could get no better leader who, with his knowledge, made you feel that you were diving in absolute safety in places that he had dived and made safe for pleasure diving for the countless that come to dive the wreck.

Allan stayed on in Vanuatu and is credited as being at the forefront of initiating tourism in Espiritu Santo. There was no space on this huge wreck that Allan had not dived on. From the first glimpse of the wreck at 60 feet to the stern at 240 feet below, Allan has been on every square inch of this underwater marvel.

He created his business – the Allan Power Dive Tours, to which divers from the world over flocked to, in order to dive with the 'human encyclopaedia'. Being relatively deep dives, Allan had everything sorted out. Hangtanks for extra air at the decompression stop should a diver have spent his own supply, to a small reef garden that Allan created to keep the divers occupied while waiting for the nitrogen build-up to dissipate, where anemone fish had made a home as well as the other species that felt so comfortable as to come up to your face to explore the diver. Unfortunately, Allan died in 2018 at the age of 85 – but I dare say, an age where by then, he had accumulated more knowledge than any other human alive - and maybe, even for a long time to come.
