BRIEF: Mrs. Sarah Bost reported that she was raped and also had \$15.00 stolen from her purse at her home. She stated that her attacker was a black male. After the offense her attacker left her house by way of the front door. Mrs. Bost ran out the back of her residence completely nude to the home of her neighbor, Mrs. Mac Fennell, located at 154 Union Street South. Mr. Fennell alerted police and Sgt. Jack Arnell responded to the call, and arrived on the scene at 9:57 P.M. CID was notified 10:04 P.M.

Mrs. Bost was rushed to Cabarrus Memorial Hospital by Cabarrus Ambulance Service. Upon arrival at the emergency room, she was examined by Dr. Monroe.

DESCRIPTION OF SUSPECT: B/M, Height - 5'5" to 5'9", slender build and slim hips. Subject was plain spoken, used correct english and at times spoke very softly. No speech defect, accent or noticeable brogue evident. Subject was wearing dark, waist length leather jacket, blue jeans, with a dark toboggan pulled low on his head, could possibly been wearing gloves.

METHOD OF ENTRY: Suspect climbed up the down-spout at the rear of Mrs. Bost's house, walked the roof to the front of the house where he made entry through an upstairs window.

Mrs. Fennell said that they took Mrs. Bost to the bathroom to attend to her and notified the police. She stated this occurred around 10:00 PM.

Statement given by Mrs. Sarah Bost at Cabarrus Hospital, 12:05 AM, Monday, April 26, 1976. Sgt. Lee, Sgt. Taylor, and Det. Ludwig were present.

Mrs. Bost stated that the only places she went Sunday was to church and later at about 1:30 PM she went to the post office. She stayed around the house the remainder of the day and about 7:00 PM she went to the kitchen and set a hamburger out to thaw and put some broccoli on the stove and turned it on low. Mrs. Bost said she had several phone calls to made, and after completing one she returned to the kitchen and got her hamburger, left the kitchen, went up the hall to the den and the suspect grabbed her from behind around the neck. She said she started screaming and struggling and the suspect said, "Shut your damn mouth" and he threw me down on the den floor, Mrs. Bost said, "What do you want?" and he said "Money". Mrs. Bost said "I have money in my pocketbook in the bedroom, you can have all the money I have."

At this point he jerked me up and pushed and shoved me to the bedroom and I got my pocketbook but there was no money in it, it was already gone. She said this made him very mad, and he shoved her out of the bedroom and up the hall to the foot of the stairs and he was constantly cursing and using foul, abusive language.

At the base of the stairs, Mrs. Bost asked her assailant "Where are you taking me?" He replied, "I am taking you upstairs."

Mrs. Bost told him if he would let her made a phone call, she would get him all the money she had. Mrs. Bost said she knew that if she went upstairs, her attacker would kill her for certain.

Mrs. Bost said at this point she increased her struggle and would not go upstairs. He tore all her clothes off and stuck a knife to her throat and said, "I'll kill you." At this time her attacker forced her to the floor and said, "You are going to suck me." Mrs. Bost begged him not to but he forced her to do it. She said he put his lips on her breast and vagina and then had intercourse with her. During the sex act every time she would turn her head, he would slam her head on the floor. Also during the sex act, he told Mrs. Bost he had 15 minutes to do it. The attacker told Mrs. Bost he had 3 buddies waiting outside.

Mrs. Bost said the phone rang and it seemed to scare him, he got up and pulled his pants up and got something off the floor and put it in his pocket. He then told Mrs. Bost, "Let me out and I will go get my buddies."

Mrs. Bost said she let him out the front door and he pushed her back from the door as he went out it. Mrs. Bost said she ran to the back door, unlocked it and ran across to the Fennells next door. Mrs. Fennell's daughter let Mrs. Bost in and Mr. Fennell called the police.

Suspect Long kept his gloves on most of the time that he was in the Police Dept. He was able to do things as normal as someone without gloves. He was able to take out of his billfold his drivers lic. Pictures was made of him in his gloves and jacket. Prints was also made. Doing the time that he was being printed he was talking about going to get a "shot of leg".

INTERVIEW: Mrs. Sarah Judson Bost  
 Date: May 5, 1976  
 Location: Her home on Union Street South  
 Conducted by Sgt. Taylor & Det. Isenhour

Mrs. Bost was told during the first part of interview it would be necessary for her to go to District Court on May 10, 1976, 9:30 A.M. to observe all persons in the court room. She stated she had no objections to going to court on that date. She was then told to observe all persons entering or leaving the court room or persons to be tried or persons who come as members of the audience. She was then told to watch carefully for and see if she could recognize the person who broke in on her and raped her. She was told that the person who committed this offense could or couldnot be in the court room and that she was not going to court for the specific reason of picking out a person that was in the court room. Mrs. Bost was then told that if she did see the person that committed the offense and there was no doubt in her mind for her to motion and let officers in the court room know. If while she is in the court room she doesnot see any person in the court room that was the person who committed the offense on April 25, 1976 that she was involved in that she should say so and not be concerned because there was that possibility that that person might not be there. [At no time during the interview that was conducted at this time was the name of the suspect given or any information supplied to Mrs. Bost concerning the suspect.] She was told that she should enter the court room, be observant watch all persons entering or leaving the court room and if she saw that person to motion with her finger or motion and let Lt. Vogler or Sgt. Taylor know that she had in fact seen the person that had raped her on April 25, 1976. Mrs. Bost asked the question "That if she set there in the court room and she didnot observe the suspect or observe anyone like him what should she do?". Officers then if she didnot see the person to be observant to watch all persons and tell officers that she didnot see the suspect. Mrs. Bost was at that time told to bring a neighbor or friend with her to set with her during the proceedings and to wear something that would disguise her so that if the suspect was there he wouldnot recognize her. Mrs. Bost was told that Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor would come on the morning of May 10, 1976 a little before 9:30 and take her to the court room. At this time Mrs. Bost was told that she was to go to the court room and if in fact she saw the person who committed the offense to let officer know but not to go there with the specific intention of picking out a person in the court room because it may very well be that the person who committed the offense would not be in court and that he could be in court or could not be in court for her to keep that in mind.

During this interview was told that she would be taken to District Court and observe Court Proceedings at this point she, Mrs. Bost and her neighbor, Mrs. Fennell were taken to Cabarrus County Court House to District Court Room. Upon arriving at the Court House, which was approximately 9:20 A.M. Mrs. Bost and Mrs. Fennell were told again to observe court proceedings and to look to see if she sees the person in the court room who committed the offense she was involved in. She was again told the person may or may not be in court and that she was not to go there thinking that she had to pick someone was told that if she did see him to make it known by motioning that she had observed the suspect. After arriving at the court room where the District Court was being held, Mrs. Bost accompanied by Mrs. Fennell went through the front entrance of court room and was told to sit on the left hand side of the court room near the front. Mrs. Bost and Mrs. Fennell did so and sat in the third and fourth sits from the left on the second row back. The suspect observed by Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor was sitting with his father was seated in the middle section of the court room about half way back of court room, five to six seats from the right. In making observations in court room Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor observed approximately 60 to 65 persons in the court room either in the audience or persons on trial. Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor in the court room and observed 12 adult black males in the general age group of the suspect. The suspect, Ronnie W. Long was wearing a medium brown leather coat, a liesure shirt flowered, no hat, dress pants. During the first part of the court proceedings several black males were called for first appearance cases and several cases were called prior to calling of the case of Ronnie W. Long. At that point, which was approximately 10:00 A.M. Ronnie W. Long's case was called and he exit the row of seat to the left hand side, walked around to the defense table where he was readily visible by Mrs. Bost and Mrs. Fennell. The evidence was presented on Mr. Long's case and Mrs. Bost at that time motioned for Sgt. Taylor and Lt. Vogler that she had observed the suspect or had observed the person who had raped her on April 25, 1976. Mr. Long's case was disposed of and after he left the court room Mrs. Bost exited through the rear entrance of the court room and talked to Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor and stated at that time that she had in fact observed the person that entered her house on April 25, 1976 and raped her at that point she stated that there was no doubt in her mind that this person Ronnie W. Long was the person who entered her house.

The purpose of this interview was to establish the facts surrounding Mrs. Sarah J. Bost Court Identification of one Ronnie Wallace Long, black male, during court proceedings on May 10, 1976. This interview conducted at the Concord Police Department with Mrs. Bost and with Mrs. Fennell the neighbor, who attend court proceedings with Mrs. Bost. Others present during the interview were Sgt. Taylor, Sgt. Lee. At first of the interview Mrs. Bost was shown a series of photographs seven (7) in number and Mrs. Bost picked out the photograph of one Ronnie Wallace Long as being the person who raped her. Mrs. Bost was then asked as to what made her positively identify one Ronnie Wallace Long as the person who committed the offense. This identification was made during court proceedings, District Court, where Ronnie Wallace Long was a person being tried. The positive identification made during court proceedings was made at approximately 10:08 A.M. The line up photographs identification was made at 10:30 A.M. Concord Police Department. The following is a series of questions and answers. Questions by Sgt. Taylor to Mrs. Bost and Mrs. Bost in reply to those questions:

Sgt. Taylor: "Is there any doubt in your mind Mrs. Bost that the person you have identified in the court room is that person who broke in your home on April 25, 1976 and raped you?"

Mrs. Bost: "No, there is not doubt in my mind, I would put my hand on the Bible and swear that the person I identified is the one. There is no doubt in my mind."

Sgt. Taylor: "What do you base your identification on?"

Mrs. Bost: "I observed several black males in the court room in the audience and being tried and when I saw him, meaning Ronnie W. Long, I knew it was the man. The identification was based on his general appearance, his profile. Quotation: I will never forget his profile, coloring of his skin, it was light colored not real dark. Another reason his mannerism and the way he walked. Quotation: I watch him walk out of my door and it was the same walk. I knew his voice. Quotation: One thing I will never forget the way he talked to me and the way it sounded his voice sounded relatively soft but not real loud. Another way I identified him was the way he carried himself and his general appearance left no doubt in my mind that he was the person who entered my house on April 25, 1976 and raped me. I did not restrict my observance of persons in the court room to any one I observed several persons in the court room. Several black males but I dismissed them from my mind immediately because of their general appearance and profile but whenever I saw Ronnie Long I knew then that he was the man."

Interview Mrs. Bost Continued

Sgt. Taylor: "Again I ask you Mrs. Bost is there any doubt whatsoever as to the person who you pick out during court proceedings as the one who raped you."

Mrs. Bost: "I can assure you that there is no doubt in my mind, I could swear to it."

If you decide to answer questions now without a lawyer present, you will still have the right to stop answering at any time. You also have the right to stop answering at any time until you talk to a lawyer.

The person being questioned must answer the following questions YES or NO.

1. Do you understand your rights? YES

2. Do you want a lawyer at this time? NO

INTERVIEW: May 10, 1976

Sgt. Lee, Sgt. Taylor and Detective Ludwig

Sgt. Lee, Sgt. Taylor and Detective Ludwig on May 10, 1976 went to the home of Ronnie W. Long, who lives at 284 Melrose Drive, S.W. Concord, N.C. and advised Ronnie W. Long we needed to talk with him a while. Ronnie Long stated that would be Okay with him and that he would drive to Police Department in his vehicle. He did so following the officer to the Police Department. At the Concord Police Department on May 10, 1976 at approximately 6:44 P.M. Ronnie Wallace Long, black male 20, was there advised of his constitutional rights, he was advised that he had the right to remain silent that he had a right to have a lawyer and the appropriate questions were asked to him. "Do you understand your rights?" and "Do you want a lawyer at this time?" The answer to the first question was Yes that he did understand his rights which he wrote yes on the rights waiver. The answer to the second question Do you want a lawyer at this time? No, he did write No on his rights waiver. He read the waiver of rights and sign his name at 6:44 P.M. that he did in fact understand his rights and did not want a lawyer present. This rights advising him of his constitutional rights was witness by Sgt. Taylor and Sgt. Lee. At that point Ronnie W. Long was advised that he was to be questioned concerning an offense which happened on April 25, 1976 he was advised that this offense was a burglary and a rape offense. He was then told that he was to be questioned concerning the offense and that he was a suspect in the offense. At that point during the interview Ronnie W. Long stated that he didnot have any knowledge of the incident that he had heard a little bit about it but was not involved in it. He stated that he had talked or Ruthean Howie had told him about the incident and that Ruthean Howie was a friend of his who lived on Spring Street. He stated that Ruthean Howie had told him that a woman had been raped and stabbed on Union Street and wanted to know if he had heard anything about it. He stated he had not told anyone about the incident that the only other person he had talked to about, it or was told anything about it was one Bernard Steele, who had told Ronnie that there was a woman that had been raped on Union Street and that Bernard Steele started to make jokes about it. Ronnie W. Long stated that his girl friend had talked to him about the incident and told him about it and that these three persons were the only contact he had had with the incident that happened on Union Street. Ronnie W. Long again stated that he did not know anything about the incident that he had only heard about it and was not involved in it. At this point he stated that he wanted to make a telephone call and he was allowed to do so by Sgt. Lee and Sgt. Taylor. He called his father and told him to come to the police department at this point Lt. Vogler contacted an interview and asked Ronnie W. Long for consent to search his vehicle. Ronnie W. Long stated that officers could search his vehicle and gave Lt. Vogler the keys to the trunk at that point Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor took the keys from Ronnie W. Long with intentions of searching his vehicle.

Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor went to the vehicle registered to Ronnie W. Long, LTD Ford and proceeded to search it under the front seat of the vehicle was found a toboggan, which was seized, over the right hand sunvisor of the vehicle was a pair of kid gloves, black in color which was siezed. Throughout the vehicle was several match books that were seized. This evidence which was taken from his car was labeled as such and to be used in the trial of Ronnie W. Long. The coat in which Ronnie W. Long was wearing when he came to police department was also sized, this was a black leather coat which will be used as evidence. At this point Ronnie W. Long was taken to magistrate's office before a magistrate, Ray Moore, and warrant were obtained for first degree burglary and first degree rape in the offense of April 25, 1976 at the home of Mrs. Sarah Judson Bost. He was placed in Cabarrus County Jail with no bond with a first appearance set for May 11, 1976.

On May 12, 1976 Detective Arthur, working second shift at Concord Police Department advised Lt. Vogler, Sgt. Lee and Sgt. Taylor that Ronnie W. Long had contacted him and that he had advised Ronnie W. Long of his constitutional rights at the Cabarrus County Jail at that point Ronnie W. Long told W. L. Arthur, Detective, Concord Police Department that he wanted to make a confession to officers but he wanted his father here, Mr. Long and his attorney, Gordon Belo, he wanted Lt. Vogler there to hear the confession at that point Detective Arthur contacted Lt. Vogler, Sgt. Taylor and Sgt. Lee, who came to the Concord Police Department and went to the Cabarrus County Jail. At that point Lt. Vogler asked Ronnie W. Long after advising him of his rights what his intention were for bringing officers to the jail he stated he wanted to tell all about the incident. But he stated that he wanted father here and his attorney at that point his father was called to the Cabarrus County Jail and his attorney, Gordon Belo. His father arrived first at the jail and talked with officers and a short time later his attorney, Gordon Belo arrived at the jail. Lt. Vogler advised Gordon Belo to talk with Ronnie W. Long and see what his intentions were. At that point his attorney did talk to the defendant, Ronnie W. Long, for a period of time his attorney exited from the room where he was interviewing or talking with Ronnie W. Long and stated to officers that Mr. Long wanted to tell officers who had committed the offense. At that point Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor asked his attorney, Mr. Belo, for permission to talk to Mr. Long. Lt. Vogler and Sgt. Taylor went to the room, which was occupied by defendant, to talk with him concerning the incident at that point Ronnie W. Long stated that he wanted to get it over with that all he had denied any knowledge of the offense of the night and denied taking a polygraph test because it was a money thing he was going to sue somebody was the reason he wanted to stay in jail 72 hours. He stated at this point that he knew who committed the offense and that he had stayed in jail long enough and wanted to tell officers who did in fact commit the offense. He stated that a good friend of his a running buddy named Carl Young had committed the offense. He stated that Carl Young had told him 2½ weeks prior to April 25, 1976, when the offense occurred, that Carl Young had told him that he was going to make a lick meaning that he was going to get some from a white woman on Union Street. He stated that this was the extent of the conversation between him and Carl Young and that he thought Carl Young was the person who broke in on the lady and raped her. He stated that the conversation he and Carl Young had taken place on Broad Street and that Carl Young had been into that Carl Young had told him he had been into the woman house 3 or 4 times prior to that and that he was going to go into the house and make a lick meaning to steal some money. He stated that Carl Young told him that it was a big white house on Union Street South, that he had been here before and it was occupied by one white female. He stated at this time that this was the extent of the conversation between himself and Carl Young.

Sharon stated that she and Ronnie Long were talking at her home at 176 Spring Street South and Ronnie was asking her if she had heard anything about the incident that happened up near her, near Sharon's house where a man broke in on a white lady and raped her. Ronnie stated to Sharon that Ruthean Howie had told him about the incident and that there was a conversation. Ronnie stated to Sharon that the lady involved in the incident, the victim was described as being an old white whore. Sharon stated that Ronnie did tell her about the incident but that she had not talked to Ruthean Howie about it as to whether Ruthean had told Ronnie about the offense. She stated that Ruthean Howie was a very close friend to her that she lived only a few houses down the street, that they grew up together and referred to each other as cousins. She stated this was the only conversation that had had with Ronnie Long concerning the offense and she had no other conversation with any other person concerning offense.

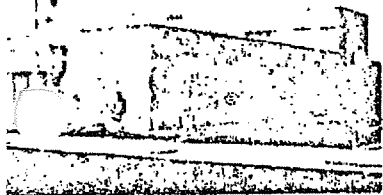

During the past year I received information from your department concerning an offense that had occurred there. Through telephone conversation with one of your officers in the sex squad I learned that your department wanted for questioning a resident of the City of Concord, N.C. and that person was one Ronnie Wallace Long a B.M. Over the period of several weeks I talked with one of your officers concerning the offense in an attempt to help locate the suspect. The officer that I talked with classified the case as an oral sodomy and he proceeded to tell this department part of what had taken place. The officer that I talked with I do not remember his name but I do remember that he was black. As best that I can remember the suspect in the case had dropped his billfold or lost his social security card while committing the offense. At the time that I talked with the officer I could not locate the suspect as he was not in this City. Later we found out that while you were looking for him and we were doing the same he was in Richmond, Va. I did not at that time find out if there were outstanding warrants on the suspect nor was any other information available on the case.

Concerning the above, here is my problem. Ronnie Wallace Long B-M returned to the City of Concord, N.C. sometime after the offense occurred there and that same type of offense occurred here. We had no knowledge that he was back in town. Our investigation led to the arrest of the suspect on charges of First Degree Burglary and First Degree Rape of an elderly woman in this City. I would like very much for the officer that I talked with on several occasions to contact me either through letter or telephonic communication. It is very imperative to our investigation that we establish a modus operandi of the defendant and your investigation into that same type of offense would aid greatly in doing that. We would like what ever information that is available and any reports on the offense that we might establish that he committed this same type of offense in our City.


