Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Jane Copeland reported a cash flow of \$1,365.53 for the past month bringing our current balance to \$11,931.74. The majority of this money will be used to pay expenses for our three-day February workshop with Liz Haywood-Sullivan.

Fund Raising Report

Fund Raising Chair Debbie Been gave a report on our two recent fundraisers. The Georgetown Market Days in June raised \$800. The October Chalk Walk in Round Rock raised \$650. There were donations of \$55 collected for a total of \$1505. Expenses of \$563.64 were incurred giving us a net profit of \$941.36. These profits will be used towards donations for art programs in local schools.

Exhibition Report

Exhibition Chair Alora Johns reported that the annual show and competition will be held at the Lost Pines Gallery in Bastrop, Texas during February and March, 2020. One painting will be accepted from each artist. Liz Haywood-Sullivan will be the show judge. The reception and awards ceremony will be held on March 6th at the Lost Pines Gallery. Member Joyce West is collecting awards for the winners. CTPS's show at St. David's Hospital in Georgetown will be February 28th thru April 24th.
