Oh, Blest the House Pastor Burgdorf

Oh, blest the house, whate'er befall, Where Jesus Christ is all in all! LSB 862. The Messiah has come! The weary world rejoices with hope and life anew. Jesus is come into the world! The Son of David, the new Solomon receives a visit from the wise men of the earth who come and bow down before his

majesty. Just like the powers from around the world came to inquire of Solomon, the Magi came and bowed down, bearing gifts. Christ, the king of Jews and the Gentiles is Lord of all. His divinity is soon confirmed days later as we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord.

The psalmist sings of this mystery: "What ails you, O sea, that you flee? O Jordan, that you turn back?" (Ps 114). Even the



Jordan trembles beneath his feet as the heavens are rent open and God the Father speaks, "This is my Son." Swiftly afterward Jesus is sent out into the desert by the Spirit to undergo temptation. The devil himself cannot overcome him, and before long demons will be trembling in his presence.

With this reality in mind, the Church has made the habit of blessing homes of the faithful. Christ has come and His presence is not a fearful and frightful thing but bestows upon us blessings upon blessings. It is indeed fitting then that the Church throughout time has attached the practice of house blessings to the season of Epiphany. In Epiphany, Christ is revealed as the Only Begotten One, the true Son of the Father, and the Light of the World. The Church gathers to invoke the Christ, who was born of a Virgin, who is worshiped and adored, and whose presence is a blessing that drives out demons and the forces of darkness, to be present with us in the homes of her members.

If you have never seen, or been a part of a house blessing you may be wondering what it entails. The full rite, found in the Agenda of the Lutheran Service Book, (feel free to stop by a Pastors' office and ask about it) consists of a Pastor coming and praying in the home; going room to room and blessing them. While this happens, those gathered, either the family alone or friends and family invited sing hymns appropriate for the season and pray.

Traditionally the door to the home is marked with chalk. 2025 signifies the year, while CMB signifies the Latin phrase Christus Mansionem Benedicat, "May Christ bless the house." The CMB also corresponds with the initials of the names traditionally given to the wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The + in between is the sign of the cross.

A New Year with Prayer Pastor Weinkauf Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.

Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints. Eph. 6 Pray without ceasing. 1 Thess.5

I grew up amid the catch phrases about prayer that today make me uneasy. *Prayer changes things. Don't underestimate the power of prayer. Time spent in prayer is never wasted. Prayer connects us to God. Don't pray for that for which you are not also willing to work. God does nothing except respond to the prayer of the believer. 7 days without prayer makes one weak, etc.* What seemed at first to encourage earnest prayer I now believe distorts prayer. Note these phrases all originate among those who do not have Sacraments, so they elevate prayer (and worship style) to be a "Sacrament", their "means of grace."

Since many Christians see the Scriptures themselves as a book of stories, facts designed for motivation -instead of the living voice of God through which the Spirit does His bidding, their prayer (and experiences of life and worship) is how they connect to God. Without the "means of grace" that Christ has given us! Thus they have come to understand prayer as the manipulation of the Divine will and purpose as if God dispenses grace and His works sparingly or God won't do something unless we ask.

The purpose of prayer is not to command God to do our bidding but for us to do God's bidding. Prayer may not change things at all; the act prayer is an act of faith, confidence in the good and gracious will of God which is not our recourse after all other options have been pursued but our first and constant refuge. We do NOT pray to get God to do our bidding but for us to do His bidding. It is good for us not simply to pray our needs but to pray what God has promised (at least remember this in our time of doubt, fear, or terror and that these promises may comfort us as we open our hearts to the Lord).

We often operate as if God were stingy, only reluctantly give us what He Himself has promised. So we depend upon our works of praying to negotiate from God for grace and things He may be holding out on us. How sad it is that prayer in this way becomes a false comfort to us or no comfort at all!

How great are the gifts of God that He has well supplied us with the Gospel and the Sacraments to comfort us in our need, assure us of His gracious favor, and sustain us in the hour of trial. For these our prayers arise from a baptized child given faith, to trust in His good and gracious will and our voices ascend with the wants and desires of our hearts.

<u>Refresh yourself in the Small and Large Catechism on the Lord's</u> <u>Prayer.</u> It is not a long read but worth every word. Blessed 2025!



All men over 18 of the congregation and friends are invited as we usually play cards. Usually have prizes. Sometimes other activities are done. Plenty of food and beverages show up.




