Lent Should Matter to Us All

Lent will be upon us before we end February. We are in a pre-Lent time for you to ponder, contemplate now if things are going to be different for you this Lent? Will you be intentionally living like its Lent?

Lent is a time when Christians all over the world prepare for Jesus Christ's resurrection. It starts Ash Wednesday, 47 days before Easter. You may recognize the term "40 days of Lent". This is because the Sundays are not considered a part of Lent.

Historically, there are three practices associated with Lent: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving or works of mercy. It is a time when Christians especially reflect upon their lives, live with different intentions to help focus our lives on Christ. God's people have always been shown to 'fast' before the 'feasting' in this special time in preparation.

Lent can be a time of great focus for the Christian. Our culture is inundated with input. But in order to focus more on one thing, one must also learn to focus less on other things. Lent can become a time of beautiful simplicity, cut out much noise of life, put aside/turn off devices, more time devoted to hearing again the words of the Bible, and coming to God in repentant joy for what He has done for us.

Prayer. Fasting. Almsgiving. These Scriptural, ancient traditions in the Church aid us in mournful reflection; who live in a society that does not take sin seriously, and in proper reflection, preparation towards our Lord's Passion and joyous feasting of Easter.

Prayer Jesus says in Matthew 6, "When you pray..."



Conversation with God. Offering petitions of praise, thanks, requests, help. **What is looks like? Make devotions a priority in your home**. Develop better habits and times for prayer and family devotions. Put reminders on your phone or calendar if you forget. Devote more time to reading Scriptures. Pray the Scriptures especially by reading the Psalms. Devote time to shut off all the tech and media and sit with a Bible and receive words of life.

Fasting Jesus says in Matthew 6, "When you fast..."



Not "if" but "when." A restriction of consumption. Not to merit favor with God but for our physical, spiritual conditioning. That our desires of the stomach, the desires of the flesh do not drive us. So when you think of what you 'gave up" and want it, turn your focus Christ and Scriptures, learn self-control, discipline.

What is looks like? Some refrain from chocolate, desserts, alcohol, eating during daylight hours (a normal fast), reducing or eliminating luxuries; cut out fast food, certain foods or meals or niceties. Consider fasting from smartphone/screens during parts of the day.

Almsgiving Jesus says in Matthew 6, "When you give..."



Actions of our resources of time, money, work. All you have comes from His hand, stop thinking your money and things are 'yours' but you are stewards of His gifts your use in your household and to serve others.

What it looks like? Selfless acts. Make a special gift. Actively look to do special things for family and neighbors. It can mean special gifts to Church made in joy and sacrificing your comforts. Give that it does effect how you live as you reflect on material fasting, that money cannot be where your heart, your security, and comfort lies. Donate goods. Volunteer. Create habits in your day to impact others. Ask if you can help them. You will find it common that those who tithe (give 10%) or establish a pattern of giving -that when giving away money impacts, changes how they livethey find special blessings in life priorities and release of anxiety over money, to help keep their focus on Christ.

Altar Triptych of Risen Savior Dedicated Epiphany 2023

Holy Thursday — Good Friday — Easter

Triptych forms of artwork have appeared in early Christian art, especially used at Altars since the middle ages. Triptychs are three pieces of related artwork in a sequence to narrate a story. Our wood carvings were also done by Joel Johnson, a local woodcarver who has done the other wood carvings on the Pulpit and Lectern. Funds were used from the Sacred Art Fund which includes special gifts and memorials.




