Discerning God's Will. Pastor Weinkauf

At time of this publication, the man who a Divine Call has been issued to serve here as our Associate Pastor is prayerfully discerning God's will; and we as a congregation and Call Committee has been in prayer over this matter. <u>A decision will be announced</u> <u>Sunday August 1.</u> It is good at this time to consider how the Holy Spirit leads us, how God reveals His will for us to follow. What is His will?

There are many false teachings out there on this, brought on namely by the American Evangelicals and Pentecostal types or just plain Christian imagination. That God will speak through: elements of nature; things of your life circumstances; dreams; random signs; coincidences -that you can detect that appear during the day. He will "lay things on my heart" or "feel Him speak to my soul" so I then am sure His will. He will come to me in measurable ways of what I experience, what I do, brought on by how fervently I pray!; it's up to me to 'discover' His will -then!, I know God's exact will that I have discovered on my specific choices/decisions. Even know answers to WWJD? ...WRONG!!! Jesus Christ taught us to pray, "Thy will be done." We certainly want God's will to be

done. We are confident God will carry out His will. The struggles for many arise when we think about specific matters. Key life decisions like, "should I choose this career?; should I take this job?; should I marry this person?; should I move to this place?"

As Lutherans, we realize that God only reveals His will in one place – in His Word. If we want to know God's will with absolute certainty, then we look to Scripture. God's will for you and your family is to be in the Divine Service every Sunday; God's will you teach the Scriptures to your family. God's will is that He desires all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. God's will is that everyone believe in Him and have eternal life, that everyone live repentance lives each day, that we keep His word, live godly lives according to His commandments; God's will you outdo one another in showing honor; put others needs before your own; and on and on...absolute certainty.

Yet we have specific questions without a Scripture directive. God's will on these matters has not been revealed and we do not have His promise that we can know it. It is dangerous to speculate on the mind of God or claim His will on unknown things.

Instead, we are free in the Gospel to make the best decision we can. We are free to use the gifts God has given us in gathering information to make decisions. He has given you your reason, His will that you make decisions that best serve your neighbor (foremost family); decisions that would help you live a godly life. He gives authorities in your life (parents, grandparents, pastor, teachers, boss) to seek counsel of wisdom in what may be best for you (and your family). Make a list 'pros' and 'cons' in the matter as you think it through. Consider your conscience, to have godly contentment, how circumstances of your life may change and how that would best help you serves your Lord and others.

Our decision process foremost involves prayer and Scripture. Ask for God's guidance, wisdom, direction in deciding, not 'my will' but 'Thy will' be done. MAKE A DECISION! then pray like: "Lord, I pray this decision is God-pleasing and best, forgive me if I have errored and bless me as your child." Even your wrong decision, God will use in your life as His repentant child, to teach you, to grow and bless you! You do not have perfect wisdom to know. What joy then in desiring to make godly decisions, knowing that you will error a lot, and every decision you make is made by a sinner and God is there to forgive and bless you. What we do know is the love God has revealed in Christ, and this guarantees that God is working for our good. Pray, Thy will be done and commend yourself, your acts unto Him.
