Church, the Sacrament and Love. Pastor Weinkauf

Martin Luther wrote: "Whoever is in despair, distressed by a sin-stricken conscience or terrified by death or carrying some other burden upon his heart, if he would be rid of them all, let him go joyfully to the Sacrament of the Altar and lay down his woe in the midst of the community of saints and seek help from the entire company of the spiritual body.

Then we may with joy find strength and comfort, and say, "Though I am a sinner and have fallen, though this or that misfortune has befallen me, nevertheless I will go to the Sacrament to receive a sign from God that I have on my side Christ's righteousness, life, and sufferings, with all holy angels and the blessed in heaven and all devout men on earth. If I die, I am not alone in death; if I suffer, they suffer with me. I know that all my misfortune is shared with Christ and the saints, because I have a sure sign of their love toward me.

Here your heart must go out in love and learn that this is a Sacrament of love. As love and support are given you, you in turn must render love and support to Christ in his needy ones. You must feel with sorrow all the dishonor done to Christ in his holy Word, all the misery of Christendom, all the unjust suffering of the innocent, with which the world is everywhere filled to overflowing.

You must fight, work, pray, and — if you cannot do more — have heartfelt sympathy. See, this is what it means to bear in your turn the misfortune and adversity of Christ and his saints. Here the saying of Paul is fulfilled, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" [Gal. 6:2]. (Luther's Works, vol. 35).

How true according to the Scriptures. When people do not gather at the Church, it is hurtful to them, body and soul. And how difficult to serve their spouse, family, friends, fellow workers unless they have already been fed and nurtured by our Lord? Nothing in this world can fill the void that only Christ can fill by His Word and Sacraments. In our Lord's Church, you find the love and support to carry on in this broken world, and in return you provide that care to others by showing Christ's love to them.


Parking lot is right next to the sidewalk where we stand. This is part of the "40 Days of Life" campaign which has been shown to change the hearts of people planning an abortion.

- 3 members are elected to serve on the Board
- Tombstones may be placed in advance.
- A Statue of Jesus will soon be placed on a granite pedestal
- Map of Cemetery plots right inside Church Office



- Any LCMS member may purchase plots, which we have sold some to people outside our congregation who desire a Lutheran Cemetery.
- Plots are currently \$500, which our guidelines state 75% must be put in a perpetual care fund (placed in long-term investment fund) with restricted use.
- A section around the 'soon-to-be-placed' Jesus Statue will be an area dedicated to miscarriages, stillborn, & children.
