Eternal Joy in Christ Pastor Cockran

"God just wants me to be happy." Many of you have probably heard this saying before. The Declaration of Independence speaks of an inalienable right to the "pursuit of happiness." Yet while we can understand the line in the Declaration of Independence rightly, the Scriptures do not speak as much about happiness as an end goal as much as it speaks about always having joy.

When we think of happiness, what comes to mind is emotional pleasure that lasts only for a time and then is gone. For instance, you could find happiness by sinking your teeth into a delectable barbeque sandwich, or you could find happiness when something bad happens to someone you really do not like. Obviously, eating a barbeque sandwich is not sin. Wishing harm on someone else, however, is unrighteous, even if it brought you happiness.

We also tend to think happiness rests in our own power. If listening to a particular kind of music makes us happy for a few weeks and then no longer does, we think we can keep seeking other means which evoke the same emotional high. But like a dog chasing his tail, we eventually discover that we can never obtain true lasting happiness.

But Jesus gives us something more than happiness and pleasure. He gives us joy—true contentment that lasts.

Joy doesn't come from the vain pleasures of the world, but rather from something outside of you and outside of this world: the forgiveness and life of the Crucified and Risen Christ for you. Joy comes in the knowledge that you are in the Father's hands. Because of Jesus' atoning death, no sorrow or fear or trouble can separate you from His grace. Because He has risen and lives, so too shall you arise and live, and in this Gospel we find joy!

Does this mean that you can never be sad or that you must always be cheerful? Not at all! True Christian joy remembers that Christ has accomplished salvation even in the midst of sadness. Christianity allows us to hold these two truths at the same time: (1) I am saddened about a current situation in the world (2) On account of Christ, I remember Christ has overcome the world, and this gives me joy even while being sad. Is it okay then to appreciate happiness when we are given the Lord's gifts in this world? Absolutely! But be careful not to seek after happiness for its own sake, but instead always pray for contentment in the Gospel. After all, happiness is for a moment, but joy in Christ and in His Church is for eternity!

Pillars of Lent

Pastor Weinkauf

Prayer. Fasting. Almsgiving. Key points during this penitence, sorrowful reflection season beginning Ash Wednesday. These Scriptural, ancient traditions in the Church aid us who live in a society that does not take sin seriously, and in proper reflection, preparation towards our Lord's Passion and joyous Easter.



Prayer Jesus says in Matthew 6,

"When you pray..." Conversation with God. Offering petitions of praise, thanks, requests, help.

What is looks like? Make devotions a priority in your home. Develop better habits and times for prayer and family devotions. Put reminders on your phone or calendar if you forget. Devote more time to reading Scriptures. Pray the Scriptures especially by reading the Psalms. Devote time to shut off all the tech and media and sit with a Bible and receive words of life.



Fasting Jesus says in Matthew 6,

"When you fast..." Not "if" but "when." A restriction of consumption. Not to merit favor with God but for our physical, spiritual conditioning. That our desires of the stomach, the desires of the flesh do not drive us. So when you think of what you 'gave up" and want it, turn your focus Christ and Scriptures, learn self-control, discipline.

What is looks like? Some refrain from chocolate, desserts, alcohol, eating during daylight hours (a normal fast), reducing or eliminating luxuries; cut out fast food, certain foods or meals or niceties. Consider fasting from your smartphone during portions of the day.



"When you give..." Actions of our resources of time, money, work. All you have comes from His hand, stop thinking your money and things are 'yours' but you are stewards of His gifts your use in your household and to serve others.

What it looks like? Selfless. Actively look to do special things for family and neighbors. It can mean special gifts to Church made in joy and sacrificing your comforts. Give (even year-round giving) that it does effect how you live as you reflect on material fasting, that money cannot be where your heart, your security, and comfort lies. Donate goods. Volunteer. Create habits in your day to impact others. Ask if you can help them. You will find it common that those who tithe (give 10%) or establish a pattern of giving - that when giving away money impacts, changes how they live-find special blessings in life priorities and release of anxiety over money, to help keep their focus on Christ, His Kingdom.



Souper Bowl 2022


Souper Bowl Party brought about 80 people to fight for the highly coveted, traveling trophy.

Sadly this practice is going away in many churches and places or it takes place with the deceased family providing a funeral luncheon and given \$1000+ bill from a catering company, even paying for a place to hold it.



- 1) Pastor contacts Funeral Luncheon Coordinator with When/How Many to except.
- 2) Funeral Luncheon Coordinator then:
 - takes care of the main dish, gets help if needed for that.
 - sends out a **GROUP TEXT** for how many side dishes, salads, and desserts AND get at least 2 volunteers to arrive early to set-up the Hall, Kitchen.

If you respond and can help, thank you! If you cannot help, don't respond, no problem! Often items are brought the day before and set in the frig. or on the kitchen counter.
