EPISTLE Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under
the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be
held accountable to God.

For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since
through the law comes knowledge of sin. But now the righteousness of God
has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets
bear witness to it-- the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for
all who believe.

For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of
God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in
Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be
received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine
forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness
at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who
has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what
kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that
one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

Welcome to the Lord's House. The Son of God Has Set Us Free from Sin and Death by His Grace. Jesus, the incarnate Son, has suffered the violence of the Law and voluntarily handed Himself over to violent men, that we might eat and drink with Him in His Kingdom and "remain in the house forever" (John 8:35) and rescued by His grace from the slavery of sin and death. By the proclamation of His eternal Gospel "to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people" (Rev. 14:6), "the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law," "that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" (Rom. 3:21,26). By hearing the Gospel, "whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith" (Rom. 3:25), "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:32). **The Lord bless this Divine Service.**



We celebrate the Lord's Supper today, in the confession, as Jesus says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread, wine but His very real, true body, blood to eat, drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him, and with one another. According to Scripture, Holy Communion is also a public confession of faith, sharing a unity in doctrinal belief; also those who eat, drink our Lord's body, blood unworthily or without discernment do so to their harm.
