Three Little Word Pastor Weinkauf

Three little words. You know them. Wives long to hear them from their husbands, and husbands from their wives. Children want to hear them, as do parents, as do friends. These three little words can make all the difference in the world. And yet how hard they often are to say. How often they have to be just about dragged out of our mouths. Three little words. You know them. No, not I love you! But I forgive you.

If someone sins against me and hurts me, I forgive them. I feel pretty good about myself, that God give me a pat on the back. Then if that person sins against me again and again, and again and again, and I forgive them. I'm looking for a medal, a medal of honor from God for outstanding forgiveness in the face of continual sin. Shouldn't there be a little extra from God for that?

And yet Jesus says (Luke 17): So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty.' Just our duty. Really? Nothing? That's it? How can you possibly please a God like that?

To know that no matter how loving or forgiving we may be, no matter how much good we may do, we still have fallen short of doing ALL that we were commanded. And so know that we are unworthy servants. We don't deserve a pat on the back or a medal - you love, you forgive, you do good? Right. That's just what you were supposed to do.

And then! There's all that we've failed to do, and in our failure, caused our neighbor to sin or trash us for our failures. We then speak demeaning or hurtful words. When we're the ones who rather than a pat on the back or medal hung around our necks deserve a millstone instead.

Think in the Divine Service confession, "We justly deserve temporal and eternal punishment of Your millstone hung around our necks and to be cast into the depths of the sea." Be honest.

But then, we say, though that is what I deserve, give me what I don't deserve! Not a pat on the back or a medal -HAVE MERCY ON ME, and just speak to me those three little words. What does Jesus require of us in Matthew 18, which forgives of those who repeat sins against us, just seven times, no! We need to learn compassion for those who are weak and keep sinning against us. Compassion for them! Show pity. The cross shows me that, and the one who hung there for me, with my millstone around His neck, with all my sin, all my pride, all my failure. So, please, for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, say those three little words.

And He does. As often as you come, He does. As sinful as you are, He does. Yes, I forgive all your sins. And so when you forgive, when you speak those three little words, you're not earning anything - you are simply giving what you have received. You are clinging to Jesus by faith, and you are giving Jesus to others. Think about that- you are giving Christ's works for others. Gifts that never run out.

Those three little words that we so need to hear, that make all the difference in the world. I forgive you. Which really is His way of saying those other three little words: I love you.

Blessed Eastertide. The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!


