What are the Scriptures? Pastor Weinkauf

One of the most obvious yet an often overlooked issue of the Bible: Scripture is not primarily words but a voice speaking. God's Word is a living voice, that speaks. It preaches. It's meant to be heard, that you need to be in a place to hear it.

We think of printed words on a page and an individual reading those words, interpreting them for themself, and applying those words personally, individually. While Scripture is very personal, for the individual, that is not the context, foremost purpose of Scripture from the beginning.

Scripture is primarily a worship, catechetical book that is found in the community of believers gathered. People assembled to hear the Word, just as in Luke 4 when Jesus got the scroll, opened to the text appointed for the day, and preached.

Then, Scripture is ecclesiological: the Church's book, addressed to the Church, received by the Church, taken up by the Church as her voice to the world. The entire New Testament canon- those 27 books are received as writings used in the Divine Service.

In contrast, many come to think of the Bible as an individual's book, to make of it what they will; therefore its purpose and meaning is defined, given to it, by the individual reader. It is no wonder that people are all over the page when it comes to what the Word of God says. Sadly, private interpretation, "what it means to me" has not only become the norm but the ideal to many Christians. Sadly, other denominations shape the Word to fit their beliefs. Who else dares to claim: "Scripture Interprets Scripture" and "Scripture Alone"? We may come together to share our individual insights but we must think of God's Word as being addressed to the Church, words to His bride, then with an individual impact on each life.

Then, Scripture is liturgical -not simply by its use within the Old and New Testament communities but because it is an efficacious, sacramental Word that does what it says. Liturgy, God speaks to us and we speak His Words in confession back to Him. Scripture is not simply to inform but to bring sinners into the presence of a gracious God that forgiven sinners might worship the Lord in spirit and in truth, John 4 -a clear reference to the means of grace! Scripture, a living Word that speaks life; the Holy Spirit is breath and power that prepares hearers, to hear in faith and thus enter into the Body of Christ as that Body is gathered around His Word and Sacraments.

Liturgically we address this. The lectionary volume in our parish has an ornate cover. A visual way that this is not simply a book nor is Scripture like other books but the very Word of God. When we carry this book, we honor it because it belongs first to Christ and exists to accomplish His purpose and His voice even though the mouth of the reader. So the reader finishes the text by saying: "The Word of the Lord!" People respond, "Thanks be to God!" When the Gospel is read in the midst of the assembly, in our processions, it gives even more profound notice that this is God's Word, it speaks Christs and Him crucified, that this Christ is our Light and our Life.

Follow Your Dreams? Pastor Cockran

Beginning with the classics, "When You Wish Upon a Star" from Pinocchio and "A Dream is a Wish Your Heart Makes" from Cinderella, Disney has made its mark on the American ethos with the idea that anything can and should be accomplished if one only dreams and dedicates to it.

But is this true? Is this godly? Throughout Scripture, we are told to work on what God is setting before us according to our vocations. You are not banned from having a dream, but the Bible also never tells you your life is meaningless if you do not achieve a grand personal dream. St. Paul writes, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10).

Notice how Paul doesn't say "you were called to do achieve one giant goal"? God has prepared many different works for you. These won't save you, but they will support your neighbor and give glory to God. And everything you do, you do with all your heart (Col. 3:23). Likewise, Isaiah says, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts" (Is 55:8-9).

The only man with one goal that would not be thwarted for any reason was Christ entering His cross and resurrection. He was single mindedly focused on your salvation. Jesus became flesh so you would enter the gates of heaven. His great achievement of dying and rising again for your salvation grants you every last bit of personal fulfillment: everlasting life. This Christian life both now and to come is greater than all your dreams.

Proverbs 19:21 says, "Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand."

You do not exist to achieve your one goal. Instead, God will set before you many small goals which serve others. Finally, you live not under your personal accomplishments in this life, but under the accomplishment of Christ, who freely gives you what He has won for you. His achievement matters the most! The purpose of the Lord will stand.



The Mobile App is like the website link. On the App, the first time you have to search for the church and select us (and not a different Risen Savior). It will keep us (RSLC) in the App so you don't have to search it every time. You can do a 1-time payment without setting up an account (name, email, debit/credit card info). If you want a reoccurring payment you have to set up an account which they made pretty easy to do.

The company is called Vanco. It is safe, secure as they serve over 22,000 churches and 18,000 other clients and process over \$14 billion a year in payments. The transactions also integrate with our church accounting software for reporting offerings.


