Lent Is Here! Pr. Weinkauf

The Church Father, St. Augustine, whom heavily influences Martin Luther, in the late 300s will write "the whole earth observes Lent." Before that 325 AD, 1700 years ago, the Church bishops gathered for the Council of Nicaea. Some of those men present bore the scars, dismemberment of the persecutions under the emperors Maximin and Licinius. Among the admonitions made was the Church remains 'standing' instead of 'kneeling' during the 50 Great Days of Easter, as a sign of the resurrection -which we have always done at Risen Savior. But they also ordered a 40 day time of fasting and penance that now is called Lent. But this was nothing new. Before 325 AD, penitential seasons of Lent were being observe less uniform in various places, often for 40 days. We presume because Moses, Elijah, and foremost Jesus fasted 40 days. How fitting we observe Lent as our fathers and mothers in the faith have done since the Early Church.

As we begin our Lent journey together, have you ever thought about the 'joy' in sacrifice that Lent provides? Most of us don't delight in sacrifice; in our daily lives, we often do our best to avoid difficult challenges and practices that push us outside of our comfort zones or inconvenience us -even if it benefits us. There is a beautiful irony between joy and sacrifice, and we are presented with a wonderful opportunity to embrace this uniquely during Lent.

While giving up sweets for Lent is a common and noble endeavor, the goal of Lent should not only be a spiritual excuse to lose weight. In choosing acts of self-denial, we are saying "no" to things for the purpose of self-discipline, training, especially when it would come to things self-serving. We are not driven by our physical needs and impulses, and when they arise, due to our physical longing, we turn to an activity that may focus on Christ. When hungry or craving something you gave up -pray, read the Bible, learn a hymn, pick up a new habit.

Some my abstain from sugar, sweets, or certain foods, some may fast by skipping meals, or not eating during daylight, some may pass on luxury items and stop spoiling yourself, some may save money by not eating out during Lent and make a special offering, some may start a new Bible or book reading plan, or start a new podcast or exercise program, cut down on screen time, etc.

As we look during Lent to things you "give-up" or take-up" therein lies the joy! Yes, you need a heighten awareness and sorrow over you sin -all the while you approach things you are doing for Lent with a measure of joy in Christ.

We all need to hon our lifestyles with a greater focus, using it for enrichment, work upon ourselves that looks to Christ. In Matthew 6, Jesus instructs us "when you fast... give ... pray" -that forms our Lent activity. We grow closer to God by denying our will. we say "yes" to a life of abundance with Him. Better habits with prayer, hymns, Scripture only enrich our life! Do something extra special for others and special giving will bring joy.

So while Lent may seem demanding and perhaps uncomfortable, its purpose is to draw us closer to Christ, to discipline ourselves. During this important season, we are given an opportunity for self-examination in order to better discover both our identity as children of God and the beautiful joy with the Lord that can flow. Take pure joy in His works! Blessed Lent to all of you!

St. Patrick Not Just For Ireland Pr. Burgdorf

This month, on March 17th the Church remembers God's servant St. Patrick. This Saint does not get the same level of recognition that Saint Valentine does but his commemoration is still celebrated by many outside of the church. What do we know of Saint Patrick? Patrick was a Christian hero of incredible bravery, a man of faith and bravery. Born near the end of the fourth century in Britain, Patrick lived at the end of the Roman Empire. He was captured by Irish raiders as a child and remained there as a slave. Through the trials of his childhood, Patrick could have easily been distraught or given up but instead, he turned to the Lord for help, praying and meditating on the word of God.

He escaped after six years and returned to England where he became a priest and decided to return to Ireland and become a missionary to those very people who had enslaved him. His preaching was effective and through his efforts, Ireland was converted to a Christian nation. Patrick stands for us as an example of loving one's enemies, he shows us true Christ-like love for those who would harm and attack us. Let us give thanks to God for the work and life of His servant Patrick this March.

Patrick continues to teach us in the church through his hymns. The text of Hymn 604, "I Bind unto Myself Today,", is attributed to St. Patrick. This beautiful prayer, traditionally called "St. Patrick's Breast-Plate," is supposed to have been composed by Patrick in anticipation of his victory over paganism.

- "I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three.
- I bind this day to me forever, by pow'r of faith, Christ's incarnation, His Baptism in the Jordan River, His cross of death for my salvation, His bursting from the spiced tomb, His riding up the heav'nly way, His coming at the day of doom, I bind unto myself today.
- I bind unto myself today the pow'r of God to hold and lead, His eye to watch, His might to stay, His ear to hearken to my need, the wisdom of my God to teach, His hand to guide, His shield to ward, the Word of God to give me speech, His heav'nly host to be my guard.
- Against the demon snares of sin, the vice that gives temptation force, the natural lusts that war within, the hostile foes that mar my course; Or few or many, far or nigh, in ev'ry place and in all hours, against their fierce hostility, I bind to me those holy pow'rs.
- I bind unto myself the name, the strong name of the Trinity by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three, of whom all nature has creation, Eternal Father, Spirit, Word. Praise to the Lord of my salvation; Salvation is of Christ the Lord!"

Faithful God, You never cease to give to Your Church those who delight to carry the Gospel to foreign lands. Receive our thanks this day for Your servant, Patrick, who carried the saving name of Jesus to Ireland and summoned its people to abandon idolatry and worship You, the only true God, the blessed Trinity. Strengthen today all missionaries, that they may fearlessly bear Your name and summon all sinners into the joy of forgiveness and the promise of resurrection through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.




