



New Church Year. Advent. Renew. Recommit. **Reinvigorate your life in Worship and Devotions** ...and the Advent Wreath Pastor Weinkauf

A New Church Year, Dec. 1. Advent Season in the Church Year comes as early as the 400s AD, with the Church setting aside time before the Feast of Christmas for preparation and fasting, similar to Lent for Easter, but Advent is not as solemn. Blue paraments indicate a sorrow for sin while a color of a King. In Scripture the Lord establishes a liturgical calendar with major events, with a time of fasting, repentance before the feast, celebrations. Jesus continues in this liturgical calendar of worship and practice and calls on us "when you fast" (Matt. 6).

The Advent wreath comes to us from a German Lutheran pastor in early 1800s as a tool of preparation during this penitential season. It caught on and within 100 years most every Lutheran and Roman Catholic home in Germany utilize one. It spreads to America and now all types of Christians use the Advent wreath. Candles point to Jesus, the Light of the world. The evergreen wreath reminds that our Savior God grants new and everlasting life in Jesus. The wreath was also a symbol of victory, for a garland wreath was often placed on victors in contests or conquests. So naturally, a Christian can think of the crown of life that Jesus has won for us. The wreath also of the circle showing God and His eternal work. The four candles in an Advent wreath emphasize this period of penitence and preparation. Each week another candle lit daily during devotion of liturgy, Scripture, song, and prayer.

We all need Advent. We need Advent devotions. Whether you are consistent in daily devotions or lacking, Advent brings upon a season to re-new, re-invigorate, re-start a devotional life! We need, we desperately need sacred meditations, preparations in our life unto Christ. It is a time now to gather each day/night, with wreath lit, having family devotions. Even if its just you, do it. I beg you to take the time -make the time! Be enriched by our Lord, grow together as a family together in His Word. And come to the Sacrament! Blessings on your Advent preparation, as we once again celebrate our coming King.

Concerning Adiaphora

Pastor Burgdorf (That which is neither commanded nor Forbidden by Scripture) Our culture teaches that all ways are equal. Every opinion is equally valid. Every man's truth is equally true. Every path leads equally to God, whomever he or she may be. For the most part, we have resisted this false and dangerous idea, insofar as Christian doctrine is concerned. But it seems that we have fallen prey to a sort of liturgical pluralism and lost our ability to speak with clarity concerning adiaphora. This is not simply a matter of opinion: my style of music versus your style of music. There are objective standards that ought to be used to judge adiaphora. Lutheran chorales are objectively superior to Methodist hymns. The five settings of the Divine Service in LSB are not equal—not musically, not poetically, and not by strength of confession. The visual statement made by a pastor wearing robes is better than that of one wearing skinny jeans. Yes, these are matters of adiaphora. But that should be the beginning, not the end, of a discussion that follows, accompanied by a rigorous examination of the practice in

question. The Lutheran Confessions teach us how to think properly about such matters. Far from being a free-for-all all, adiaphora were "introduced into the Church with good intention, for the sake of good order and proper custom, or otherwise to maintain Christian discipline" (SD X:1). They are "profitable for good order, Christian discipline, or evangelical practice in the Church" (SD X:7). That a custom is an adiaphoron is not license for each pastor to tinker with it according to his fancy. Our confessions state: "Nothing in customary rites should be changed without a reasonable cause. So to nurture unity, old customs that can be kept without sin or great inconvenience should be kept... even though they may be burdensome. We have judged that such public unity, which could indeed be produced without offending consciences, should be preferred" (Ap XV:51–52). And where a change is deemed necessary, it should be done "thoughtfully and without giving offense, in an orderly and appropriate way, whenever it is considered most profitable, most beneficial, and best for good order, Christian discipline, and the Church's edification" (SD X:9).

In summary, our confessions teach that customs and traditions neither commanded nor forbidden by Scripture are to be retained for the sake of good order, Christian discipline, and evangelical practice. They should not be changed unless they are shown to cause sin, and only then with great thought and in an orderly manner. Let no one say we are free to do as we wish. In matters of adiaphora, we are bound to carefully consider the traditions we have inherited against the words of Scripture. And where Scripture is silent, we are bound to consider good order and unity within the Church.
